Students or parents can report bullying, depression, illegal substances and other sensitive topics through private messages to our administration. The mobile app and Web-based reporting system provides secure 1-way or 2-way encrypted messages. All reports remain completely anonymous, although submitters have the option to reveal their identity if they prefer to have a person-to-person discussion.
