


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H-E-B Shows Support for Willis ISD

NEW YATES STADIUM POLICIES

YATES STADIUM RULES

These rules are for the safety and comfort of all guests. Your compliance is required.

- Clear bags only; subject to search
- Metal detectors in use
- No Yeti-type cups, water bottles or food allowed inside the stadium
- WISD is an alcohol and tobacco-free environment (Penal Code §48.01)
- No vaping or smoking on school property
- Elementary students must be accompanied by an adult to enter
- Spectators are required to sit in stands except when visiting concessions or restrooms
- Re-entry to the stadium is not allowed
- Law enforcement officers and administrators on duty reserve the right to refuse entry to any individual






