### SERVICES PROVIDED

- We provide Individual and Community Group Day Programs along with Independent and Supported Living Services. Our agency, A Better Life Together, Inc., was awarded a grant through the Department of Developmental Services to help link individuals and families to services provided by the San Diego Regional Center. We are currently in our second approved year and looking forward to a third year to continue this great work. The project is called The B.R.I.D.G.E. Project; B.R.I.D.G.E. stands for “Bridging Resources into Diverse Groups Everywhere.”
- Our team works as a collaborative partner of the San Diego Regional Center (SDRC) and we are contacting individuals and families to confirm that they are healthy and safe during this unprecedented time. Our team has made over 4,000 calls to reach those underserved. Our project also aims to find out if there are any needs we can identify and then direct families to available resources. Those resources could be from SDRC or out in the community. To date we have distributed over 80,000 pieces of PPE to the IDD community and throughout the county.
- Another goal of our project is to determine the reason or reasons an individual or family are not receiving services from SDRC at this time.
- Assist individuals and families with navigating the SDRC system.
- Join individuals on virtual meetings and/or phone calls with their Regional Center Service Coordinator. Signed Authorizations for Disclosure of Information are required for a B.R.I.D.G.E. team member to speak with SDRC about their case. We are able to provide these Authorizations electronically or in paper form to be completed and signed.
- Explain the SDRC Intake Process and the documents needed to facilitate the process.
- Present information about SDRC, the Regional Center system and the Lanterman Act to community partners and the public at no cost.

North County Transit District (NCTD) provides LIFT, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Paratransit Service, provides origin-to-destination public transportation to eligible customers whose disabilities prevent them from using fixed-route bus and rail for some or all trips. LIFT is provided by NCTD through its contractors, ADARide and MV Transportation (MV). ADARide is responsible for determining eligibility and certification, while MV is responsible for providing reservations, dispatching, and transportation. LIFT service is available during the same hours and days of operation including holidays as NCTD's BREEZE bus and SPRINTER rail system. LIFT is provided to areas that are within ¾ of a mile of an NCTD BREEZE bus route and/or SPRINTER rail station.	
ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS	
An individual is eligible to use LIFT if he/she has a disability and meets one of the following criteria:	
1. He/she is unable to board, ride, or disembark from an accessible vehicle without the assistance of another person (except for the operator of a lift or other boarding device).	
2. He/she is a person with a disability who can use accessible buses on routes that are not fully served by accessible buses, or when the bus stop is not accessible due to physical characteristics of the stop.	
3. He/she has a specific impairment-related condition that prevents him/her from traveling to or from a boarding and disembarking location.	
Under these criteria, NCTD has three categories of eligibility that are in compliance with 49 CFR 37.123(e): <b>Unconditional Eligibility:</b> Persons who are unable to use the fixed-route service under any circumstances due to his or her disability or medical condition. Included in this category is "[a]ny individual with a disability who is unable, as a result of a physical or mental impairment (including a vision impairment), and without the assistance of another individual (except the operator of a wheelchair lift or other boarding assistance device), to board, ride, or disembark from any vehicle on the system which is readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities." <b>Conditional Eligibility:</b> Person can be reasonably expected to make some trips on the fixed-route services. For example, a person may be able to reach bus stops that are no more than three blocks away, or a person may need paratransit service if there are paths of travel obstacles such as steep hills, deep snow, ice, or other obstacles. Another person may have a variable health condition; on some days, fixed-route use is possible and other days, it is not. Conditional Eligibility consists of a sub-category, trip-by-trip eligibility. Trip-by-Trip eligibility applies where the physical conditions at certain origins and/or destinations make use of the fixed-route system unreasonable. Eligibility is determined each time the eligible customer calls. Included in this category is "[a]ny individual with a disability who has a specific impairment-related condition which prevents such individual from traveling to a boarding location or from a disembarking location on such system." <b>Temporary Eligibility:</b> Temporary Eligibility: This category of eligibility applies to those persons with temporary medical conditions or disabilities, which may prevent them from using the fixed-route system for a limited period of time. <b>Eligibility is NOT based on:</b> Age, economic condition, or inability to drive an automobile; Having a medical condition or a disability will not automatically qualify applicants for ADA paratransit eligibility.

Enhanced ratio (2 staff for 3 adults), community- based adult training program for adults who have significant behavior challenges with some individuals of the receiving 1:1 supports on a case by case basis as approved by the Regional Center. Door to door transportation provided by the program within a 25- mile radius program base in Oceanside, CA. TERI CAL has a significant focus on providing novel experiences and assessing interest and engagement to add to, and better understand, the range of experiences/activities in which adults prefer to engage. This is directed at quality of life improvement. Activities include microenterprise development, social skills, vocational opportunities, community access and volunteerism for community improvement, leisure/fitness/recreational, ABA based behavior support services, and individualized goals. A small, center- based component (therapy focused—speech; OT; PT activities) is available for those who are not ready or interested in a full day within the community. Program hours are Monday-Friday from 9:00 am-3:00 pm.

#### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Adults must be referred by the Regional Center and have denials from 2-3 alternative behavior management adult day programs to qualify for services. They must also have a history of significant behavioral challenges that justify the need for an enhanced staffing ratio. Must be Regional Center eligible. Most adults attending CAL have severe intellectual disabilities and communication difficulties with a small number in the mild-moderate range. CAL is unable to provide services to individuals who cannot transfer from a wheelchair into a vehicle (lift-equipped vehicles are not available) or those who have significant medical support needs that would be difficult to meet in a community based setting.

#### PROCEDURE FOR ACCESSING SERVICES

Contact your Regional Center case manager. This individual will send out a referral packet to several traditional (1:3 staffing ratio) behavior management day programs to determine whether they would be able and willing to serve the adult. If 2-3 denials are received, then the adult may be eligible for placement at the TERI CAL program. The case manager will then send a referral to TERI CAL and the Director will meet with the adult and his/her family to determine whether the program can effectively meet their needs. There may be a wait for services depending upon whether an existing, appropriate group has an opening or a new group needs to be developed and staff hired/trained.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Individuals diagnosed with intellectual disabilities or developmental disabilities who are at least 18 years of age or older. The consumer must have a current medical and TB clearance. The individual must not be consistently harmful to self and others. He/She must not have a controlled medical/physical life threatening problems that require extensive or ongoing medical intervention.

Admission is contingent upon individual assessment, in that The Arc of San Diego services can be beneficial to the individual. The individual or representative must agree to conditions of program participation specified in the Participants Handbook and any additional requirements of funding sources. In addition, the individuals must either be a Regional Center consumer or have the ability to pay for services.

PROCEDURE FOR ACCESSING SERVICES

A person may refer her/himself to the Arc of San Diego or he/she may be referred by a personal representative, e.g., parent or service coordinator. Upon the request an intake packet is mailed to the prospective applicant or representative. Once the packet is returned a meeting and tour will be scheduled as soon as possible. This meeting will allow the applicant and /or representatives to meet the staff, tour the site and ask additional questions regarding the program.

Direct Placement Employment Services including intake, employment preparation, placement, retention, and short term support/job coaching .

**Intake:** This allows the opportunity for the Job Developer to learn more about the individual and discover their **individual goals, past experiences, and motivational factors**. If they have a resume, we review that too. If both the individual and the Job Developer feels that their goals are attainable, we move forward with signing all the the required intake forms.

**Employment Preparation:** We work through our **web-based application** to assign tasks and gain insight on goals, interests, etc. We created the “Time to Shine” Program to help guide us through finding the best fitting employment. Employment Prep is typically 5-8 hours of time dedicated to various tasks including **resume development, interview practice** and preparation, teaching **job skills**, discussing the importance of getting in front of employers, teaching the individual how to actively **job search** in the community rather than behind a computer screen, and narrow down what our job focus is going to be. By the end of employment preparation sessions, we should have a **motivated and confident job seeker**, ready to start applications with a fresh resume and strong interviewing skills. They build and practice their elevator pitch and are job seeking ready.

**Placement:** Placement services occur once a client has completed the Employment Preparation service and is ready to **start actively applying for jobs** in the community. We spend time every week **gathering leads** and applying for jobs both in person and online. At this point we have already created job seeking profiles, so we begin **completing applications** within the sites. Then we support the individual in **prepping for interviews**. Once they have received a job offer, we **assist them in paperwork and onboarding processes**.

**Short Term Support/Job Coaching:** Short Term Support aka Job Coaching is available for client’s that need **support in their new or existing positions**. This consists of a Job Developer spending a specific amount of hours with the client to help them with any job related tasks like paperwork, learning the job, training, communications with management, social related issues, etc. The idea of the short term support is providing the client with **hands on support on the job**, so they can retain the position more effectively.

16 years old and older.
