The response to COVID-19 has added to District 62's usual and customary expenses. Since last March, the district has added additional staff, purchased a great deal of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), and acquired the needed technology to support our students, who were learning in-person and remotely. We also distributed 254,617 meals at our drive-through meal pickup service from March of 2020 to March of 2021. While this has been a big commitment on the part of District 62, federal relief funds helped to offset much of these additional costs. District 62 is in a strong financial condition and should remain so in the coming years.
