

SPANISH III

Spanish III furthers the study of grammar, vocabulary and cultures of Spanish-speaking countries. Students improve listening, speaking, reading and writing skills through literature, oral presentations and written exercises. The class emphasizes development of conversational and writing skills through reading and discussing short stories, plays and articles. Audio broadcasts and video projects are also used to stimulate listening and speaking skills. Projects may include preparing a commercial in Spanish and a Spanish talk show program.

Grade Level: 11, 12
Length: 1 Year
Period(s) Per Day: 1

Essential Understanding:

All students can learn and experience success in a world language. Second language acquisition provides the vision and skills necessary to be a global citizen. A primary goal of Spanish education is real-life communication. Spanish develops critical thinking skills. Assessment must reflect the goals and learning targets set forth in this curriculum document.

Theme Samples :

Key concepts and structures include:

1. nominalization of adjectives
2. use of past participles as adjectives
3. use and placement of demonstrative, possessive, reflexive and object pronouns
4. use of single and double object pronouns
5. contrast and use of *pero* vs. *sino*
6. conjunctions with subjunctive
7. contrast and use of *por* vs. *para*
8. use of imperfect vs. preterit
9. all command forms
10. future
11. passive voice
12. verbs like *gustar*
13. present, past and future perfect
14. present and past progressive
15. present and past subjunctive

Course Objectives and Expectations:

1. Students will use and understand:
 - a. All level I and II verbs;
 - b. Verbs in the present, present progressive, preterit, imperfect, perfect, future tenses;

- c. Verbs in the indicative, imperative and subjunctive moods; and
- d. The difference in use between indicative and subjunctive moods.
2. Students will use and understand various parts of speech and idiomatic expressions, including:
 - a. Formal and informal, affirmative and negative commands;
 - b. Comparative and superlative adjectives;
 - c. Expressions of time with *hacer*;
 - d. Position of pronouns with commands;
 - e. Multiple object pronouns;
 - f. Impersonal expressions; and
 - g. Relative pronouns.
3. Students will create and present:
 - a. dialogs;
 - b. commercial; and
 - c. A talk show.
4. Students will read and translate appropriate literature.
5. Students will write expository text.
6. Students will study and present information re Hispanic cultural activities.

Student Objectives :

1. I can comprehend information from a variety of texts and online sources.
2. I can discuss and analyze expressive products of the culture.
3. I can create representative products of the culture.
4. I can identify, explain and analyze the cultural significance of images and symbols.
5. I can compare and contrast the cultural perspectives as they relate to the social, economic, and political institutions.
6. I can converse about different cultural practices and perspectives in the target language.
7. I can write questions to obtain and clarify information.
8. I can express my opinion in writing on familiar or cultural topics.
9. I can write about present, past and future events.
10. I can write a series of paragraphs.
11. I can describe, narrate and explain my personal experiences about everyday events and topics of general interest, in paragraph form.
12. I can present reports and discuss topics in Spanish about information studied in other classes.
13. I can extract and assimilate information from authentic documents to use in research, to prepare reports.
14. I can identify geographical variations in Spanish.
15. I can identify cultural perspectives as reflected in the arts, literature, world issues, language and behavior.
16. I can discuss ways to use Spanish in my life.

17. I can participate in cultural events that may occur.
18. I can view/listen to a variety of media.
19. I can investigate cross-cultural experiences such as international exchanges and travel abroad.
20. I can plan a trip to a Spanish-speaking country.
21. I can use media from Spanish language and culture for entertainment and cultural understanding.
22. I can evaluate ethnic and linguistic differences.

13. Compare and contrast city life with rural life.
14. Describe the nature of Spanish-speaking countries.
15. Compare and contrast different types of governments in Spanish-speaking countries.
16. Identify and present information on historical figures and events.
17. Discuss historical and current events of Spanish-speaking countries.
18. Describe local travel.
19. Exchange and interpret information on modes of transportation.
20. Describe different types of lodging available in Spanish-speaking countries.
21. Exchange information pertaining to accommodations.
22. Understand exchange rates.
