

## Community Relations

### Loitering and Causing Disturbances

All visitors shall register in the office of the school Principal. Staff members should be alert to any unauthorized visitors and should contact the office of the Principal regarding persons they believe as being in or on school grounds without authority, permission or who have failed to register with the office of the school Principal. If any staff member believes that any person is an immediate danger to the students, staff or property of the school or of the staff or students, such staff member may contact the appropriate legal authorities directly. Any person is subject to removal from school grounds if they are found to be in or on school grounds 1) without first having registered with office of the school Principal; or 2) without the permission of the Principal or school administration; or 3) without a legitimate basis grounded in the need to drop-off, pick-up or address the needs of a child enrolled or scheduled to be enrolled in the school, to the extent such presence is necessary for the completion of an event enumerated above.

Any person causing a disturbance on school grounds which in the opinion of the Superintendent, or his/her designee, could lead or has led to the disruption of the educational activities of the students, or who remain in or on school grounds after a request by the Superintendent, of his/her designee, to comply with sections 1, 2 or 3 above or otherwise above, is subject to an immediate request to cease and desist and to depart the school grounds.
