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

Our 2021-2022 Success

- Last year, 187 students earned the Seal of Civic Readiness in our graduating senior class.
- This was and is NOT a requirement for graduation, rather it shows how knowledgeable and involved our Ballston Spa students are.
- We are trying to create a pathway for <u>every</u> student to try and earn the Seal and it could become a pathway to graduation for some students.

How did Ballston Spa achieve this success?

We had the infrastructure ALREADY in place



Existing Infrastructure

- Our Government classes were already in a participatory model where students:
 - Attend public meetings

 - Develop an understanding of their local communities
 Synthesize their experiences into a High School Civics Project
- Large number of Advanced Classes offered at Ballston Spa (Advanced Placement, College in the High School, and International Baccalaureate)
- Expansive selection of electives rooted in civics
- Genuine buy in and enthusiasm from the dedicated team of administrators, guidance counselors, and teachers

Our Local Seal Committee

- The Ballston Spa Seal of Civic Readiness Committee includes:

 - A Building Level Administrator
 The Social Studies Instructional Teacher Leaders
 - Two Social Studies Teachers

 - A locally elected Community Member
 In our case, a member of the Ballston Spa School Board
 - NOTE: The inclusion of a elected community member is a model which Ballston Spa likes to highlight to other districts.

Advising ALL Students

- During junior year, students will receive a presentation during their US History class with follow through during junior conferences for planning senior schedules to help students plan a path to help them earn the Seal if they so choose.
- Senior teachers help students complete the application and provide them with all necessary paperwork in addition to completing certain projects senior year as part of class.

What was our MOST Common Pathway?

For Civic Knowledge:

All students need a four year Social Studies sequence, which

All students fleed a four year coolar ctudies sequence, which gets them one point.
To graduate you need to pass both Regents exams, this earns a student at least 2 points.
Some students will earn additional points for advanced classes.
All 12th grade classes complete some type of research project which gets a student an additional point.

THEREFORE MOST STUDENTS GET AT **LEAST** FOUR POINTS IN CIVIC KNOWLEDGE

For Civic Participation:

 Most students completed a version of the "My Community and I" project as part of a 12th Grade Government class earning 1.5 points.

Next, we needed to find MOST students a $\frac{1}{2}$ point to earn the Seal.

- Some can earn it through a Service Learning Project
- Some will earn it by completing a Social Studies elective or Business and Personal Law (#1 Pathway)
- Some will earn it through Extra Curricular Participation (some through school, others in the community—such as volunteer fire fighting, 4-H, Scouts USA, etc.)
- Others will earn it through Work Based Learning

Highlighted Work

2a. **High School Civics Project**: Students can earn up to 1.5 points for completing a civics project in a Social Studies class.

The "My Community and I" project has been included in MOST 12th Grade Social Studies classes to help students earn these points.




First Year Civic Seal Implementation


Approximately 95% of our June graduates earned the Seal of Civic Readiness!

How did our students earn the points?

Criteria for the Seal of Civic Readiness

In order to obtain the Seal of Civic Readiness, a student must complete all the requirements for a New York State local or Regents diploma and earn a total of six points with at least two points in Civic Knowledge and at least two points in Civic Participation. Students may also earn points by completing a middle school Capstone project or a high school Capstone project.

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Logistics- Tracking


- Many of the Seal components can be tracked on a high school transcript
- We linked the "Civic Capstone" projects in our SIS to senior social studies classes as class assessments
- Students, Parents and School Counselors can easily view if the Capstone project was passed
- School Counselors were able to calculate the 6
 points (passing 4 years of social studies, at least 1
 Regents exam, and the Capstone project) directly
 from the transcript
- State Tracking: List given to data administrator to add to student status profile for state reporting

- Students are better prepared and motivated for long term political engagement

















The Risk of our School's Parking Stickers




