History of Tobacco Prevention in California

The Tobacco Education and Research Oversight Committee (TEROC) is a legislatively mandated advisory committee charged with overseeing the use of Proposition 99 and Proposition 56 tobacco tax.

TEROC oversees the Tobacco-Use Prevention Education (TUPE) funds allocated to the California Department of Education (CDE) for school-based tobacco-use prevention education programs, the California *Health and Safety Code* Section 104430 requires at least two-thirds of the local assistance funds be allocated to local educational agencies (LEAs) for tobacco-use prevention, intervention, and cessation programs in schools as competitive grants.

FBSMV has 4 Prevention Specialist serving the Santa Barbara County, assignments are by region:

- 1 FTE at South County (Goleta, Santa Barbara *includes Los Prietos Boys Camp)
- 1 FTE at Mid County (Santa Ynez, Buellton, Los Olivos, Lompoc)
- 2 FTE at North County (Orcutt, Guadalupe, Santa Maria *includes SM Juvenile Hall & Fitzgerald community school)

All prevention specialists work directly with school administration to provide services.





INDEPTH

 Program is an alternative to suspension or citation program that is offered as an option to students who face suspension for violation of school tobacco or e-cigarette use policies.



How it works

- ♦ For High School Students grades 9-12
- **4** (4)- 40 Minute Sessions
- Small Group Setting (6-10) or 1 on 1
- Referral Based
- Students will receive certificate upon completion
- 355 Students Served



Not on Tobacco (NOT)

 Is an evidence-based program with an impressive success rate, with approximately 90% of teens who participate in the program cutting back or quitting tobacco all together.

How it works

- For High School Students grades 9-12
- (10)- 40 Minute Sessions
- Small Group Setting (6-10) or 1 on 1
- Voluntary Program
- 8 Students Served

Cannabis Prevention Education

- Research based program for youths ages 12-17 in Santa Barbara County
- Curriculum used: Project TND (Towards No Drug)

How it works

- We help the youth fulfill requirements for the Health & Safety Code Section 11357
- Youth must be in possession of cannabis in order to be referred to the program by law enforcement, resource officers or school administrators
- Youth has to complete a drug education class(es) and community service hours
- Youth receive a certificate of completion
- Total served students: 305 (2020 current)

Anticipated Changes

Student Services:

Stanford Tobacco Toolkits: You and Me, Together Vape-free will be provided to all 6th grade students in the consortium (6 sessions)

Fresh Air Clubs Tobacco-free (FACT) will be established at 13 junior high schools. FACT members will provide peer education to 7th & 8th grades.

Intervention: Indepth (in lieu of suspension) will be available to all junior high and high schools

Cessation: (voluntary) will be available to to all junior high and high schools N.O.T.
