Solicitation Outline

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I. SCOPE OF SOLICITATION

It is the intention of Darlington County School District to select qualified contractors to provide expertise to the District in Pre-Construction Phase Services and Construction Phase Services ("CM at Risk") for a proposed New Elementary School (Project A) and other future Capital projects (Project B). The new school will utilize the same design as a school recently built by the district. This work shall be performed pursuant to an AIA form contract as modified by the District, with a guaranteed maximum price (GMP). Proposed future Capital projects are listed in Section III, Scope of Work.

The District has an existing contract with Jumper Carter Sease Architects & Moseley Architects. Jumper Carter Sease will be the architects for the proposed New Elementary School and the other projects will be allocated between the two firms.

The selected Contractor(s) will serve as an integral member of the project team providing expertise during the Pre-Construction Phase. The Contractor's expertise should include, but not be limited to, knowledge of construction means and methods, knowledge of materials and placement methods, cost estimating/value engineering, skilled trade considerations, and significant successful experiences with state/local government entities as well as local subcontractors. The services related to Pre-Construction Phase activities will include, but are not limited to, cost estimating, development of a project scope, project scheduling, construction packaging and phasing, permitting/process planning and coordination of the subcontractor/vendor solicitation, sub-contractor pre-qualification, projection of construction cost and cash flow, and value engineering.

The Contractor(s) and District will agree to an amendment of the contract in which the scope of construction services and a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for the Construction Phase of the project will be determined.

<u>Maximum Contract Period – Estimated</u>: September 15, 2023 - September 14, 2028. Dates provided are estimates only. Any resulting contract will begin on the date specified in the notice of award. Contract is for one (1) initial year with the option to renew the engagement on an annual basis for up to four (4) one-year periods. Maximum contract period is five (5) years.

II. INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFERORS

A. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

<u>DEFINITIONS</u> Except as otherwise provided herein, the following definitions are applicable to all parts of the solicitation. For additional definitions, see the terms and conditions below.

- 1. Amendment means a document issued to supplement the original solicitation document.
- 2. Board means the Darlington County School District Board of Trustees.
- 3. Buyer means the Procurement Official.
- 4. Change Order means any written alteration in specification, delivery point, rate of delivery, period of performance, price, quantity, or other provisions of any contract accomplished by mutual agreement of the parties of the contract.
- 5. Contract means all types of Darlington County School District agreements, regardless of what they may be called, for the procurement or disposal of supplies, services, equipment or construction.
- 6. Contract Modification means a written order signed by the Procurement Official, directing the contractor to make changes,
- which the changes clause of the contract authorizes the Procurement Official to order without the consent of the contractor. 7. Contractor – means the Offeror receiving an award as a result of this solicitation.
- 8. Cooperative Purchasing means procurement conducted by, or on behalf of, more than (1) public procurement unit.
- Cover Page means the top page of the original solicitation on which the solicitation is identified by number. Offerors are cautioned that Amendments may modify information provided on the Cover Page.
- 10. Days means calendar days.
- 11. District means Darlington County School District.
- **12.** Offer means the bid, or proposal submitted in response to this solicitation. The terms "Bid" and "Proposal" are used interchangeably with the term "Offer."
- 13. Offeror means the single legal entity submitting the offer. The term "Bidder" is used interchangeably with the term "Offeror." See bidding provisions entitled "Signing Your Offer" and "Bid/Proposal As Offer To Contract."
- 14. Page Two means the second page of the original solicitation, which is label Page Two.
- 15. Procurement Official/Officer means the person, or designee, identified as such on the Cover Page.
- 16. Solicitation means this document, including all its parts, attachments, and any Amendments.
- 17. Subcontractor means any person having a contract to perform work or render service to Contractor as a part of the Contractor's agreement arising from this solicitation
- 18. Us or We means Darlington County School District.
- **19.** Work means all labor, materials, equipment and services provided or to be provided by the Contractor to fulfill the Contractor's obligations under the Contract.

<u>AMENDMENTS TO SOLICITATION</u> (a) The Solicitation may be amended at any time prior to opening. Any addendum issued by the District shall become a formal part of this Request for Proposal. All actual and prospective Offerors should monitor the following web site for the issuance of Amendments: <u>http://www.darlington.k12.sc.us/departments/finance_and_procurement/solicitations</u> (b) Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of any Amendment to this solicitation (1) by signing and returning the Amendment, (2) by letter, or (3) by submitting a bid that indicates in some way that the bidder received the Amendment.

<u>AWARD NOTIFICATION</u> Notice regarding the District's intent to award a contract will be posted at the location specified on the Cover Page. If the contract resulting from this Solicitation has a total or potential value in excess of fifty thousand dollars, such notice will be sent to all Offerors responding to the Solicitation and any award will not be effective until the tenth day after such notice is given.

<u>BID ACCEPTANCE PERIOD</u> In order to withdraw your Offer after the minimum period specified on the Cover Page, you must notify the Procurement Official in writing.

BID IN ENGLISH & DOLLARS Offers submitted in response to this solicitation shall be in the English language and in US dollars, unless otherwise permitted by the solicitation.

<u>BID FORMS</u> Bid Forms are included for your use. Only these Bid Forms shall be used; no other form is acceptable. Please indicate your firm's name on the Bid Forms and have it signed by a person authorized to do so. A cover letter on your corporate stationery should include any comment and/or information you feel may be pertinent to the evaluation of your bid. The prices specified in your bid must be F.O.B. Destination with all freight charges prepaid and allowed, if applicable. On the Bid Forms, please indicate the delivery time, after receipt of an order, for the service or materials on which you have bid. No hidden or undisclosed prices will be acceptable.

<u>BID / PROPOSAL AS OFFER TO CONTRACT</u> By submitting the District a signed Bid and/or Proposal, you are offering to enter into a contract with Darlington County School District and agreeing to all terms and conditions provided herein. Your bid and/or proposal as well as the terms and conditions of this solicitation will become part of any contract created as a result of this solicitation. THEREFORE, ANY OBJECTION TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREIN MUST BE ADDRESSED WITH THE DISTRICT PRIOR TO SUBMITTAL OF YOUR BID AND/OR PROPOSAL. SUCH OBJECTIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN WRITING AS DESCRIBED HEREIN FOR ANY INQUIRIES. Without further action by either party, a binding contract shall result upon final award. Any award issued will be issued to, and the contract will be formed with, the entity identified as the Offeror on the Cover Page. An Offer may be submitted by only one legal entity; "joint bids" are not allowed.

<u>ENTERING INTO CONTRACT</u> The District shall not enter into or sign any agreement, contract or other document that conflicts in any way with the District's General Terms and Conditions and the requirements of this solicitation. Proposers should submit for review any agreement, contract or other document that the firm wishes the District to sign, with the proposal. Submittal of such agreement, contract or other document does not constitute an acceptance of any terms and /or conditions contained in such document. Agreements, contracts or other documents that infringe upon the rights of the District or are not in the best interest of the District shall be determined to be non-responsive. The rights and authority of such determination is reserved solely by the staff of the District's Procurement Department. By Submitting a solicitation response, the proposer acknowledges that it has had the opportunity to inquire about the District's Procurement Code, this solicitation and other District policy.

<u>PROCUREMENT OFFICER AS PROCUREMENT AGENT</u> (a) Authorized Agent. All authority regarding the conduct of this procurement is vested solely with the responsible Procurement Officer or designee. Unless specifically delegated in writing, the Procurement Officer is the only official authorized to bind the District with regard to this procurement. (b) Purchasing Liability. The Procurement Officer is an employee of Darlington County School District acting on behalf of Darlington County School District pursuant to the Consolidated Procurement Code. Any contracts awarded as a result of this procurement are between the Contractor and Darlington County School District. The Procurement Officer is not a party to such contracts and bears no liability for any party's losses arising out of or relating in any way to the contract.

<u>CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION</u> GIVING FALSE, MISLEADING, OR INCOMPLETE INFORMATION ON THIS CERTIFICATION MAY RENDER YOU SUBJECT TO PROSECUTION UNDER SECTION 16-9-10 OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA CODE OF LAWS AND OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS.

(a) By submitting an offer, the Offeror certifies that:

(1) The prices in this offer have been arrived at independently, without, for the purpose of restricting competition, any consultation, communication, or agreement with any other Offeror or competitor relating to:

- (i) Those prices;
- (ii) The intention to submit an offer; or
- (iii) The methods or factors used to calculate the prices offered.

(2) The prices in this offer have not been and will not be knowingly disclosed by the Offeror, directly or indirectly, to any other Offeror or competitor before bid opening (in the case of a sealed bid solicitation) or contract award (in the case of a negotiated solicitation) unless otherwise required by law; and

(3) No attempt has been made or will be made by the Offeror to induce any other concern to submit or not to submit an offer for the purpose of restricting competition.

(b) Each signature on the offer is considered to be a certification by the signatory that the signatory:

(1) Is the person in the Offeror's organization responsible for determining the prices being offered in this bid or proposal, and that the signatory has not participated and will not participate in any action contrary to paragraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) of this certification; or

(2)(i) Has been authorized, in writing, to act as agent for the Offeror's principals in certifying that those principals have not participated, and will not participate in any action contrary to paragraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) of this certification [As used in this subdivision (b)(2)(i), the term "principals" means the person(s) in the Offeror's organization responsible for determining the prices offered in this bid or proposal];

(ii) As an authorized agent, does certify that the principals referenced in subdivision (b)(2)(i) of this certification have not participated, and will not participate, in any action contrary to paragraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) of this certification; and

(iii) As an agent, has not personally participated, and will not participate, in any action contrary to paragraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) of this certification.

(c) If the Offeror deletes or modifies paragraph (a)(2) of this certification, the Offeror must furnish with its offer a signed statement setting forth in detail the circumstances of the disclosure.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS

(a)

(1) By submitting an Offer, Offeror certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that-

(i) Offeror and/or any of its Principals

(A) Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible for the award of contracts by any state or federal agency;

(B) Have not, within a three-year period preceding this offer, been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for: commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, state, or local) contract or subcontract; violation of Federal or state antitrust statutes relating to the submission of offers; or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, tax evasion, or receiving stolen property; and

(C) Are not presently indicted for, or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity with, commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (a)(1)(i)(B) of this provision.

- (ii) Offeror has not, within a three-year period preceding this offer, had one or more contracts terminated for default by any public (Federal, state, or local) entity.
- (2) "Principals," for the purposes of this certification, means officers; directors; owners; partners; and, persons having primary management or supervisory responsibilities within a business entity (e.g., general manager; plant manager; head of a subsidiary, division, or business segment, and similar positions).

(b) Offeror shall provide immediate written notice to the Procurement Officer if, at any time prior to contract award, Offeror learns that its certification was erroneous when submitted or has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.

(c) If Offeror is unable to certify the representations stated in paragraphs (a)(1), Offer must submit a written explanation regarding its inability to make the certification. The certification will be considered in connection with a review of the Offeror's responsibility. Failure of the Offeror to furnish additional information as requested by the Procurement Officer may render the Offeror nonresponsible.

(d) Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render, in good faith, the certification required by paragraph (a) of this provision. The knowledge and information of an Offeror is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.

(e) The certification in paragraph (a) of this provision is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when making award. If it is later determined that the Offeror knowingly or in bad faith rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to Darlington County School District, the Procurement Officer may terminate the contract resulting from this solicitation for default.

<u>COMPLETION OF FORMS / CORRECTION OF ERRORS</u> All prices and notation should be printed in ink or typewritten. Errors should be crossed out, corrections entered and initialed by the person signing the bid. Do not modify the solicitation document itself (including bid schedule).

<u>DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF OFFER</u> Any offer received after the Procurement Officer of Darlington County School District or designee has declared that the time set for opening has arrived, shall be rejected unless the offer has been delivered to the designated Darlington County School District Office of Procurement as instructed on the Cover page prior to the bid opening.

DISCLOSURE OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST OR UNFAIR COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE You warrant and represent that your offer identifies and explains any unfair competitive advantage you may have in competing for the proposed contract and any actual or potential conflicts of interest that may arise from your participation in this competition or your receipt of an award. The two underlying principles are (a) preventing the existence of conflicting roles that might bias a contractor's judgment, and (b) preventing an unfair competitive advantage. If you have an unfair competitive advantage or a conflict of interest, Darlington County School District may withhold award. Before withholding award on these grounds, an Offeror will be notified of the concerns and provided a reasonable opportunity to respond. Efforts to avoid or mitigate such concerns, including restrictions on future activities, may be considered. Without limiting the foregoing, you represent that your offer identifies any services that relate to either this solicitation or the work and that has already been performed by you, a proposed subcontractor, or an affiliated business of either.

<u>DISCUSSIONS WITH OFFERORS</u>: After opening, the Procurement Officer may, in his sole discretion, initiate discussions with you to discuss your proposal. Discussions are possible only if your proposal is apparently responsive and only for the purpose of clarification to assure your full understanding of the solicitation's requirements. Any discussions will be documented in writing and shall be included with the bid.

<u>DRUG FREE WORK PLACE CERTIFICATION</u> By submitting an Offer, Contractor certifies that, if awarded a contract, Contractor will comply with all applicable provisions of the Drug-Free Workplace Act, Title 44, Chapter 107 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, as amended.

<u>DUTY TO INQUIRE</u> Offeror, by submitting an Offer, represents that it has read and understands the Solicitation and that its Offer is made in compliance with the Solicitation. Offerors are expected to examine the Solicitation thoroughly and should request an explanation of any ambiguities, discrepancies, errors, omissions, or conflicting statements in the Solicitation. Failure to do so will be at the Offeror's risk. Offeror assumes responsibility for any patent ambiguity in the Solicitation that Offeror does not bring to the District's attention.

<u>ETHICS CERTIFICATE</u> By submitting an offer, the offeror certifies that the offeror has and will comply with, and has not, and will not, induce a person to violate Title 8, Chapter 13 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, as amended (ethics act). The following statutes require special attention: Section 8-13-700, regarding use of official position for financial gain; Section 8-13-705, regarding gifts to influence action of public official; Section 8-13-720, regarding offering money for advice or assistance of public official; Sections 8-13-755 and 8-13-760, regarding restrictions on employment by former public official; Section 8-13-775, prohibiting public official with economic interests from acting on contracts; Section 8-13-790, regarding restrictions on contributions by contractor to candidate who participated in awarding of contract. The District may rescind any contract and recover all amounts expended as a result of any action taken in violation of this provision. If contractor participates, directly or indirectly, in the evaluation or award of public contracts, including without limitation, change orders or task orders regarding a public contract, contractor shall, if required by law to file such a statement, provide the statement required by Section 8-13-1150 to the Procurement Officer at the same time the law requires the statement to be filed.

<u>OFFICE CLOSING</u> If an emergency or unanticipated event interrupts normal District processes so that offers cannot be received at the District office designated for receipt of bids by the exact time specified in the solicitation, the time specified for receipt of offers will be deemed to be extended to the same time of day specified in the solicitation on the first work day on which normal District's processes resume. In lieu of an automatic extension, an amendment may be issued to reschedule bid opening. If District offices are closed at the time a pre-bid or pre-proposal conference is scheduled, an amendment will be issued to reschedule the conference.

<u>PROPOSER'S QUALIFICATIONS</u> Offers shall be considered only from qualified firms who are regularly established in the business called for and who in the judgment of the District are financially responsible and able to show evidence of their reliability, ability, experience, to render prompt and satisfactory service in the volume called for under this contract

PROTESTS

- (a) Any prospective bidder, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation of a contract shall protest to the chief business official within fifteen (15) days of the date of issuance of the Invitation For Bids or Requests for Proposals or other solicitation documents, whichever is applicable, or any amendment to it, if the amendment is at issue. An Invitation for Bids or Requests for Proposals or other solicitation document, not including an amendment to it, is considered to have been issued on the date required notice of the issuance is given in accordance with the District Procurement Code.
- (b) Any actual bidder, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor who is aggrieved in connection with the intended award or award of a contract shall notify the chief business official in writing of its intent to protest within seven business days of the date that award or notification of intent to award, whichever is earlier, is posted and sent in accordance with the code. Any actual bidder, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor who is aggrieved in connection with the intended award or award of a contract and has timely notified the chief business official of its intent to protest, may protest to the chief business official within fifteen days of the date award or notification of intent to award, whichever is earlier, is posted and sent in accordance with the District Procurement Code; except that a matter that could have been raised pursuant to subitem (a) as a protest of the solicitation may not be raised as a protest of the award or intended award of a contract.

A protest must be in writing, submitted to Renee Douglas, Chief Procurement Officer, 120 East Smith Avenue, Darlington, SC 29532 or emailed to <u>Renee.douglas@darlington.k12.sc.us</u> and shall set forth the grounds of the protest and the relief requested with enough particularity to give notice of the issues to be decided.

The right to protest and remedies granted by the District Procurement Code are not available for contracts with an actual or potential value of up to fifty thousand dollars.

<u>PROHIBITED COMMUNICATIONS AND DONATIONS</u> Violation of these restrictions may result in disqualification of your offer, suspension or debarment, and may constitute a violation of law. (a) During the period between publication of the solicitation and final award, you must not communicate, directly or indirectly, with the District employees, agents or officials regarding any aspect of this procurement activity, unless otherwise approved in writing by the Procurement Officer. III. SCOPE OF WORK

A. <u>GENERAL INFORMATION</u>

1. ABOUT DARLINGTON COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

Darlington County School District serves approximately 9,000 students in Darlington County. Located in northeastern South Carolina, the District is divided into three attendance zones (Darlington, Hartsville, and Lamar). Each zone serves a different geographic base of Darlington County. The District currently has a total of 22 schools which includes 11 elementary schools, 3 middle schools, 4 high schools, 1 Institute of Technology, 1 Alternative school, 1 Virtual Academy and Adult Education (4 locations). In addition to these schools, the District has multiple administrative and support facilities located throughout Darlington County.

The District strives to promote a high standard of excellence to create an atmosphere of partnership with the community to ignite in every student a passion for world-class knowledge and skills through dynamic instruction and personalized educational opportunities. An eight-member Board of Trustees dedicated to govern the District, and insure quality and equal education opportunities to all the citizens they serve.

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

It is the intention of Darlington County School District to select qualified contractors to provide expertise to the District in Pre-Construction Phase Services and Construction Phase Services ("CM at Risk") for a proposed New Elementary School (Project A) and other future Capital projects (Project B). The new school will utilize the same design as a school recently built by the district. This work shall be performed pursuant to an AIA form contract as modified by the District, with a guaranteed maximum price (GMP). Proposed future Capital projects are listed in Section III, Scope of Work below.

The District has an existing contract with Jumper Carter Sease Architects & Moseley Architects. Jumper Carter Sease will be the architects for the proposed New Elementary School and the other projects will be allocated between the two firms.

The selected Contractor(s) will serve as an integral member of the project team providing expertise during the Pre-Construction Phase. The Contractor's expertise should include, but not be limited to, knowledge of construction means and methods, knowledge of materials and placement methods, cost estimating/value engineering, skilled trade considerations, and significant successful experiences with state/local government entities as well as local subcontractors. The services related to Pre-Construction Phase activities will include, but are not limited to, cost estimating, development of a project scope, project scheduling, construction packaging and phasing, permitting/process planning and coordination of the subcontractor/vendor solicitation, sub-contractor pre-qualification, projection of construction cost and cash flow, and value engineering.

The Contractor(s) and District will agree to an amendment of the contract in which the scope of construction services and a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for the Construction Phase of the project will be determined.

Unless otherwise stated herein, the basic and governing language of the Contract resulting from this solicitation shall be comprised of the Request for Proposal documents, including any attachments and amendments, and the successful offeror's proposal. In the event of a conflict between the two documents, the RFP shall govern.

Firms interested in submitting their qualifications and proposal for consideration are encouraged to carefully review this document, and submit a response providing all of the requested information in the format requested.

This solicitation does not commit the District to award a contract for services or pay any costs incurred in the preparation of a proposal or any pre-contract expense. The District reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals received as a result of this request, or to cancel in part or in its entirety this request for qualifications/proposals, without liability whatsoever, if it is in the best interest of the District to do so or if funding is not available.

The evaluation/selection committee shall rely upon all representations made by the offeror to the District, whether verbal or written, during the evaluation process. The District's reliance on the offeror's represented expertise with the types of services outlined in this document, and may be incorporated into any, and all, formal agreements between the parties that may result from this selection process.

Furthermore, the terms advisor, consultant, contractor, firm, offeror, or vendor may be used interchangeably throughout this document.

B. PROJECT SCOPE OF WORK AND MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS

1. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECTS

Project A is a New Elementary School to be located at 2308 N Governor Williams Highway, Darlington, SC 29540. The school will house 650 students in grades K-4 – 5th grade and be approximately 92,000 square feet. The owner's budget range for Project A, inclusive of all "soft costs" is presently between \$26M and \$34M. The owner's schedule is to have the project completed by the start of school in July of 2025.

Project B includes Other Capital projects identified below and future renovations /additions identified by the Board.

- District Office Building 6 HVAC system/duct work replacement and building upgrades Owner's budget range, inclusive of all "soft costs", for this project is presently \$1M-\$3.2M and this project needs to be completed in FY 23-24.
- District Office Building 7 Renovations for office space / meeting space / records retention Owner's budget range, inclusive of all "soft costs", for this project is presently \$2M-\$4.5M and the timeline is FY 23-24 / FY 24-25.
- Future Athletic Facility upgrades & new additions (Track & Tennis courts) Owner's budget range, inclusive of all "soft costs", for these project is presently \$600K \$2M with no timeline determined yet.
- Future Renovations/Additions per District Facilities 2019 Study (found on District website under Quick Links) Owner's budget range, inclusive of all "soft costs", for these projects is presently \$5M-\$20M with no timeline determined yet.

2. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED

The selected firm(s) shall perform Pre-Construction and Construction Phase Services as set forth in modified AIA Documents A-133 (2019) and A-201 (2017). The firm must have appropriate bonding and insurance capacity to be considered for selection. The selected firm shall provide services from the conceptual stage through planning, design, construction, occupation, and contract closeout. The scope of work consists of the following tasks:

Pre-Construction Services shall include but are not limited to the following:

- a. Participate in program manager and design team meetings as required to facilitate the design process.
- b. Evaluate the design during development; providing analysis of alternate construction methods and materials for potential quality, cost and schedule enhancements.
- c. Evaluate construction documents for constructability, maintainability, potential problems, errors and compliance with the construction budget.
- d. Develop a construction schedule, coordinating activities to accomplish the completion of the project by the earliest date possible within the stated cost limitation.
- e. Provide cost estimating, cost management, value analysis, and value engineering.
- f. Provide cost estimating of alternative means, methods, materials and configurations of the design.
- g. Provide cost estimating of individual construction packages.
- h. Develop a construction budget to be maintained throughout the design and construction to conform with the Guaranteed Maximum Price for the Project.
- i. Guaranteed Maximum Price: At an appropriate point in the project and subject to contractual negotiations, the CM at-Risk shall issue to the District a guaranteed maximum price backed by a surety bond. The project(s) shall be constructed within this Guaranteed Maximum Price. To the extent professionally responsible, the firm will overlap the Design Development and Construction Phases when components are conducive to early construction starts, reflecting such in the project schedule.

Construction Phase Services shall include but are not limited to the following:

- a. Develop requirements for safety, quality assurance, and schedule adherence.
- b. Maintain on-site staff for construction management.
- c. Maintain a system for tracking the timely submittal, review, and approval of submittals.
- d. Coordinate, conduct, and document regular construction meetings.
- e. Prepare and submit change order documentation for review and approval by the Architect, Program Manager, and the District.
- f. Maintain on-site records and submit monthly progress reports to the Architect and the District.
- g. Maintain quality control and ensure conformity to contract documents.

- h. Reconcile construction contract requirements with the construction budget.
- i. Assist the District with required permits and inspections.
- j. Develop and maintain a detailed design and construction schedule indicating sequencing of construction activities and milestones necessary for completion of the project by the targeted date.
- k. Provide site reports and summary monthly progress reports.

Miscellaneous:

- The selected Contractor(s) shall be required to hold a publicly advertised pre-bid meeting(s), covering all projects, prior to accepting bids to be used in preparation of the GMP.
- The selected Contractor shall be required to obtain a minimum of 3 qualified, competitive bids for all work in excess of 5% of the total construction cost. Adequate price competition must exist for all components of the construction work awarded by a construction manager at-risk on the basis of competitive bids. The owner will require that all bids be compiled and presented prior to or at the establishment of the GMP. The owner shall be present when all bids are opened for review.
- The contract with a construction manager at-risk cannot involve cost reimbursement.
- All construction management services provided by a construction manager at-risk must be paid as a fee based on either a fixed rate, fixed amount, or fixed formula.
- Construction may not commence until the bonding requirements have been satisfied. Subject to the foregoing, bonding may be provided, and construction may commence for a designated portion of the construction.
- In a construction management at-risk project, construction may not commence for any portion of the construction until after the District and the construction manager at risk contract for a fixed price or a GMP regarding that portion of the construction.
- The District shall have the right at any time, and for three years following final payment, to audit the construction manager at-risk to disallow and to recover costs not properly charged to the project. Any costs incurred above the GMP shall be paid for by the construction manager at-risk.
- A construction manager at-risk may not self-perform any construction work for which subcontractor bids are invited, unless no acceptable bids are received, or a subcontractor fails to perform. The contract with a construction manager at-risk requires the construction manager at-risk to invite bids for all major components of the construction work.
- The Owner reserves the right to pre-qualify and/or approve subcontractors.

Failure to comply with format requirements may cause the submittal to be removed from further consideration.
- 4. All bids/offers should be complete and should convey all of the information requested by the District. If significant errors are found in the Offeror's bid, or if the bid/offer fails to conform to the essential requirements of the IFB/RFP, the District and the District alone, will be the judge as to whether the variance is significant enough to reject the bid/offer. Bids/Offers which included either modifications to any of the contractual requirements of the IFB/RFP or an Offeror's standard terms and conditions may be deemed non-responsive and therefore not considered for award.

REQUIRED PROPOSAL INFORMATION AND FORMAT SUBMITTAL

In order to ensure a uniform review process and to obtain the maximum degree of comparability, it is required that proposals be submitted in the format outlined below. **Any portion not included will be cause for possible elimination from the proposal process.** Any portions of the submitted proposal that are to be treated by the District as proprietary and confidential information must be clearly marked as such. Proprietary and confidential information submitted by an Offeror shall not be subject to public disclosure; however, the Offeror must invoke this protection by so stating in writing. The proprietary or trade secret material submitted must be identified by some distinct method such as highlighting or underlining and must indicate only the specific words, figures, or paragraphs that constitute trade secrets or proprietary information. The classification of the entire proposal document, line item prices

and/or total proposal prices as proprietary or trade secret information is not acceptable and may result in rejection of the proposal as nonresponsive. By submission of a proposal, you are guaranteeing that all goods meet the requirements of this RFP.

Submission of proposals indicates Respondent's acceptance of the evaluation technique and Respondent's recognition that some subjective judgments must be made by District during the determination of ranking order and award. The District reserves the right to select or reject any and all responses as a result of this Request for Proposal. The District is not liable for any costs incurred by any person or firm responding to this Request for Proposal.

The **Proposal** shall include the information listed below, tabbed and indexed in the following sequence:

1) Cover Letter

- Each proposal shall include a one-page cover letter at the beginning of the proposal. The cover letter shall provide a brief overview, and summarize the key strengths of the submitting firm.
- Offeror shall include the solicitation Cover Page (Page 1) and Page Two completed and signed.
- Offeror shall include Attachments B, C, D and E

2) Firm Overview & Proposed Management Team (35%)

A. Company Information

- History of company including key management.
- Location of corporate headquarters and other divisional offices.
- Location of office(s) which will be involved in this Project during both pre-construction and construction.
- Provide a current copy of State of South Carolina Contractors/Construction Manager's License. Appropriate business licenses will be required prior to project award.

B. Pre-Construction and Construction Project Team

- Provide resumes describing your anticipated Project Team, along with their individual and team experience in projects similar in nature to the proposed project. Identify current obligations and project assignments.
- Include an organizational chart identifying key individuals and their responsibilities.
- Specifically identify your assigned Project Manager and possible Superintendent for the Project. The proposed Project Manager must be present at the RFP interviews, and the selected firm must commit to maintain the same person as Project Manager for the entire duration of the Project.

3) Relevant Construction Experience (35%)

- Describe your previous experience in providing similar services. - Describe your firm's project management systems and how your firm intends to provide pre-construction and construction management services.
- It is the desire of the Darlington County School District that minority-owned business enterprises (MBE) and small business enterprises (SBE) have a fair and equal opportunity to participate in the project. The Contractor(s) shall demonstrate its program for providing opportunity for local subcontractors and suppliers to compete for contracts to provide goods, services and/or construction.

6) Financial Information & Claims History (10%)

- Provide a reviewed and/or audited financial statement, balance sheet and income statement for the firm, prepared by a certified public accountant. The financial statement must be within 6 months of year end, but in no case more than 18 months old.
- Provide a compliance letter from your bonding company showing consent to provide 100% Performance and Payment Bonds for your services as a Contractor. Each respondent shall provide a certificate of insurance detailing their firm's present coverage and limits. Insurance agent shall certify that they are licensed to perform business in the State of South Carolina. The certificate of insurance should be addressed to District and be dated within 30 days of the RFP due date.
- Describe all instances of project disputes, which, in the last five years, reached the level of:
 - 1. Formal mediation, arbitration, or litigation;

Compensation:

If the District determines that reasonable fees cannot be agreed upon, the District may formally terminate the negotiations and proceed to open negotiations with the next highest-ranked proposer.

V. QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFEROR

QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFEROR: To be eligible for award of a contract, a prospective Contractor must be responsible. In evaluating an Offeror's responsibility, the District Standards of Responsibility and information from any other source may be considered. An Offeror must, upon request of the District, furnish satisfactory evidence of its ability to meet all contractual requirements. Unreasonable failure to supply information promptly in connection with a responsibility inquiry may be grounds for determining that you are ineligible to receive an award. We may consider information from any source at any time prior to award. We may elect to consider (i) key personnel, any predecessor business, and any key personnel of any predecessor business, including 2223-06 CM at Risk for Project A - New Elementary School and CM at Risk for Project B – Other Capital Projects

any facts arising prior to the date a business was established, and/or (ii) any subcontractor you identify. Corporate subsidiaries are cautioned that the financial capability of an affiliated or parent company will not be considered in determining financial capability; however, we may elect to consider any security, e.g., letter of credit, performance bond, parent-company corporate guaranty, that you offer to provide.

QUALIFICATIONS - REQUIRED INFORMATION: Submit the following information or documentation for you and for any subcontractor (at any tier level) that you identify pursuant to the clause titled Subcontractor – Identification. Err on the side of inclusion. You represent that the information provided is complete.

Proposers must meet or exceed these qualifications to be considered for award. Any exceptions to the requirements listed should be on a separate sheet marked "Exceptions" and clearly detailed in proposer's response.

- a) The general history and experience of the business in providing work of similar size and scope. Five (5) year minimum.
- b) Three (3) references of similar projects for which Offeror has performed, at any time during the past three (3) years, services substantially similar to those sought with this solicitation. Err on the side of inclusion; by submitting an Offer, Offeror represents that the list is complete. School District experience is desired.
- c) Must have a clear understanding of industry standards and best practices.
- d) Offeror shall provide with their proposal copies of all appropriate certifications, licenses and permits, as well as evidence to support the documentation. Failure to provide this information may make your bid non-responsive.
- e) Must have knowledge of and comply with all currently applicable, and as they become enacted during the contract term, federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations. All laws of the State of South Carolina, whether substantive or procedural, shall apply to the contract, and all statutory, charter, and ordinance provisions that are applicable to public contracts in the District shall be followed with respect to the contract.
- f) Must have the capacity to acquire all bonds, escrows or insurance as outlined in the terms of this RFP.

Failure to provide all requested information will be reason for rejection of bid.

Failure to bid as specified will be reason for rejection of bid.

The District reserves the right to reject any and all proposals or any portion of said proposals, to waive minor technicalities, and to make any and all award decisions based on the best interests of the District.

VI. EVALUATION AND AWARD

POTENTIAL AND ACTUAL PROPOSERS SHALL **NOT** CONTACT MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OR THE DISTRICT EVALUATION/SELECTION COMMITTEE AT ANY TIME DURING THE EVALUATION AND SELECTION PROCESS WITH THE PURPOSE OF INFLUENCING THE OUTCOME OF THE COMPETITION.

A. EVALUATION OF OFFERS

- 1. RESPONSIVENESS: Upon receipt of all proposals, by the date and time specified in the RFP/RFQ, the Procurement Office shall review all proposals for responsiveness to the proposal instructions. The District shall retain the right to consider any proposal as non-responsive based solely on its judgment that the proposal does not satisfactorily meet the criteria of the proposal instructions or the District's Procurement Code. Those proposals found to be responsive shall be further evaluated by an evaluation committee.
- 2. EVALUATION CRITERIA: Following receipt of proposals from all interested persons and firms, proposals shall be reviewed by a District Evaluation/Selection Committee. The proposals that meet the stated qualifications and submission requirements shall be ranked utilizing the evaluation criteria stated below. Once an initial ranking of all proposals has been conducted, the District may elect to award to the top ranked offeror/firm or conduct interviews with the three highest ranked offers/firms. If the Evaluation/Selection Committee elects to interview the top ranked offers/firms, a list of offerors/firms selected for interview shall be sent to all offerors/firms that submitted a proposal.

- 3. INTERVIEWS: The District Evaluation/Selection Committee reserves the right to conduct interviews with the highest ranked Offeror(s) after the initial evaluation has been completed. The primary purpose of the interviews shall be to provide such further information as may be required by the District Evaluation/Selection Committee to fully acquaint itself with the relative qualifications of the short-listed firms with regard to the project(s) and the Owner's needs. Elaborate presentations are discouraged, the Owner's preference being for an interactive discussion of key issues and to hear the proposers' responses to interview questions. Interviews will be conducted virtually. Any cost associated with the interview process shall be the responsibility of the Offeror.
- 4. NEGOTIATIONS: Offerors shall be ranked from highest to lowest total point scores. Negotiations shall commence with the offeror receiving the highest total score and shall proceed down the rankings until the District has successfully negotiated the fees and contract terms with an offeror or the District determines that no satisfactory contract can be negotiated.

B. AWARD

AWARD TO HIGHEST RANKED OFFEROR(S): Award shall be determined by the highest ranked, responsive, and responsible offeror(s) whose offer is determined to be the most advantageous to the District. Project A will be awarded to one Offeror and Project B will be awarded to one or more Offeror(s).

The District reserves the right to reject or accept any or all proposals and to waive any informalities and/or irregularities thereof.

VII. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. GENERAL

<u>AFFIRMATIVE ACTION</u> The contractor will take affirmative action in complying with all Federal and State requirements concerning fair employment and employment of the handicapped, and concerning the treatment of all employees, without regard or discrimination by reason of race, color, religion, sex, national origin or physical handicap. The following are incorporated herein by reference: 41 C.F.R. 60-1.4, 60-250.4 and 60-741-4.

<u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: No contract or its provisions may be assigned, sublet, or transferred without the written consent of the Procurement Officer.

<u>BANKRUPTCY</u>: (a) Notice. In the event the Contractor enters into proceedings relating to bankruptcy, whether voluntary or involuntary, the Contractor agrees to furnish written notification of the bankruptcy to the District. This notification shall be furnished within five (5) days of the initiation of the proceedings relating to the bankruptcy filing. This notification shall include the date on which the bankruptcy petition was filed, the identity of the court in which the bankruptcy petition was filed, and a listing of all District contracts against which final payment has not been made. This obligation remains in effect until final payment under this Contract. (b) Termination. This contract is voidable and subject to immediate termination by the District upon the contractor's insolvency, including the filing of proceedings in bankruptcy.

<u>CHOICE-OF-LAW</u>: The Agreement, any dispute, claim, or controversy relating to the Agreement, and all the rights and obligations of the parties shall, in all respects, be interpreted, construed, enforced and governed by and under the laws of the State of South Carolina, except its choice of law rules. As used in this paragraph, the term "Agreement" means any transaction or agreement arising out of, relating to, or contemplated by the solicitation.

<u>CONTRACT AMENDMENTS, MODIFICATIONS & CHANGE ORDERS</u> Any change orders, alterations, amendments or other modifications hereunder shall not be effective unless reduced to writing and approved by the Procurement Officer responsible for this solicitation and the contractor. All questions, problems or changes arising after award of this contract shall be directed to the Procurement Officer responsible for this solicitation, Nan Johnson, Procurement Office, 120 East Smith Avenue, Darlington, South Carolina 29532.

<u>CONTRACT DOCUMENTS & ORDER OF PRECEDENCE</u>: (a) Any contract resulting from this solicitation shall consist of the 2223-06 CM at Risk for Project A - New Elementary School and CM at Risk for Project B – Other Capital Projects

following documents: (1) a Record of Negotiations, if any, executed by you and the Procurement Officer, (2) documentation regarding the clarification of an offer [Article 5, Section 1530. 8], if applicable, (3) the solicitation, as amended, (4) modifications, if any, to your offer, if accepted by the Procurement Officer, (5) your offer, (6) any statement reflecting the District's final acceptance (a/k/a "award"), and (7) purchase orders. These documents shall be read to be consistent and complimentary. Any conflict among these documents shall be resolved by giving priority to these documents in the order listed above. (b) The terms and conditions of documents (1) through (6) above shall apply notwithstanding any additional or different terms and conditions in either (i) a purchase order or other instrument submitted by the District or (ii) any invoice or other document submitted by Contractor. Except as otherwise allowed herein, the terms and conditions of all such documents shall be void and of no effect. (c) Any document signed or otherwise agreed to by persons other than the Procurement Officer shall be void and of no effect.

<u>EQUAL OPPORTUNITY</u>: Contractor is referred to and shall comply with all applicable provisions, if any, of Title 41, Part 60 of the Code of Federal Regulations, including but not limited to Sections 60-1.4, 60-4.2, 60-4.3, 60-250.5(a), and 60-741.5(a), which are hereby incorporated by reference.

<u>FORCE MAJURE</u>: The Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to perform the contract arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the contractor. Such causes may include, but are not restricted to acts of God or of the public enemy, acts of the Governments in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather; but in every case the failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the contractor. If the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor, and if such default arises out of causes beyond the control of both the contractor and subcontractor, and without the fault or negligence of either of them, the contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs for failure to perform, unless the supplies or services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the contractor to meet the required delivery schedule.

<u>ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION</u>: By signing your offer, you certify that you will comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14 of the South Carolina Code of Laws and agree to provide to the District upon request any documentation required to establish either: (a) that Title 8, Chapter 14 is inapplicable to you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors; or (b) that you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors are in compliance with Title 8, Chapter 14. Pursuant to Section 8-14-60, "A person who knowingly makes or files any false, fictitious, or fraudulent document, statement, or report pursuant to this chapter is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, must be fined within the discretion of the court or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both." You agree to include in any contracts with your subcontractors language requiring your subcontractors to (a) comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14, and (b) include in their contracts with the sub-subcontractors language requiring the sub-subcontractors to comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14. [07-7B097-1]

<u>INDEMNIFICATION</u> Darlington County School District, its officers, agents, and employees, shall be held harmless from liability from any claims, damages and actions of any nature arising from a resultant contract, provided that such liability is not attributable to negligence on the part of the using agency or failure of the using agency to comply with the offer as outlined in the offeror's proposal.

NON-INDEMNIFICATION: Any term or condition is void to the extent it requires the District to indemnify anyone.

<u>NOTICE</u>: (A) After award, any notices shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given (1) upon actual delivery, if delivery is by hand, (2) upon receipt by the transmitting party of automated confirmation or answer back from the recipient's device if delivery is by telex, telegram, facsimile, or electronic mail, or (3) upon deposit into the United States mail, if postage is prepaid, a return receipt is requested, and either registered or certified mail is used.

<u>OFFEROR RESPONSIBILITY</u> Each offeror shall fully acquaint himself with conditions relating to the scope and restrictions attending the execution of the work under the conditions of this proposal. It is expected that this will sometimes require on-site observation. The failure or omission of an offeror to acquaint himself with existing conditions shall in no way relieve him of any obligation with respect to this proposal or to the contract.

<u>OPEN TRADE REPRESENTATION</u> (JUN 2015): By submitting an offer, Offeror represents that Offeror is not currently engaged in the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with whom South Carolina can enjoy open trade, as defined in SC Code § 11-35-5300.

<u>OWNERSHIP OF MATERIAL</u> Ownership of all data, material and documentation originated and prepared for the District pursuant to this contract shall belong exclusively to the District.

<u>PAYMENT FOR GOODS & SERVICES</u> Payment for goods & services received by the District shall be processed in accordance with Darlington County School District Procurement Code.

<u>PRIME CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES</u> The contractor will be required to assume sole responsibility for the complete effort as required by this IFB/RFP. The District will consider the contractor to be the sole point of contact with regard to contractual matters.

<u>PURCHASE ORDERS</u>: Contractor shall not perform any work prior to the receipt of a purchase order from the District. The District shall order any supplies or services to be furnished under this contract by issuing a purchase order. Purchase orders may be used to elect any options available under this contract, e.g., quantity, item, delivery date, payment method, but are subject to all terms and conditions of this contract. Purchase orders may be electronic. No particular form is required.

SOUTH CAROLINA GOVERNING LAW CLAUSE The Agreement and any dispute, claim, or controversy relating to the Agreement shall, in all respects, be interpreted, construed, enforced and governed by and under the laws of the State of South Carolina. All disputes, claims, or controversies relating to the Agreement shall be resolved exclusively by the appropriate Chief Procurement Officer in accordance with the District Procurement Code, or in the absence of jurisdiction, only in the Court of Common Pleas for, or a federal court located in, Darlington County, State of South Carolina. Contractor agrees that any act by the District regarding the Agreement is not a waiver of either the District's sovereign immunity or the District's immunity under the Eleventh Amendment of the United State's Constitution. As used in this paragraph, the term "Agreement" means any transaction or agreement arising out of, relating to, or contemplated by the solicitation.

<u>SUBCONTRACTING</u> If any part of the work covered by this solicitation is to be subcontracted, the offeror shall identify the subcontracting organization and the contractual arrangements made therewith. All subcontractors must be approved by the District prior to award. The offeror will also furnish the corporate or company name and the names of the officers of any subcontractors engaged by the offeror.

<u>TERMINATION</u> Subject to the Provisions below, any contract resulting from this proposal may be terminated by the Director of Procurement, provided a thirty (30) days advance notice in writing is given to the contractor.

<u>Convenience</u>: In the event that this contract is terminated or canceled upon request and for the convenience of the District without the required thirty (30) days advance written notice, then the District shall negotiate reasonable termination costs, if applicable.

<u>Cause:</u> Termination by the District for cause, default or negligence on the part of the contractor shall be excluded from the foregoing provisions; termination costs, if any, shall not apply. The thirty (30) days advance notice requirement is waived and the default provision in the bid shall apply.

<u>Default</u>: In case of default, the District reserves the right to purchase any or all items/services in default in open market, charging the Contractor with any excessive costs. <u>SHOULD SUCH CHARGE BE ASSESSED, NO SUBSEQUENT</u> <u>PROPOSALS OF THE DEFAULTING CONTRACTOR WILL BE CONSIDERED UNTIL THE ASSESSED CHARGE HAS</u> <u>BEEN SATISFIED.</u>

<u>TERMINATION DUE TO UNAVAILABILITY OF FUNDS</u>: Payment and performance obligations for succeeding fiscal periods shall be subject to the availability and appropriation of funds thereof. When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal period, the contract shall be canceled. Contractor will not be reimbursed any costs beyond the initial contract term.

B. SPECIAL

<u>CLARIFICATION</u>: Pursuant to Article 5, Section 1530.6, the Procurement Officer may elect to communicate with you after opening for the purpose of clarifying either your offer or the requirements of the solicitation. Such communications may be conducted only with offerors who have submitted an offer which obviously conforms in all material aspects to the solicitation. Clarification of an offer must be documented in writing and included with the offer. Clarifications may not be used to revise an offer or the solicitation.

<u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>: During the term of the contract, contractor shall comply with all applicable provisions of laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations, and tariffs.

<u>CONTRACTOR'S LIABILITY INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>: The successful contractor must furnish within ten (10) days after written acceptance of bid a copy of his Worker's Compensation and/or General Liability insurance certificate to the District. Worker's Compensation coverage shall meet the requirements of South Carolina law. It is agreed that the coverage, as stated, shall not be cancelled or altered until ten (10) days after written notice of any change has been sent by registered mail to the Procurement Department. Darlington County School District shall be listed as Certificate Holder.

The insurance required by this paragraph shall be written for not less than the following limits of liability or as required by law, whichever coverage is greater:

Required Documentation: (a) Prior to commencement of the work, contractor shall provide to the District a signed, original certificate of liability insurance (ACORD 25). The certificate shall identify the types of insurance, state the limits of liability for each type of coverage, include a provision for 30-day notice prior to cancellation, name every applicable using governmental unit (as identified on the cover page) as a Certificate Holder, provide that the general aggregate limit applies per project, and provide that coverage is written on an occurrence basis. (b) Prior to commencement of the work, contractor shall provide to the District a written endorsement to the contractor's general liability insurance policy that (i) names Darlington County School District (as identified on the Cover Page) as an additional insured, (ii) provides that no material alteration, cancellation, non-renewal, or expiration of the coverage contained in such policy shall have effect unless the named governmental unit(s) has been given at least thirty (30) days prior written notice, and (iii) provides that the Contractor's liability insurance policy shall be primary, with any liability insurance of the District as secondary and noncontributory. (c) Both the certificate and the endorsement must be received directly from either the contractor's insurance agent or the insurance company. Contractor shall provide a minimum of thirty (30) days written notice to the District of any proposed reduction of coverage limits (on account of revised limits or claims paid under the General Aggregate) or any substitution of insurance carriers. The District's failure to demand either a certificate of insurance or written endorsement required by this paragraph is not a waiver of contractor's obligations to obtain the required insurance.

<u>CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL</u>: The Contractor shall enforce strict discipline and good order among the Contractor's employees and other persons carrying out the Contract. The Contractor shall not permit employment of unfit persons or persons not skilled in tasks assigned to them.

<u>CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION</u>: The contractor shall provide and pay for all materials, tools, equipment, labor and professional and non-professional services, and shall perform all other acts and supply all other things necessary, to fully and properly perform and complete the work. The contractor must act as the prime contractor and assume full responsibility for any subcontractor's performance. The contractor will be considered the sole point of contact with regard to all situations, including payment of all charges and the meeting of all other requirements.

<u>DAMAGES LIMITATION</u>: Contractor's maximum liability, if any, to the District for all direct, indirect, incidental, punitive, consequential, or special damages, including without limitation contract damages and damages for injuries to persons or property, whether arising from licensor's breach of this agreement, breach of warranty, negligence, strict liability, or other tort, or otherwise with respect to the supplies, services, or software provided under this agreement, shall in no event exceed an amount equal to the total contract price. In no event shall any party be liable to another for any indirect, incidental, punitive, consequential, or special damages, including, without limitation, lost revenues and profits, even if it has been advised of the possibility of such damages.

<u>DEFAULT</u>: The District may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the contractor, or if the contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the District, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the District shall not be liable to the contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the contractor shall be liable to the District for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the District improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

<u>LICENSES AND PERMITS</u>: During the term of the contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining, and maintaining in good standing, all licenses (including professional licenses, if any), permits, inspections and related fees for each or any such licenses,

permits and /or inspections required by the State, county, city or other government entity or unit to accomplish the work specified in this solicitation and the contract.

<u>OWNERSHIP OF DATA & MATERIALS</u>: All data, material and documentation prepared for the District pursuant to this contract shall belong exclusively to the District.

<u>RESPONSIBILITY DETERMINATIONS</u> Responsibility of the proposer shall be ascertained for each contract awarded by the District based upon full disclosure to the District concerning capacity and capability to meet the terms of the contract and based upon past record of performance for similar contracts. The unreasonable failure of a proposer or Offeror to supply information promptly in connection with an inquiry with respect to responsibility may be grounds for a determination of non-responsibility with respect to such proposer or Offeror. Failure to provide requested information may result in rejection of a solicitation response or debarment of the proposer.

TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE: The Procurement Officer may terminate this contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of the District. In such a termination, the Procurement Officer may require the contractor to transfer title and deliver to the District in the manner and to the extent directed by the Procurement Officer: (a) any completed supplies; and (b) such partially completed supplies and materials, parts, tools, dies, jigs, fixtures, plans, drawings, information, and contract rights (hereinafter called "manufacturing material") as the contractor has specifically produced or specially acquired for the performance of the terminated part of this contract. Upon such termination, the contractor shall (a) stop work to the extent specified, (b) terminate any subcontracts as they relate to the terminated work, and (c) be paid the following amounts without duplication, subject to the other terms of this contract: (i) contract prices for supplies or services accepted under the contract, (ii) costs incurred in performing the terminated portion of the work, and (iii) any other reasonable costs that the contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the State, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided. As a condition of payment, contractor shall submit within three months of the effective date of the termination a claim specifying the amounts due because of the termination. The absence of an appropriate termination for convenience clause in any subcontract shall not increase the obligation of the District beyond what it would have been had the subcontract contained such a clause.
