Welcome to MEVA's summer school session which runs June 20-August 4. We have an impressive menu of free offerings including:

- Self-paced courses in math, English, social studies, science, and art for high school students who choose credit recovery, advancement, and enrichment. Students have until August 11th to build their final grades. Instructional support is available from individual teachers and at the Help Desk on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 11:30 am. We strongly encourage our students to take advantage of this tremendous opportunity to bolster their progress towards graduation and postsecondary goals.
- Enrichment for building core academic skills is available by election and by invitation in the middle school. We have a robust program in place to close students' achievement gaps in math and English, facilitated by our talented teachers. Students and families willing to invest time in addressing learning losses, due to the pandemic and other disruptions, will be extremely pleased with improved outcomes.
- We are also running the summer Prodigy Club open to all students for fun and enrichment.
- Students may earn high school (external) credits for summer activities, such as employment, volunteering, and other projects.

## **ACCUPLACER Testing**

All graduating students for the school year 2023-2024 will need to complete the virtual ACCUPLACER testing. This test assesses a student's post-secondary readiness skills in reading and mathematics. The data allows us to personalize a learning plan for your student to ensure they are college and career ready when they graduate. \*Note if a student completed the testing during the 2022-2023 school year, they do not need to take the test again unless otherwise indicated by their scores.

#### SY23-24 Language



Language courses offered next school year (Fall 2023) include Spanish and World Language. American Sign Language is a visual hands-on language class being offered to students who are comfortable on camera (if you are not comfortable on camera, please do not sign up for ASL). #### **UMaine Early College**


#### **NHS Ceremony**
