


ENGLISH-SHAKESPEARE FILM FESTIVAL

With 5JRB, we combined computing & ICT with art and the pupils used the Sphero robots to create some excellent artwork by controlling the robots through different coloured paints.























LOWER SIXTH AND ECO DAY

Toby showed no nerves and remained calm throughout the five stands, even when the wind doubled in speed and started drifting the clays on stands four and five. Shooting first from the pair, Theo opened with a simply stunning 9-10-9 over the first three stands, before finding it significantly harder in the stronger winds on stands four and five, returning scores of six and seven respectively to end with a score of 41/50. The weather was beautiful despite the variable wind and the whole event was seamlessly run with minimum waiting on each stand. Everyone had a great day!

Overall, the boys won the gold medal for a team of four or fewer and Theo took an individual silver medal for his excellent score of 41 clays shot, placing second out of all the U13s.






TADPOLES
