At its September meeting, the Board of Education approved the Fiscal Year 2023 budget. District 62 has the practice of budgeting conservatively with actual revenues likely to be higher, and actual expenses lower, than budgeted.

Revenues are projected to be \$106.3 million and expenses are estimated at \$115.2 million, creating a budgeted deficit of \$8.9 million.

## One Tree Planted donates this fall, spring


