Additional Notes to Consider

- Foster youth who are off track for high school graduation and transfer after the 2nd year of high school may be eligible to graduate by completing the minimum state requirements. Students who graduate under the ruling of AB 167/216 do not have to complete additional school district requirements, which can range from 80-120 credits,
- Homeless youth who transfer after the 2nd year of high school are unable to complete district requirements within 4 years must be informed within 30 days of enrollment.
- Newcomer/Migrant/Military extends these types of provisions to students who are newly arrived, military, or migrant if they transfer after the 2nd year of high schools.

Options

Option A - students will graduate and accept the exemption. Students who use this exemption are not eligible to apply to a California State University or University of California school.

- Option B - Attempt to graduate high school by completed all of the distance requirements. They may complete courses at community colleges if acceptable.
- Option C - Remain in high school for a 5th year and complete all district graduation requirements.
