With the opening of a new Fortville Elementary School scheduled for the fall of 2025, as well as a new transportation center and significant traffic improvements currently underway, our main campus is getting a lot of work. Our Future Growth Plan was finalized in March of 2020 providing direction for us to reinstate a grades five and six intermediate school to accommodate growth in our

#### Superintendent continued

The last 12 months have been significant to Mt. Vernon. While we will begin collecting revenues in July from our positive operating referendum, we know that it will allow us to operate and add an additional school in the future. Some legislative actions designed to control increased property taxes from reassessment do make our budgets tighter as we continue to lose revenue in tax caps. With the changes in caps of various tax matters, we will still see a significant drop in our overall school tax rate should our assessed valuation continue to increase in future years. Even with our belt tightening, we have been able to make up for the multiple years where Mt. Vernon teachers and staff did not receive a pay raise. We are to a point now where many of our certified and classified staff are receiving a much more competitive salary and while an early prediction, our turnover rate this year appears to be much better than in recent years.

On another note, this summer is a week longer than the last few summer breaks, and our staff is looking forward to time to relax and recharge for the 2023-2024 school year. Our team of Mt. Vernon employees work extremely hard to serve our community and our students. We are grateful for our amazing people who serve our students!

## Early Release Wednesdays & After School

On Early Release Wednesdays, the school day is shortened by 45 minutes for staff to have collaboration and professional development time.

- The first and last Wednesday of the school year ( August 9 and May 22) will be a regular release (no Early Release Wednesday).
- 2-Hour Delays that occur on a Wednesday would have a regular release (no Early Release Wednesday).
- Buses will run their regular routes 45 minutes earlier on Early Release Wednesdays.
- Mini-Marauder Preschool does not participate in Early Release Wednesdays.
- After-school care through the YMCA will be offered at all elementary schools.
- We will host after-school study tables for middle and high school students participating in athletics or other regular after-school activities. No other students will be allowed to stay in the school buildings.

# **School Supplies**

Preschool, elementary, and middle school school supply lists are linked on each school's website under the "Parents" tab on the "Parent Resources" web page. High school supplies vary per class/teacher and will be shared with students on the first day of school.



# **District/School Communication**

Parents/guardians will receive communication through ParentSquare using the emails and phone numbers listed in Family 1 of Skyward Family Access. Parents/guardians are highly encouraged to use the ParentSquare app using their email listed in Family 1 of Skyward and personalize their notification settings.

## **Student Registration & Class Schedules**

**Class schedules/homeroom assignments** will be available in Skyward prior to each school's Back-to-School or Open House night.

Returning Students Registration: MV parents/guardians in Family 1 of Skyward need to register ALL returning students through their Skyward Family Access account starting July 10 at 10:00 am. It is important registration be completed PRIOR to the first day of school. (This includes 23-24 Kindergarten students who were enrolled at the Mini-Marauder Preschool at the end of the 22-23 school year, as well as RETURNING Out-of-District/Transfer students who received an approval letter in June.)

**New Students:** All students NEW to the district will need to complete the New Student Online Enrollment Application, including the new Out-of-District/Transfer students who are new to our district and have received an approval letter in June.

Parents/guardians might want to familiarize themselves with e-Funds (https://www.mvcsc.k12.in.us/eFunds, MVCSC's online payment system, and consider opening an account. Cash or checks are also accepted. Please communicate with your child if they are to eat breakfast and/or lunch. Any child who enters the food line will be charged for their meal.

**Meal Assistance:** In 2023-2024, MVCSC will continue to process applications for free and reduced-price meal benefits. This application can be found after July 17 at 7:00 am through your Skyward Family Access by opening the Food Service tab and clicking on Applications. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch assistance may also qualify for textbook rental fee assistance; watch for textbook rental assistance option in the online application.

**Students need to bring their student ID** to the cafeteria for all meals and should wear them throughout the day. This is for security purposes as well as helps with the speed of the lunch line and gives students more time to eat.

## **School Fees**

**E-Funds (MVCSC'S Online Payment System):** Parents/ guardians may deposit funds into their child's lunch account. Please review the meal costs and maintain a positive account balance for your child(ren).

#### **CHROMEBOOKS:**

In the 2023-24 school year, **students in grades 5-8 will receive new Chromebooks** as part of our device refresh plan. No optional protection plan will be offered. Instead, a new MV protection plan will cover up to two accidental damages per year. Charges will apply for the third damage or in cases of loss or theft (without a police report). **Please note that intentional damage or gross negligence is not covered.** 

Students in grades K-4 and 9-12 will keep their district-assigned Chromebook for the 2023-2024 school year. However, there will not be an optional protection plan offered. In case of accidental damage, students will receive a replacement device of the same age without incurring a charge. A flat fee of \$25 will be charged for a replacement device upon the second damage or in cases of loss, theft (without a police report) or intentional damage. Please note that intentional damage or gross negligence is not covered.

# **School Bus Transportation**

**Bus stop pick-up times:** Bus routes, bus numbers, driver's name, and approximate pick-up times will be posted on the transportation webpage a few days prior to the start of school. On the first day of school, students should be waiting at their bus stop 30 minutes early. www.mvcsc.k12.in.us/transportation.

**Bus GPS App:** The BusRight App allows the parent/guardian to see where their child's bus is in real-time. Information on how to register will be sent at the beginning of the school year.



Out-of-District/Transfer Students' Transportation: Reminder that the child may only ride the bus they are assigned at the pickup and drop-off location identified by the school corporation. Reminder that if the child is riding the bus, a parent/guardian agrees to supervise the child before/
• after school at their assigned bus stop.

## **Up-To-Date Immunizations**

Indiana law requires each child enrolled
in school to be completely immunized
against communicable diseases. Required
vaccinations for the 2023-2024
school year can be found on the
MVCSC Health Services website page at
