**2020 Transportation and Facility Services Center, Meyer Najem Construction, LLC:**

Change Order No. 001, in the amount of a deduct of \$7,069.34, adjusting the prior contract amount of \$1,516,290.00 to a new contract amount of \$1,509,220.66. The change order adjusts the contract for the savings associated with unutilized reimbursable line items from the Meyer Najem contract.

**14. Approval of Use of Facilities/Special Use Agreements:** The Administration has approved and received the following fully executed Special Use Agreement(s):

**Episcopal Diocese of Indianapolis/Good Samaritan:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 3, 2021 and fully executed June 14, 2021, for the period June 13, 2021 through June 12, 2022, for the use of one Harris Education Center classroom and the gymnasium (as well as outdoor spaces), to be billed monthly at a rate of \$454.50 per Sunday. If services are required to be held outside, the rate will be \$40 per Sunday. Due to COVID Good Samaritan has not been active on BCSC property for the past year. This agreement represents the first year of the five consecutive years permitted by the BCSC Use of Facilities rules for religious organizations.

**Brownsburg Inclusive Catholic Church:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 30, 2021 and fully executed July 6, 2021, for the period August 8, 2021 through August 8, 2022, for the use of one East MS LGI, to be billed monthly at an hourly rate of \$46.50 for facility rental and \$40.00 for staffing. This agreement represents the first year of the five consecutive years permitted by the BCSC Use of Facilities rules for religious organizations.

**Girl Scouts of Central Indiana:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 1, 2021 and fully executed June 16, 2021, for the 2021-22 school year, for the use of all elementary and middle school gymnasiums, cafeterias, media centers, and classrooms, to be billed monthly at a rate of \$10.75 per hour per space.

**Boy Scouts of America – Crossroads of America Council:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 11, 2021 and fully executed July 12, 2021, for the 2021-22 school year, for the use of all elementary and middle school gymnasiums, cafeterias, media centers, and classrooms, to be billed monthly at a rate of \$10.75 per hour per space.

**Family Promise of Hendricks County, Inc.:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 14, 2021 and fully executed June 30, 2021, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, for the use of Rooms 201, 201A, 201B, and 201C, all located at the Harris Education Center gymnasium, to be billed annually and in advance in the amount of \$2,080.00 to cover custodial support through the year. Any additional custodial hours will be billed at the published rate only if those services are necessary.

**Brownsburg Swim Club:** A Special Use Agreement dated June 11, 2021 and fully executed July 7, 2021, for the 2020-21 School Year (July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022), for use of the Brownsburg High School Aquatic Center, to be billed as follows:

- \$16.50 per hour of pool use
- \$10.75 per hour of use of other spaces at BHS
- Lifeguards billed at \$20.50 per hour for the head lifeguard and \$17.50 per hour for all other lifeguards
- Custodial hours, if required, will be billed at \$40.00 hour.

**15. Construction Contract Approval:** As authorized by the Board of School Trustees at their regularly scheduled meeting of June 14, 2021, the Administration has approved and taken the following actions:

**Bid Package 12 – General Trades, withdrawal of bid:**

The Administration approves the request from the apparent low bidder, Boyle Construction Management, Inc. (BCMI) to release BCMI from their bid without claim to their bid security. BCMI requested release due to significant errors in the preparation of their bid, which is supported by the observed spread of bids. The difference between BCMI's bid, and the next lowest bid of JBM Contractors Corp., was \$975,400 or 24%. This compares to the \$336,000/6.68% difference between the second and third bidders. A total of three bids were received in this bid package category. As a result of BCMI's withdrawal, the contract for Bid Package 12 – General Trades will be awarded to the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

**Bid Package 13 – Metal Studs and Ceilings, determination of non-responsive bidder:**

After review of the submitted bid documents and consultation with legal counsel, the Administration has determined the apparent low bidder in Bid Package 13, Perry Acoustics, Inc., is non-responsive. This determination is based upon Perry Acoustics stating they were pre-qualified by the Indiana Department of Administration when in fact Perry is not pre-qualified. Contractor pre-qualification is statutorily required by IC 5-13-16-10(c) for all projects awarded after June 30, 2016. As a result of Perry being declared unresponsive, the contract for Bid Package 13 – Metal Studs and Ceilings will be awarded to the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

**Bid Package 15 – Food Service Equipment, determination of non-responsive bidder:**

After review of the submitted bid documents and consultation with legal counsel, the Administration has determined the apparent low bidder in Bid Package 15, Breckenridge Kitchen Equipment & Design, is non-responsive. This determination is based upon Breckenridge omitting the required bidding checklist from their bid submission and Breckenridge not being listed on the Indiana Department of Administration's index of pre-qualified contractors. Contractor pre-qualification is statutorily required by IC 5-13-16-10(c) for all projects awarded after June 30, 2016. As a result of Breckenridge being declared unresponsive, the contract for Bid Package 15 – Food Service Equipment will be awarded to the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder.

*Dr. Snapp recommended that the Board of School Trustees approve the Consent Agenda as presented; Ms. Heffernan moved to approve the recommendation; Mr. Wells seconded the motion. The Board approved the motion by a vote of five (5) ayes; zero (0) nays.*

**V. COMMENTS FROM PATRONS**

*Rhonda James – Danville, Indiana* Ms. James resides in Danville and her students attend Brownsburg Schools. She asked that the Board reconsider the use of CNN10 as a source of accurate, daily news.

*Alvin Lui – Carmel, Indiana* Mr. Lui moved his family from California to Indiana and resides in Carmel. He believes the diversity work the district is doing is detrimental to students and will lead to the district racing to the bottom. He believes the focus should be on rigorous academics.

*Matthew Serd – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Serd does not believe the school district has been transparent in recent issues.

*Beth Riga – Lincoln Township, Indianapolis* Ms. Riga has asked members of the community for proof that CRT is being taught in our schools. She has not received any confirmation that CRT is being taught in the school district and believes it is not being taught in Brownsburg Schools. She asked the School Board to please continue the diversity initiatives they have worked on.

*Deb Bagan – Brownsburg, Indiana* Ms. Bagan is concerned that the school district is not following the guidance of the recommendations of the American Academy of Pediatrics, the CDC and the Department of Health that students should be wearing masks. She is concerned that students will be put at risk and disappointed that at-home learning options have not been made available.

*Friederich Rademacher – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Rademacher has two students in the schools and one who has graduated. He is concerned about a lesson his daughter was taught last fall and the process of filing a complaint with regard to the situation. He indicated he had followed the chain of command but does not feel the process was followed by the school district. He asked for the termination or resignation of the teacher for which he filed the complaint.

*Walter Kovacs – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Kovacs stated he is disgusted he has to attend a Board meeting to state his concerns about his child’s school and what appears to be an agenda

to indoctrinate them. He is appalled at the comments from Board members at the last meeting and believes the burden of proof regarding CRT should be on the shoulders of the Board and the administration.

*Kristen Ferklic – Brownsburg, Indiana* Ms. Ferklic spoke about School Board Policy 2416. She asked the Board to review the policy and follow the policy.

*Penny Bigelow – Indianapolis, Indiana* Ms. Bigelow stated that School Board members have the responsibility for the curriculum and as elected officials have a responsibility to all citizens. She believes quality education is first and SEL/CRT is taking away from valuable learning time.

*Jim Bigelow – Indianapolis, Indiana* Mr. Bigelow stated that School Board members are elected to represent all citizens and should be willing to keep an open mind when opposing views are brought to them. He shared a story about a Korean exchange student in MSD Washington Township who fell behind while attending school in the U.S. because he believes we're in the midst of a Marxist like take over. He shared materials for the Board to review.

*Erik Knight – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Knight stated that comments that were shared at the end of the last Board meeting were directed at one side. He is finding it hard to trust the Board and the school district. He asked if the Board answers to students and parents or to teachers?

*Sam Mace – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Mace stated he is surprised by the amount of division within the community. He asked the Board members to pause and reflect and to fix the lack of trust through transparency.

*Joe Walsh – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Walsh has three students in the district. He is concerned about the politicization regarding masks. He shared the CDC guidance regarding masks for unvaccinated students along with continued social distancing. He asked the Board to follow that directive.

*Rob Kendall – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Kendall congratulated the Board on lifting the mask mandate. He asked the Board to tell the truth about a what is going on about CRT.

*Becky Secord – Brownsburg, Indiana* Ms. Secord is concerned that the criteria for entrance into high ability courses are being modified to allow black and brown students to qualify for the classes.

*Anne Mattingly – Brownsburg, Indiana* Dr. Mattingly is the parent of a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader and is concerned about the optional mask policy. She asked the Board to reconsider their stance on masks for students.

*David Weyant – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Weyant spoke about the transparency of the Board and the information provided to the public.

*Stephanie Stout – Brownsburg, Indiana* Ms. Stout is a parent of 2 students in the schools. She asked the Board to be more transparent about information being used to determine masking of students. She asked the Board to reconsider the optional mask policy.

*Chenay Daily – Brownsburg, Indiana* Ms. Daily asked the Board to reconsider a universal masking policy for students and staff.

*Rick Santerre – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Santerre requested all curricular materials be made available parents. He also requested cameras be placed in all classrooms.

*Mark Nierzwick – Brownsburg, Indiana* Mr. Nierzwick spoke in support of STEM education and the high school robotics team. He asked the administration's support in encouraging a teacher mentor for the team.

## **VI. COMMUNICATIONS**

### **A. Brownsburg Education Foundation Report**

Mrs. Dearman shared the following information from the Brownsburg Education Foundation:

- BEF welcomed two new board members – Sarah Dobson and Igor Jakovljevik. She thanked retiring board members Mindy Brodt, Melissa Gose, Kevin Kerzee and Beth Oburn.
- Chip in for the Kids Golf Outing presented by Summers Plumbing, Heating and Cooling was a huge success raising over \$33,000.
- Designer Purse Bingo presented by Adelsperger Orthodontics will be held Tuesday, August 17 from 5:00-9:00 pm at the Brownsburg American Legion Hall. Tickets are \$40 each and on sale now. Contact the BEF office to purchase and see the BEF website for more information.
- Annual Surplus Sale is scheduled for Saturday, September 25 from 8:00-10:00 am. More information can be found on the BEF website.
- Drive 4 UR School event will not happen again until 2022.

Mrs. Dearman thanked BEF supporters and encouraged everyone to get involved with the events presented by the education foundation.

### **B. Operations Update**

Mr. Voigt provided a brief update on the final release of bids for the West MS project, which came in on estimate. Last week, utilizing the authorization provided by the board at the June 12<sup>th</sup> board meeting, the Administration issued the remaining seven construction contracts for the project; the specifics for each contract were listed in the July 19 Consent Agenda. With all bid packages now under contract, the total contract value is \$27,089,500.00 or 3.6% under the budget estimate. This is very good news all the way around, not least because the project had been budgeted with very minimal furnishings and equipment monies. Work on West MS is moving according to schedule and the building will be ready for the first scheduled school activities beginning July 19.

Mr. Voigt also shared information on a pilot program associated with the USDA's extended meal waiver. BCSC students will be able to receive meals over Fall Recess at no cost through the waiver program. Sign-ups for the meals will be in mid-September to allow time for procurement and packaging of the meals ready for distribution on October 8, the Friday beginning Fall Recess. Details of sig-up and distribution opportunities are being finalized. If this program goes smoothly it is expected to be repeated for Winter and Spring Recess as well.

### **C. Opening of School Update**

Dr. Snapp shared that students will be arriving next week and we will be ready for them. He noted the high school will be back to normal including scheduling, and spacing. The middle school will be normal except for the lunch schedule. The elementary schools, will continue with social distancing, staggered lunches and student pods. All things will be in place as last year except masking will be optional until vaccinations are available for elementary students. Dr. Snapp thanked those who spoke this evening regarding masks and he explained the Board will respond as data comes in. They will review information as necessary. Additionally, masks are federally mandated for buses, there is no choice in that matter. Mrs. Dearman asked about Schoology for students K-5. Dr. Jessup explained, because of cost factors, Schoology will not be available at the elementary level. However, it will remain at the secondary level.

#### **D. 2022 Budget Presentation**

Mr. Hacker provided an update to the Board regarding the budget process for the 2022 budget cycle beginning with School Finance 101. He explained the budget process and the comprehensive nature of planning and developing the budget. A copy of the budget presentation is available for review on the Corporation website.

Mr. Hacker answered several clarifying questions from Board members. There was no action required of the Board at this time.

#### **VII. OLD BUSINESS**

There were no Old Business items.

#### **VIII. NEW BUSINESS**

##### **A. Recommendation to Approve Purchase of Real Property**

Mr. Hacker recommended that the Board of School Trustees approve the purchase of the properties located at 8810 E CR 400 N and 8820 E CR 400 N. He explained that as discussed at the May 24, 2021 Board Work session, the additional 8+ acres will allow the design team for Crossroads Elementary and eventual Elementary No. 9 to develop a more efficient and effective site layout with better traffic flow and a safer, more reasonable playground arrangement as well as reduce costs by allowing for the use of surface stormwater detention instead of an expensive sub-surface detention. The site will allow the team to utilize a building layout nearly identical to Reagan/Lincoln. Mr. Hacker shared the site layout will be designed to ensure all of the facilities necessary for Crossroads Elementary School can be constructed without relying on these adjoining properties until Elementary No. 9 is needed. He explained that the funds for the purchase of the property will come from the Rainy Day fund.

#### **RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF THE BROWNSBURG COMMUNITY SCHOOL CORPORATION FOR THE PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees of Brownsburg Community School Corporation (the "Board" and the "School Corporation", respectively) desires to purchase certain real properties; and

WHEREAS, the School Corporation is a school corporation as defined in IC 20-26-2-4; and

WHEREAS, the School Corporation is required to obtain not less than two property value appraisals for each or any desired property as defined in IC 36-1-10.5-5; and

WHEREAS, the Board previously authorized the Superintendent and the Chief Financial Officer of the School Corporation to enter formal negotiations regarding the property located at 8810 E CR 400 N, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Inskeep (the "Inskeep Property") and the property located at 8820 E CR 400 N, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Preyss, (the "Preyss Property" and together with the Inskeep Property are collectively referred to as, the "Properties") and to obtain purchase agreements for each of the Properties; and

WHEREAS, the Board has published notice of the public meeting at which this resolution shall be considered in accordance with IC 5-3-1 and IC 5-14-1.5;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

1. The Board hereby approves the purchase of the Properties in the amounts described below.
2. The Board hereby ratifies, confirms, approves and authorizes the Superintendent or the Chief Financial Officer of the School Corporation to finalize the purchase and

closing on each of the Properties, enter into and execute the purchase agreements and any other required documents on behalf of the Board of the School Corporation and to obtain all of the necessary inspections, surveys and other requirements in order to complete the purchase with the owners of the Properties.

2. The total price per the average of the two appraisals on the Inskeep Property is \$542,500 to be paid in one installment at closing.
3. The total price per the average of the two appraisals on the Preyss Property is \$446,500 to be paid in one installment at closing.

Adopted and approved this 19th day of July, 2021.

*Mr. Wells moved to approve the recommendation; Ms. Heffernan seconded the motion. Dr. Freije asked what the balance of the Rainy Day fund will be after the purchase. Mr. Hacker stated the fund balance will be just under \$6.5 million. Mrs. Dearman asked what will happen to the property if we don't need Elementary No. 9. Mr. Hacker explained, while that is highly unlikely, the Board could make the decision to sell the property in the future. He noted the need for the purchase of this property at this time is to allow for the site plan for Crossroads and to alleviate the need for underground water storage which is very costly. Dr. Freije asked where the funds will come from to staff Crossroads. Mr. Hacker explained that throughout the budget process, we can plan ahead and begin setting those funds aside as well as utilizing funds from future bond proceeds. There being no further questions, the Board approved the recommendation by a vote of five (5) ayes; zero (0) nays.*

## **IX. SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS**

Dr. Snapp shared that there were 21 speakers tonight with a number of questions and claims. He wanted to make it clear on a couple of issues. A patron said that BCSC has put CRT in the school curriculum. That is, not to anyone's knowledge who deals with the school curriculum, not in place. There was a claim made about honors classes being removed, no honors classes have been removed. Mr. Hacker did a nice job talking about the budget tonight. There was a claim made about property taxes being sky high. We're in our tenth year of property tax reduction. I do want to wrap up with some questions about masks. We've offered our parents if they need an alternative health requirement, to submit a health request and to this date we initially received 31 requests. As of this time, Dr. Jessup is working with approximately 16 health requests to make sure that those parents, some of which made comments tonight about their students being safe, we're working with them to make sure they're in a comfortable spot. I think that that's important. One person commented about a document we provided. We did not originate the document. The Board received it from the Indiana School Boards Association last week, it was released by the Indiana Department of Education. The header of this document released by the Department of Education, "Answers and Information Regarding Education Standards Required by Indiana Law," talks about the Indiana Academic Standards, Indiana Employability Standards and it also talks about SEL that was mentioned and certainly CRT. This document was released statewide by the Indiana Department of Education and we provided copies. I would encourage folks to take a look at that document from the Indiana Department of Education.

Dr. Snapp continued, when we talk about enrollment increases tonight, all last year and then into this year, it's been really kind of hard to predict what's happening with enrollment. Last year we had predicted a higher enrollment and we ended up with about 70 new students, which was down for us. As of today, we have over 400, we're up 400 on our count. How is that going to wash out in the next week and a half? I have no idea. As Mr. Hacker mentioned, there could be some people that have not submitted applications to withdraw, their schools may not be open and we still have a week and a half. Our kindergarten enrollment continues to climb, we're at 665. We've had a huge jump in our first grade numbers. We typically grow about 30-40 students from kindergarten to first grade and we're up 62 students. We think some families may have just opted out of kindergarten during COVID and have come back. 820 eight graders,

that will be our biggest class right now with 809 in seventh grade. When we look at enrollment, we are up 400 students at this point in time.

Dr. Snapp then spoke about ILEARN scores. He shared there are 379 districts in the state. Those are charter schools, public schools, private parochial schools, you name it. If they took ILEARN they are in the 379. Not for the consecutive year, because there wasn't testing last year, but this is the fifth year that we've been number one. While that is just one indication of our success, we don't put all of our eggs in one ILEARN basket. We want to have high graduation rates, AP scores, honors classes, etc. I think you saw tonight in Mr. Hacker's presentation about the state funding, that we get significantly less than many other schools and that we can have teachers perform at such a level that we have the highest performing students in the state on ILEARN while receiving far less funding than many other schools. I think that's a testimony to our teachers and our school district overall. We're very pleased with that, number one. We have to be really careful that when we get the results we're not relieved. I remember the first year when we saw that and we were very excited and celebratory that we were number one and now it's, "oh, we did it again." I don't ever want it to feel old or routine that we continue to be at that spot in the state of Indiana.

## **X. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS**

Mr. Wells stated, as Dr. Snapp eluded to - CRT is not being part of the curriculum. Obviously part of the community came up and spoke tonight because they do believe that CRT is being taught in the schools here in Brownsburg. I've met with a number of community members since this was discussed at the May 10<sup>th</sup> Board meeting. As I told each person I met with, if you believe it's being taught in the schools, please bring it up. A number of people mentioned the lack of transparency here in Brownsburg. When school starts next week, if you see it and you believe it's being taught, bring it to the attention of the school. And if that's the case, Dr. Snapp and the administration will address that.

Mrs. Dearman thanked everyone who came tonight. it's kind of a long night. And for everyone who spoke, we appreciate hearing from everyone, whether it's masks or our curriculum. It's important. I want to thank Dr. Snapp and Dr. Jessup for the back to school plan and all of the detail in that and Shane for the presentation and what you do with our finances and keeping us in really good shape. That's really it, thank you guys.

Dr. Freije applauded all of those who spoke tonight, no matter your view point and appreciate any constructive feedback to better the schools in Brownsburg. We look forward to the new year and encourage families to take advantage of nutrition services, basically the free meals. Full bellies are a good thing for our kids. Make sure you feed them, get them there, take advantage of this opportunity.

Ms. Heffernan thanked everyone for speaking. It is great to hear from everybody. I am super excited for again being number one. Congratulations. It's a testament to our kids, our parents, our community, our teachers, it takes a village.

Mr. Hylton stated that if you heard a lot of comments that were made tonight, you'd think that our school system is really struggling and going through a lot and our kids are not being educated properly and they're being indoctrinated. I think we've got the best school corporation in the state of Indiana and I think Dr. Snapp was being a little bit modest as far as the credit that goes to our teachers. And again, if we could get rid of state testing, I think we would do it tomorrow. Nobody likes doing it, the teachers don't like doing it the staff doesn't like doing it. It takes away from some of the things that you can do, but when you look at the actual data, and that's what we go by, we were at about 63% passing in both language arts and math and then there was the Archdiocese of Evansville and then the first public school was Carmel, down at 56%. And then it went 55.5, 55.4. We were basically seven percentage points ahead of the second place public school corporation in the state, that being Carmel.

Anytime you can beat Carmel in anything, that is cause for celebration in Brownsburg. It's a wide gap, it's a huge gap between us and second place. It's not something that we should expect every year but it's just a great testament to all the wonderful, good things our teachers are doing in the classroom.

As Mr. Wells' said, I can sit here at every Board meeting and say CRT is not being taught in our corporation, which it's not, but there will be a group of people in our community who don't believe that. And that's fine, and they can continue to come back and continue to see what your kids are learning at school, I think we're learning great things. As for masks, I appreciate the people who talked about that tonight. I will state that I don't think we were swayed by any public input on that and although people take credit for getting the Board to take away the mask policy, there are a lot of things we talk about. The number of low cases in Hendricks County, the very few cases, the way things were going down. But just know, we will be flexible and if we need to change route, we will do that. I know that's disappointing to some, it was a tough decision to make but I don't think as a Board here, we are not swayed by people demanding that masks be taken away. It was this time last year, it was probably one of the most nerve-wracking times we could be on the School Board as to, should we start back in person, what should we do. We worked very closely with the Hendricks County Health Commissioner and other people. With COVID, we didn't know if it was the right thing to do. We thought the kids would be safe and we thought they were going to be safe with masks and everything and we had a very successful school year. I don't think we had any days cancelled because of COVID and that's a great testament to having the staff that we have. All of us up here care about kids and wanting to keep them safe and I appreciate your comments. We will continue to monitor that and monitor the cases. We don't quite know which way COVID will go, but if there is a requirement that a change be made, we will. I just hope that gives you some reassurance. I know it's not the answer you necessarily want to hear but we will be flexible to return to another process if needed. Thank you everybody for coming. We welcome people to come every Board meeting to make comments.

**XI. ADJOURNMENT**
