






# High School - Strategic Goal = 93%

High School - Average Daily Attendance




ADA Year-to-Date: 89.51%

### PAC ACADEMY - Average Daily Attendance




ADA Year-to-Date: 91.36% PAC ADA - 87.62% (21-22 SY)

\*Highest ADA Year-to-Date: 93.62%



- Chronic Absenteeism Rates
  - $\circ$  **22-23 SY =** 30.2%
  - $\sim$  21-22 SY = 49.5% (6/30/22)
  - $\circ$  20-21 SY = 72.4% (6/30/21)
- Average Daily Attendance (ADA)
  - 22-23 SY = 91.51% (current)

### What is Charter Renewal?

• Every 5 years, charter schools must undergo an evaluation and site visit by the NJDOE. The purpose is to determine the degree to which the school is functioning well and leading to improved outcomes for the students it serves. There are 3 key areas that are monitored: Academics, Finance/Operations, & Governance.

### When it is happening?

• Our visit will take place next Tuesday, November 1st.

### What happens during the visit?

• After the charter school completes an application, the NJDOE looks closely at data, documents, budgetary information, and other related artifacts. During that time, they visit classrooms and interview a variety of stakeholders: students, teachers, board members, support staff, administrators, and parents. Following the visit, schools receive their renewal decisions and guidance on next steps to further improve the school.

We have been preparing diligently for the visit. We are excited to continually Reimagine the Village and provide our scholars with the high quality and well-rounded education that they deserve. We thank you for your partnership.


# **Excite Reading Program**

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
