Purpose, Methodology, and Context

Purpose

A great strategic design empowers schools to make winning choices that are dynamic, clear, and firmly rooted in their school's values.

 - ➤ Filtered by group
 - Compared student to adult data

- Economic disruptions, resulting in financial hardship, and an uncertain financial future
- Social and political tensions in response to events highlighting disparate viewpoints on political issues
- Leadership transitions/Restructuring
- A sense of loss, grief, and frustration with the way things are versus the way things once were


Our analysis includes specific consideration of the impact of these conditions on respondent perceptions and experience as captured in the survey.


OVERALL satisfaction

Disaggregated Adults: OVERALL satisfaction





Primary Student Themes

• Engaging (47.2%)

 Walk-throughs, science class, dissections, class discussions, personalized, writing class, teaching methods are fun, teacher made it fun and engaging, she made songs and jingles about it, the way she taught it really helped me, state project, collaboration, science discovery day, taught me new things, diversity of activities, history class, conversations with the teacher, projects, camp pali, fun and exciting, acting stuff out

8th grade student: "It was powerful when we went on a field trip to a mission. I felt that it was very engaging to see everything in person and having handson activities."

8th grade student: "I enjoy when teachers make classes interesting and about more than just learning. [He] taught us real life lessons and not just academic things."

Primary Adult Themes

• Learning (35.0%)

 Writing (talking to teacher and seeing product), parent/teacher conference, teacher going above and beyond, writing workshop, teacher understanding the student, connection with teacher, advanced classes and intervention, individualized, teacher collaboration time, student collaborating with each other using academic language, younger grades learning from older grades, vocabulary, medical science, reading and writing workshop

Teacher: "Students were respectfully collaborating on a task together, using academic language in their exchanges, and engaged in the task."

Parent: "Parent teacher meeting are always magical to me cause students get to reflect what kind of students they are , who they are , how they learn and receive feedback for teacher and parents . Also band and choir performances make my heart explode with Joy ."

Primary Adult Themes

- Experiences (29.3%)
 - Science day, ocean week, performances, volunteering in classroom, conferences, middle school science, elementary science lab, student council raises for need outside of school, dj's presentation, theatre, walk throughs, mission, wax museum,field trip, friday on the field

Parent: "I believe the most powerful learning/growing opportunities occur when students of different learning styles come together for a common goal. The communication station lunch club has been a powerful and inspirational resource in fostering inclusion, and providing a space for true understanding of how we are all alike and different. It has been one of my favorite memories these past several school years."

Parent: "I remember when the second graders did a poetry unit and presented their work to parents. The poetry itself was a great educational experience but so was the act of presenting it- the fact that this starts at such a young age before they are self-conscious was wonderful to see"

Primary Adult Themes

• Feeling (16.6%); Individualized (14.7%); Collaboration (14.0%)

- Feeling: Engaged, valued, respected, flourish, thrive, love learning, excited, challenged, passion, confidence, focus, growth, empowered, motivated
- Individualized: Catered, growth, one on one, small group, connection, advanced, individualized, high achieving, special coaching time, intervention, what kind of learner, challenged, adapted for my child
- Collaboration: Voices were heard, reflection together, articulate thoughts while respecting and processing opinions, small group, services provided by team, discuss

Parent: "The teachers have really taken the time to understand and learn about my children's strengths and weaknesses inside and outside of the classroom."

Teacher: "I really enjoy learning from my colleagues and professional development. I love the feeling of learning something new that will better my teaching and then being able to go back to my classroom and really try it out."

Parent: "Every time I think I'm going to have to fight to get a service for my son, his team ... already have a plan and take action. I also love the community of parents and the education foundation events that help foster the connections between parents. The fact that there was a 1st grade back to school party was amazing."

Primary Student Themes

• Classroom (43.5%)

 More electives, advanced classes, teachers, field trips, projects, more activities, interesting topics/classes, practical electives, hands-on, fun, outdoor learning/time, rocketry, robotics,field trips, challenged with sports, classes, and electives; projects, advanced programs for science and reading, more activities, outdoor, fun activities, intriguing lessons, engineering, hands on, more language, more elective options, science discovery day, more books, hands on science experiments, 2-4 person learning groups

6th Grade Student: "I think our school should include more projects to show our thinking. I'm okay with taking notes and reading to learn information but, I wish we could also display our thinking in a variety of ways. This helps me remember things better and learn more."

6th Grade Student: "... I also think that the teachers should also instead of just teaching us and giving us information, learn our strengths and weaknesses so they could improve our reading, or writing, or anything else that would need that one on one experience to fully understand."

Primary Student Themes

• Administration/Rules (27.9%)

 Discipline, less rules, dress code, supervision at recess/break, tardies, balls on the playground, recess activities, cleanliness/trash, food choices, supervisor to go to if feel kid is left out, more freedom as to playtime, new and more recess play equipment, cleaner, more rule enforcement, more activities at recess, study option for breaks, impactful discipline—assemblies don't work, consequences for actions, kids should pick up trash, more art on campus

7th Grade Student: "I think the school should just continue what they're doing and make sure to take action on the kids who disrespect other kids. I also think maybe we should be less strict on dress code. I agree with rules but maybe they can be lessened."

5th Grade Student: "Honestly I love this school but I really think you should add more stuff to play at recess."

Primary Student Themes

• Social (27.3%)

 Uplifting teachers, buddies/buddy system, inclusion, diversity, helping kids, being kind to others, emotional connections, give support to students who need it, more social freedom, buddy system, more mental health, keep watch on kids who don't have friends, teach kids to be good humans, discipline and education about actual world and social issues, more inclusive, more connections, future to be kind and organized, help with anxiety, fun grade level activities, more middle school activities and opportunities to contribute to ideas, emotionally connecting events, chances to get make friends outside of main circle, stop bullying club, school spirit

7th Grade Student: "The school needs more emotionally connecting events. The middle school and elementary are often separated, even before Covid. Most of the time, only siblings and their friends know people in other grades. What's most important for the future is building social skills..."

7th Grade Student: "I think it is important that schools will continue to be a welcoming and friendly place. I would love if some of the courses we take would help us learn some more things for later in life."

Primary Adult Themes

• Instruction/Curriculum (31.7%)

 High standards and expectations, excellent teachers, creative learning, social skills, safety, STEM for girls, student focus when one falls behind, reading specialist, coding/engineering, topics outside standard core, field trips, fun experiences, advanced/honors, fundamentals and stretch minds, agility, adaptability and innovation, enrich the academics, support teachers, environment of fun and innovation, spark creativity and learning, celebrate different learning styles, collaborative thinkers, respect authority, heard, nurture whole children, meet each student where they are, individualizations, communicating differentiation that is occurring, growth mindset

Parent: "I believe that striking a happy medium between academic growth and social/emotional growth is incredibly important. Coming out of the uncertainty of the pandemic years, I think having a safe place to learn and grow could not by more important."

Parent: "The district needs to focus on preparing our students academically for the ever evolving future, focused on agility, adaptability, and innovation."

Primary Adult Themes

- Leadership (25.3%)
 - Support, responsibility of good citizenship, leadership, training, mentorship, student leadership expectations, integrity, empathy, thoughtfulness, trust between board and staff, respect, model respect, stop minority influence, empower, connection, clear direction, accountability, communication, vision, follow up, consistency, responsive

Staff: "...The teachers, staff, and community need to align expectations and work to create an environment that fosters the growth of children."

Teacher: "Stronger connection between staff, community and admin."

Parent: "Growth in leadership, integrity, empathy, thoughtfulness... R. Roger Rowe would be best served right now by striving to get better at the qualities that can not be measured on standard school tests. Humor, creativity, integrity, compassion, generosity, kindness, determination, courage... etc."

Primary Adult Themes

• Climate (24.7%)

 Culture, respect, relationships, community, morale, trust, supportive, valued, empathy, inspired and happy, acknowledgment, curiosity, respect of staff from parents, community, sense of ownership, listen and involve, school bonding, partnership, communication, united, appreciation

Parent: "Appreciation and respect of the school staff. Keep up the good work."

Teacher: "... I think that the children are happy, smart, curious, supported, cared for, and feel safe. I truly believe that it is a really great place for a child to grow and develop."

Teacher: "There is a disconnect between the key stakeholders of our school. Communication, transparency, voice, respect and support need to be at the forefront before we are able to jointly focus on a new vision for RSF. Excellence again will come from all the stakeholders coming together."

Primary Adult Themes

- Social (21.5%)
 - Social-emotional learning, inclusion, connection, good morals, social skills, inclusive, supporting, lunch clubs, SEL programs, character development, curious, supported, cared for, safe, inclusiveness, personal responsibility, parents interacting, buddy system, parent small group discussions, arts, bullying, social separation of groups, supervision, social hierarchy, global awareness, social justice, 3 R's in practice, kind people, respect, responsibility, resiliency, positive student culture, circles for SEL, compassionate students, anti bullying, accountability



Teacher: "We should prepare our students to be global citizens, collaborative thinkers, and kind people."
