 Many of the Ivy Tech credits can be transferred to other colleges to meet requirements: For example – English 12/ACP Comp



- The transcript is typically the strongest part of the application – work hard on grades and take strong/appropriate courses
- Many college do a "wholistic review" consider other factors of student life

 - Work



- What inferences can I make about areas for improvement based on the types of questions I missed and skipped?


What Is AP Potential™?

AP Potential uses scores from the PSAT/NMSQT to provide predictions for 21 AP Exams.

College Board research shows that students who score a 3 or higher on an AP Exam typically experience greater academic success in college and are more likely to earn a college degree on time than non-AP students.

- Juniors consider attending the summer College Bootcamp/Workshop Work on applications, essay writing, financial aid, etc.
