
District Continues Strategic Focus on Facility Improvements



New classroom furniture at Brooklyn School and High School are part of the district's ongoing initiative to enhance school facilities and infrastructure.

The Brooklyn City Schools are committed to providing students with a learning environment that is safe and gives them the best opportunities to succeed. Since March of 2020, the district has invested over \$2.1 million into the upgrade and maintenance of district facilities and infrastructure. These targeted capital expenditures, paid with both local and grant funds, are also an extension of the district's Strategic Plan which specifically seeks to continue to enhance school district infrastructure and operations through a continuous evaluation of district finances.

The district will continue to engage with a Master Facility Plan with AVG from which the district will be considering future renovation and refurbishment improvements to the campus and surrounding facilities. All future project considerations will align

with the district's Strategic Plan. By investing in district infrastructure and operations, the Brooklyn City Schools will positively impact current and future generations of students, and continue a legacy of Tradition, Pride, and Excellence.



District Financial Update

As a demonstration of the district's commitment to fiscal responsibility, the Brooklyn City Schools has achieved cost savings in several concrete ways. Office workflows have been adjusted to efficiently bring the Education Management Information System (EMIS) position into the district while grant funding has been reevaluated to optimize financial spending. Additionally, position vacancies have been evaluated for streamlining opportunities while still maintaining current district operations.

In May 2023, the Brooklyn City Schools released an updated Five-Year Forecast Financial Report. The primary purpose of the document is to engage the Board of Education and community in the long-range planning and discussions of financial issues facing the district. The current report shows that the district has a positive cash balance throughout the financial forecast. The Brooklyn Hurricanes featured several standout performances during the 2023 district, regional, and state track competitions. District Expands STEM and Career Exploration Opportunities



While working in the Innovation Center's makerspace, 4th graders learned the basics of coding and working with Finch robots. Students then applied their knowledge by creating their own Macy's Day parade route based on the biography, "Balloons on Broadway".

As part of a district-wide effort to provide students with the skills and knowledge necessary for success in today's workforce, the Brooklyn City Schools are proud to announce several ongoing and forthcoming initiatives. Introduced during the 2022-23 school year, the Innovation Center is located in the Brooklyn School Media Center and provides students in grades K-7 expanded opportunities to engage in creative, STEM-based learning experiences. The Innovation Center features a makerspace area that includes an exciting assortment of learning stations for students, including 3-D printers, a Cricut smart cutting machine, Mosaic 3-D art boards, and Snap Circuit Stations which allow students to build simple electronic circuits. Students also have access to Finch Robots which provide diverse learning activities based on the needs of students at all experience levels while encouraging inquiry, problem-solving, creativity, and critical thinking skills. The Innovation Center also includes an Animation Station where students can create and edit stop-motion videos, as well as a collection of household materials for hands-on building including pipe cleaners, yarn, clay, and various plastic gears and more!

The district is also preparing to launch two new initiatives for Middle School students at the start of the 2023-24 school year. The Career Explorations Program will provide students in grades 4-7 the opportunity to explore a variety of different career opportunities. As a result, students will have a clearer understanding of the educational and career paths they wish to pursue once they transition to High School. Through the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Launch class, students in grades 4-6 will utilize engineering based technology and increase the amount of exposure to important STEM-based skills.

Brooklyn Artists Recognized at State and Regional Exhibitions

Brooklyn Career Connections Academy Helps Students Develop Career Pathways



Class of 2023 members enrolled in the BCCA volunteered at the district's First Annual College and Career Resource Fair.

Launched at the beginning of 2023, the Brooklyn Career Connections Academy (BCCA) is designed to help qualifying seniors develop their post-secondary goals and achieve their career aspirations through real-world work experiences and academic development.

Supriya Culliton, Coordinator of Student Support Programs, oversees the career connections component of the program which provides work-based learning opportunities. *"The goal of this program is to help students develop their post-secondary plans and assist them in making those goals a reality. Students will be provided with opportunities to complete a 12-point credentialing, earn the Ohio Means Jobs Readiness Seal, and complete all graduation requirements. In addition, the district will partner with the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce and local agencies to connect students with real-life internship or shadowing experiences based on their career interests."*

The academic development component of the BCCA is overseen by Matthew Larson, Brooklyn High School Assistant Principal. To ensure that students possess a broad range of work skills necessary for success after graduation, students will complete the National Retail Federation's Rise Up program, and earn the Ohio Means Jobs Readiness Seal by demonstrating proficiency in fourteen specific professional skill sets. Students will also earn a 12-point credentialing in the basics of Customer Service.

"Every single one of our graduating seniors has goals for what they want to accomplish in their lives after high school," shared Mr. Larson. *"The BCCA is designed to assist our students in earning their diplomas and developing clear pathways to reaching post-secondary success. Our academy students will leave our program with a fully developed career portfolio, and the foundational knowledge needed to establish and grow their professional network through real work experiences."*

Class of 2023 members enrolled in the BCCA attended a career exploration fair on the Tri-C Metro Campus and volunteered at the district's First Annual College and Career Resource Fair. The BCCA reflects the district's commitment to providing academic options for all students through innovative programming that creates pathways to successful futures.



Arts and Innovation Academy Provides Expanded Gifted Education

As a district, the Brooklyn City Schools strives to ensure that students of all ability levels are provided a high-quality educational experience. Recognizing that academically and creatively talented students have unique learning needs and abilities, the district officially launched the Brooklyn Arts and Innovation Academy at the start of the 2022-2023 school year.

Through this new and ongoing instructional initiative, gifted students are provided educational services and support appropriate to their grade level. Gifted elementary students receive differentiated instruction designed to meet their individual learning needs and are also intentionally placed in classrooms with peers of all ability levels for differentiated instruction in the areas of math and language arts. To ensure students have appropriate academic rigor, opportunities for enrichment and talent development are made available, as well as grade and/or subject acceleration, and early entrance to kindergarten when appropriate.

Kathleen Mack, Gifted Intervention Specialist for grades 3-7, has witnessed firsthand the positive impact of the targeted focus on gifted learning. *"Under Dr. Caleris' leadership, the high-ability students have flourished. Through our innovative and challenging programming, I have watched our students grow and surpass even their own expectations. The Brooklyn Arts and Innovation Academy is twenty-first century learning*

at its finest. I am proud to be a part of a district that recognizes the need to differentiate for all of our students."

Brooklyn Middle and High School students have access to a wide offering of honors and Advanced Placement courses which provide increased rigor and exploration of the content area. College Credit Plus courses enable students to earn college credit while taking classes on our high school campus. Eligible students can also be promoted through grade and/or subject acceleration, as well as early graduation.

The Brooklyn Arts and Innovation Academy will also provide students expanded opportunities in the areas of performing arts, visual art, music, writing, and student-internships. For more information, please visit www.brooklyn.k12.oh.us.
