The above referenced claim has been reported to our office as a workers compensation claim.

Although you may have had the misfortune of being bitten or stung by an insect at work, the rare incident is a coincidental environmental condition in which your employer has no absolute control, and is not in direct connection to the assigned work being performed. It is this reason that we must respectfully deny benefits under your Workers' Compensation claim.

Denial of the claim is in accord with the holding the bite/sting risk is not directly related to business activities, and it is not greater than that to which the general public is exposed.

If warranted, further medical attention should be processed through your group health provider.
