

Cell Phones

Yes, you are allowed to have a cell phone on campus, but it must be "Off & Away!"

It must be turned completely **OFF** (Powered Down all the way, not just on Silent...)

& AWAY (inside a purse or backpack) at ALL times. (Any time you are inside the gates of Tevis Jr. High School)

If you have an emergency or need to talk to a parent you MUST use the SCHOOL PHONE! Use of cell phones for texting and/or cheating will result in disciplinary consequences and confiscation of the phone if we hear or see it outside of student's purses or backpacks, including the outline of a cell phone that is being kept in a pocket or Chromebook case.

Chromebook Expectations



\$350 - \$400 Replacement Cost

- ★ No food or drinks next to your Chromebook.
- ★ Carefully close. Earbuds and pencils cause screens to crack.
- Insert cords and cables carefully.
 Never transport with anything plugged in.
- \star Transport closed and in case.
- \star No writing, drawing or stickers.
- Must have all barcodes and original name tag on them at all times. No alterations.
- Must never be left on the yard/courts or any unsupervised area.



ALL STUDENTS MUST HAVE SHOTS COMPLETED, NO EXCEPTIONS! Get ASAP and Return to Tevis Office


