## MESSAGE FROM ADMINISTRATION

As we plan for next year, we wanted to reach out to you and let you know about some changes with our daily schedule. You may recall that we sent out a survey in January seeking input from families regarding our daily schedule, and we sent our students a survey as well. We had a scheduling committee that took a look at that information, as well as additional student data regarding courses and graduation rates, and developed a daily schedule that we anticipate will better meet the needs of our students.

We know that for students to have academic success in a Proficiency system, we need to provide additional focused support time; those opportunities include AM block access to teachers, Advisory (now called "What I Need" or WIN), Crimson Block (at the end of the day), and an expanded targeted support session (on Wednesdays).

We also know that students have a greater chance of success, both academic and personal, when they feel a sense of belonging in their school and community, which is why we have intentionally built in opportunities for connection.

When you look at the schedule for the Fall, you will see that class time for Blocks 1-4 has remained the same four days a week. We still have two bands of support time (WIN) in the middle of the day, as well as offering courses during AM Block. Progress Reports will still be generated every three weeks.

Every Spring, the Congressional Art Competition invites students to submit a piece of artwork to their state representative that can be showcased at the national level; if selected.


For this year, we applaud Abigail York, Class of 2024 who submitted an image from Digital Photography to Senator Welch's office.


Her Art Teacher, **Ms. Berg** noted "Abby is not only a talented photographer, she explores a variety of media. Abby runs her own jewelry making business.
She is bold, putting herself out there and sharing her creativity and artwork with others."







As an alum of *Spaulding High School*, she was a recipient of a scholarship that enabled her to attend *Trinity College* in Burlington, Vermont. For without it, she noted, "I might not have been able to attend *Trinity College*; it definitely opened a door and I took it."





As she fondly reflected upon her own Senior year in high school and the generous support of alumni and friends of *Spaulding* in terms of investing in the Senior Class. In particular, Mrs. Violette wanted to recognize this year the late **Norman Beck** and **Celina Beck** for their kindness and generosity in regards to their late granddaughter, **Amy Hilferty** who was was tragically killed by a lightning strike several days before her graduation in the mid 1990s.



Amy was an outstanding student. She excelled in academics, athletics and the performing arts. Amy is remembered for her warm personality, her generosity of spirit, and her ability to experience life to its fullest. She was beloved by teachers, staff members and her peers, and touched the lives of many residents in our local communities. Thus the Amy Hilferty Scholarship was established by her grandparents. For this year, the committee chose Charlotte Young, "specifically for this scholarship because she best represented the same trifecta that Amy did - academics, athletics, and the arts."
