

ISAEP Program

Program requirements:

Enrollment in ISAEP is voluntary. Students may not be placed in the program without the written agreement of the parent or guardian and the student on the student's educational plan.

Eligibility requirements:

- Be at least 16 years old and one academic year behind his/her 9th grade cohort or overage and not yet reached the ninth grade.
- Have met with high school counselor to go over graduation requirements and possibility of graduating in a traditional school setting with a standard/advanced studies diploma or certification of completion.
- Currently enrolled in school and at risk of dropping out.
- Initial meeting with parent, student and counselor to go over program and its requirements.

Program entrance requirements:

- Pass entrance exam with 7.5 or higher reading grade level (Woodcock Johnson) or pass 8th grade Reading SOL (The Woodcock Johnson should be administered at the student's home school)
- Stay in regular school until the student passes EACH of the subtests on the Official GED Ready Practice Test with a 125 or higher score. (To be administered by home school personnel).
- Meet with ISAEP counselor and home school counselor to work on the Career/Technical component as well as the economic impact of failing to complete a high school standard diploma.

After entrance exam: (if passed)

- Help develop an individual educational plan for them.
- Attend ISAEP program at OCMS Tuesday through Thursday from 8:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. regularly.
- Maintain good attendance and behavior while in the program.
- Spend a minimum of 15 hours per week on academic content.
- Spend a minimum of 10 hours per week on work-based or career transition education.
- Enroll in and complete the Economics and Personal Finance course. Enroll in CTE certification program.**
- Remain in regular school program if initial assessment is not passed by the student; **you will be allowed to re-test after 90 days of self-remediation.**

Before sitting for GED exam:

- Score a 150 or higher on each of the GED practice tests
- Successfully complete Economics and Personal Finance course.**
- Have a minimum of 15 hours per week of academic content for each week in program.
- Have a minimum of 10 hours per week on work-based or career transition education for each week in program.
- Complete vocational folder with school counselor.

I understand the above information and know the requirements for entrance and enrollment into the ISAEP Program. Additionally I realize that I will be dropped from the ISAEP program if I do not comply with the requirements listed above.
