#### April 15, 2019 School Board Report

- 1. April 1st Regular Meeting:
  - a. Equity and Family Engagement Updates.
    - i. The Race and Equity policy was adopted in 2017.
    - ii. The Race and Equity Tool.
      - 1. The purpose of this tool is to engage everyone involved in Shoreline Schools to learn, think and address how race and equity impacts choices in instruction, programming, staffing, funding, and policy.
    - iii. Professional Development.
    - iv. The Equity Lead Program.
      - 1. P-12.
      - 2. At each school.
      - 3. Facilitate the equity team.
        - a. Composed of 15 staff members from the school.

- v. HR and Equity Dept. began a partnership last year with the focus of attracting, hiring and retaining diverse work staff.
    - 1. Students are asking for and needing teachers that reflect who they are.
  - vi. 3rd Annual S.E.E.D. (Seeing Everyone Equally and Distinctively) Conference.
    - 1. 10 presenters of various social justice topics.
    - 2. 200 high schoolers and middle schoolers attended.
  - vii. 4th Annual LGBTQ potluck.
  - b. DIMC First Reading.
    - i. Leveled Literacy Intervention Kit K-5.
    - ii. K-3 Ambitious Science Teaching Units for STEM Fellows.
  - c. Annual Asset Preservation Program Report to the Board.
    - i. In 2017, the Board adopted Resolution 2017-3, establishing the District’s participation in the State’s Asset Preservation Program (APP).
      - 1. Required to be eligible for future state construction funding.
    - ii. Shorewood and Shorecrest are currently the only two schools required to participate in the APP.
      - 1. Shorecrest High School:
        - a. cracks have appeared in certain bleacher seats due to people jumping and walking on them.
      - 2. Shorewood High School:
        - a. Ventilation deficiency: South classrooms on all wings are consistently hot.
        - b. Roofing deficiency: minor leaking.
        - c. Heating system deficiency: one boiler has an “issue”, is currently disabled.
2. April 1st Study Session:
- a. Review of Kellogg Middle School Constructability Report.
    - i. Cluster style bathrooms, with an “anyone” bathroom paired with a gendered bathroom.
      - 1. Current design omits urinals from men’s restrooms in anticipation that gendered restrooms will be converted to “anyone” restrooms in the foreseeable future.
      - 2. Due to concerns of hygiene, efficiency, and janitorial workload, the reimplementation of urinals will be considered. (and privacy)
