To qualify for CSF membership this current semester, follow these

- 1 You must earn a minimum of 10 points from the previous semester's high school grades.
 - a. At least 4 points must be from LIST I (unless you are a senior applying for membership in February of your senior year).
 - b. The first 7 points (including the four points described in line a (above) must be from LISTS I and II.
2. c. The remaining points may come from any LIST (I, II, or III).
3. NOTE: No CSF points are given for physical education, courses taken in lieu of physical courses retaken to improve a grade, office/teaching assistant courses, or courses taken on a pass/fail
4. CSF points are granted as follows (note: these are NOT the same as GPA)

Grade of A = 3 CSF	Grade of B = 1 CSF	Grade of C = 0 CSF
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 One additional point shall be granted for a grade of A or B in an AP, IB, or Honors course, uptoamaximum of pointspersemester. (A grade of C is always 0 points including for AP, IB or Honors
 A D or F in any course, even in one you cannot use to qualify, disqualifies you from membership at this time.
5. Remember: current semester membership is based on work done in the previous semester.
6. You must reapply each semester. Courses you may use are listed on the reverse side. divided into lists I, II, & III.

TO QUALIFY FOR SEAL BEARER STATUS AT GRADUATION YOU MUST HAVE:

At least 4 semesters of membership during your sophomore through senior years based on grades earned only in grades 10-12 — with at least 1 semester of membership based on grades earned during your senior year (grade 12). This means to be a CSF Sealbearer at graduation you must be a CSF member for at least 3 of the following 4 semesters: Spring of your sophomore (10th grade) year (membership based on grades received in January of your 10th-grade year) Fall of your junior (11th grade) year (membership based on grades received in June of your 10th-grade year) Spring of your junior (11th grade) year (membership based on grades received in January of your 11th-grade year) Fall of your senior (12th grade) year (membership based on grades received in June of your 11th-grade year) AND One semester of your senior (12th grade) year (generally membership based on grades received in January 12th-grade year)
