A letter from the rector ...

A few months ago, we began discussing God's mission here at St. James and whether we are on the right path: do we need additional space for fellowship, meetings, and classrooms? Many of you have asked whether we are still talking and planning. The short answer is that we are beginning to resume the conversation after it was put on pause back in March, when my health issues came to light. Allow me to bring you up to speed:

In January and February, we conducted a feasibility study through Horizons Stewardship. As you may recall, surveys were shared to help us better understand the thoughts of the parish on the proposed \$15 million dollar revitalization and expansion project. At the March 16 vestry meeting, the vestry, school board, parish staff, and finance committee met with Kristine Miller from Horizons Stewardship to discuss her findings.

On the very positive side, the survey results indicated there is significant support for our parish leadership, the direction we are heading, and that most people feel a strong sense of connection to St. James. The majority of those who responded to the survey (76%) believe the proposed plans support God's mission for our parish. and that a majority (69%) would financially support an endeavor like the one we are discussing. However, most who responded (74%) feel that, while nearly everything we discussed is part of God's mission for us, the \$15 million goal is larger than we can currently afford. Nearly 100% of the survey results expressed a goal of around \$5.5-7 million is likely a more attainable goal. In the gospel of Luke, Jesus reminds us to plan for what we can afford. So this is where we currently are - reviewing the feedback from the fall so that we might better prioritize our "needs" versus our "wants".

Our next steps will be to revisit with WAV Architects to seek more affordable solutions, and to cultivate and solicit more leadership from the parish. This is an exciting time to be a part of our church community on the hill, with opportunities abounding for people looking to get involved- "the harvest is plentiful but the laborers few". We need your help. Since I'm talking about the survey, let me start a second section, because many of you wanted to know more about our school. How is it funded? What portion of the project is for "us" and what is for "them"? What are the long-range plans for the school? First, there is no "us" or "them". The school is a ministry of St. James Episcopal Church, no different than the Meal Ministry, Altar Guild, Outreach Committee, etc. Money collected by the school is church income; money paid by the school is church expense.

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The school itself was initially formed with two basic ministry goals: outreach and evangelism. Outreach is covered by offering high quality, well-rounded, Christian education to any child, regardless of what they can afford. This means that each year the school will break even, with the exception of money it sets aside for the scholarship fund. In 2022-2023, "we" awarded outreach funds in the amount of \$72,000 for scholarship assistance. The school is currently scheduled to award \$46,000 for scholarship assistance during the 2023-24 school year. That reduction has more to do with a lack of space than a lack of enrollment. With evangelism, our church school provides the love of Jesus Christ each and every day to children who might otherwise never see the inside of a church, including children from other denominations, faith backgrounds, and even atheists. God grants us an opportunity through the school to reach outside the walls of our church, and even bring new families into our midst.

The long range plan for our school (the only Episcopal school in Baldwin County) is to extend through 6th grade onsite here at St. James, with the hopes of finding an offsite location in the future to take the school through 12th grade.

I thank you for your continued prayers and thoughtful consideration of these plans for our parish as we consider our path forward and God's plans for our mission.

years, the life and martyrdom of Jonatha Murick Daniels has been remembered through an annual pilgrimage to Hayneville, Alabama, sponsored jointly by the Episcopal Dioceses of Alabama and the Central Gulf Coast. Jonathan Daniels was an Episcopal seminarian killed while working in the civil rights movement in 1965. He had come to Alabama in answer to Martin Luther Ring, Jr.'s appeal and pursued work sponsored by the Episcopal Society for Cultural and Racial Unity. He was one of a group of protesters arrested on August 14 and held in the Hayneville jail for six days. Upon his release, Daniels walked to a nearby store with a small group and was confronted by Tom Coleman, an auxiliary sheriff's deputy wielding a shotgun. When Coleman pointed the gun at 17-year-old Ruby Sales, Daniels pushed Sales out of the way and was killed instantly by the shot.

The procession will begin at 11 a.m. and travel from the square to the old County Jail where Daniels was detained after being arrested for pick hite-only businesses. The proces ill continue to the site of the old Varner's Cash Store, where Daniels was killed and will end in the Lowndes County Courthouse, where a Eucharist will be celebrated in the courtroom where Daniels' killer was tried and cquitted by an all-white jury.
