# Teaching & Learning

## Principals' Academy for Leadership Success (PALS)

 The Principals, Asups, Directors, and I have a monthly meeting to focus on instruction and operational tasks to move The Village forward.



During our last meeting, we took an in-depth look at middle school mathematics instruction. The curriculum that we are currently using is Navigator from Achievement First. Navigator coaches conduct monthly site visits to provide professional development to our teachers and school leaders. Last week, we had the pleasure of viewing a recording of Ms. Rodriguez's 5th grade class from our STEAM Academy. The purpose was to norm expectations and discuss quality teaching and learning. We were pleased with what we saw and would like to thank Ms. Rodriguez for the work that she is doing! Continue to stretch and grow as a professional.



# Teaching & Learning - Quality Instruction

### Focusing on Instruction (Informal Observations):

- Instructional Rounds This week the central office team and I are starting campus site visits to see what is happening in classrooms on the ground level. This will also allow us the opportunity to set consistent norms and expectations for what good teaching and learning should look like across The Village.
- Observation Process (Formal Observations):
  - All staff members will be evaluated in accordance with the AchieveNJ Law
    We are using the Danielson Framework for all teachers
  - Teacher ratings will be based upon 85% teacher practice and 15% Student Growth Outcomes (SGOs) that were developed in teachers' Individual PD Plans.

# Instructional Technology



- Data Warehousing System Serves as a platform to store student achievement, attendance, climate and culture, and discipline data. The system provides the ability to analyze data trends for individual students, classes, and grade-levels.

- Supporting Pre-K Instruction
  - New Smart Media Interactive Tables Multi-touch interactive table for all of our Pre-K classrooms at PAC
  - Samsung Galaxy Tablets to support our implementation of Tools of the Mind and Teaching Strategies Gold
- Updated to a 10 GB internet across The Village This will better support our 1:1 chromebook initiative. To date, 85% of our updated chromebooks have been deployed to students.
- Brand new access points have been added at STEAM





## **Enrollment & Recruitment**

We are launching a new Enrollment and Recruitment Strategy Team (ERST) to ensure that we hit our enrollment projections. Starting today and beyond the team will meet weekly to monitor data trends and plan community events (e.g. visits, fairs, and open houses). Pending approval this evening, we are also onboarding a new Manager of Community Relations and Enrollment (Ms. Dana Murray) to support the work.

As a district we currently participate in the Newark Enrolls System

- Application window: November 13th to February 11th
- Match letters released on April 18th

#### Targeted Grade Levels include:

- Prek-3 45 seats
- Kindergarten 100 seats
- 9th Grade 150 students
- Bolstering enrollment in other grade-levels if are not at max capacity





## Charter Renewal

Although this is not our charter renewal year, it is a top priority for the district
and we do not take the process lightly. We are being proactive to ensure that
we meet and/or exceed all of our obligations, as outlined by the state. We are
in the process of launching an internal team to familiarize ourselves with the
process. Our task is to be self-reflective about our strengths and deficiencies,
as we develop a clear roadmap to guide our work moving forward.

## New Jersey Public Charter School Association:

- Hosting a webinar on October 5th from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm. The focus is on educating board members on the charter renewal process. The invite to register was shared via email previously. Several members of our team will be in attendance.
- They also shared documents of exemplars of successful charter renewals to support schools who are going through the process.



# Operations and Systems - Staffing

#### **Staffing Updates:**

- Great news! We have added a new Director of HR/Talent Acquisition and Compliance, Ms.
   Stacey Wilkerson. She is joining us from the Newark Public Schools!
- Although we still have vacancies, we have filled 62 positions to date.
- We have also made scheduling adjustments to minimize the number of substitute teachers that our children would have before them.
- We expanded our reach by posting in the Sunday Star-Ledger yesterday.

While aggressive, we still have much to do to fill our remaining vacancies. We are eager to fill them, but being patient to ensure that our children have quality staff before them. At this time, we are still in the process of securing the following:

#### Central Office:

- Director of Facilities
- Director of Mathematics
- HR Generalist

#### **Building-Based Positions:**

- Principal for the PAC Campus
- We are also struggling with hard to staff areas: nurses, middle school science, and elementary math.





## COVID-19 Updates






- To date, we have had 5 student cases and 0 staff cases across The Village. We are pleased to announce that we have been transparent and timely in our communication to families and staff (e.g. close contacts).
- Only 2 of the 3 campuses have been affected.
- We have been in very close contact with the Newark Department of Health to help guide us after each
  case. They are very thorough in their contact tracing and supportive to the school.
- To further minimize risks, we've made scheduling adaptations to reduce contact amongst grade levels.
- Vaccination Status of Staff:
  - In alignment with Governor Murphy's October 18th vaccination mandate, we have required all unvaccinated staff to receive weekly COVID-19 testing each Thursday at MPTCS the High School.




# COVID-19 Updates - Staff Vaccination Survey








# COVID-19 Updates - Staff Vaccination Status

## MPTCS Receives \$10,000 Grant

Marion P. Thomas Charter School has been selected to receive a 2021 Sustainable Jersey Grant funded by the PSE&G Foundation in amount of \$10,000.00. The funding will support our school's efforts, including:

- Replacement of the GREENHOUSE at the high school, which destroyed last year during a winter storm
- Maintenance and supplies for the Greenhouse and garden
- Implementation of the "Garden to Table" Initiative
- Involvement of our elementary school scholars (includes busing to the high school)

- The guidance team (Ms. Sawaged & Ms. Murray-Mitchell) scheduled several college events such as Information Sessions and Instant Decision Days, for our seniors to participate in. # Financial Literacy & Street Law

MPTCS Financial Literary Scholars will participate in the New Jersey City University Student Investment Management Club led by Professor Rick Mayell. Scholars will listen in on lectures with college students on topics such as stocks, bonds, trades, and steps to establishing generational wealth. This will occur virtually, one hour each week.

Street Law: Legal Life Skills Program sponsored by the Verizon Foundation. Scholars will participate during advisory class periods. Scholars will be partnered with Street Law assigned advisors. These advisors are all qualified through experience and education to speak on topics such as Rights & Responsibilities in the workplace, introduction to credit, banking basics, traffic stops, Introduction to Criminal Law, and Restorative Justice.
