<u>The MPTCS Crest</u> speaks to four core values that are designed to guide our young people and govern our work.</u>








Enrollment Trends Grades prek-12














High School - Strategic Goal = 93%






NJSLA Participation Rates Spring Administration 2022














NJSLA – ELA Spring Administration 2022












NJSLA – Math Spring Administration 2022






NAEP Scores COVID-19 & Learning Loss



Education Week Article Excerpt:

Nation's report card – the National Assessment of Educational Progress. Dismal but not unexpected findings included the first-ever drop in math scores (seven points) for nine-year-old students, along with the steepest drop (five points) in reading scores since the 1980s.

Translation: Two years of Covid-related shutdowns and interruptions erased 20 years of educational progress.



Digging Deeper Into the Stark Declines on NAEP: 5 Things to Know

Hechinger Report:

Recently, new national data confirmed what educators, parents, and other studies have warned about for months: The pandemic has massively disrupted students' learning.

Long-term trend data from the National Assessment of Educational Progress showed that 9-year-old students scored, on average, five points lower in reading and seven points lower in math in 2022 than did their pre-pandemic peers in 2020. The declines represent the largest drops in decades.



So What? Now What? Next Steps Moving Forward



- **Curriculum and Professional Development:** Adopted new curricular materials for mathematics (K-12), ELA (5-12), and science (K-8). The Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment (CIA) team developed and/or revised subject and grade-level specific curriculum guides that are aligned with New Jersey Student Learning Standards
 - Staffing decisions to support instruction (Added a K-8 STEM Supervisor)
 - Continue to provide support to teachers to increase knowledge with curriculum guides and vendor platforms
 - Maximize the use of Friday afternoon PD sessions, PLCs, and grade-level meetings to improve the quality of teaching and learning within the Village
- Data Driven Culture: Focus on establishing a data driven culture to reach all learners
 - Data from state testing, NWEA Map, and curriculum based assessments will be used to drive in class instructional decisions and groupings as well as after school and Saturday tutoring sessions
- Partnerships to Support the Lift It Takes a Village!
 - Engaging our families!
 - CIA Team will host an "Understanding Your Child's Test Scores" night
 - Family resources to support learning at home
 - Leveraging our partners to support the work
 - Partnerships with Children's Literacy Initiative (CLI) and National Urban Alliance to support instructional staff from a pedagogy and methodology standpoint
 - Teach for America Ignite Tutoring: Beginning October 2022
