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3rd PARTY PROVIDED ONLINE COURSES AND VIRTUAL SCHOOL PROGRAMS

3 The Alexandria City School Board (Board) may enter into contracts, consistent with the criteria approved by the Virginia Board of Education, with approved private or nonprofit organizations, 4 or other public school divisions, to provide multi-division online learning courses and virtual 5 6 learning programs. Such contracts shall be exempt from the Virginia Public Procurement Act.

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Information regarding Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) approved online and virtual 8 9 learning options provided by 3rd party organizations that are available through the school division will be posted on the division's website. The information will include the types of online and 10 virtual learning options available to students through the division, when the division will pay 11 course fees and other costs for nonresident students, and the granting of high school credit. 12

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Any student enrolled in any online learning course or virtual learning program offered by the 14 school division must be enrolled in a public school in Virginia as provided in Va. Code § 22.1-15 16 3.1. The student's parent or guardian shall give written permission prior to the enrollment of the

student in any full-time virtual learning program offered by the school division. 17

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19 A student enrolled in ACPS who resides in the City of Alexandria is not charged tuition for enrolling in any online course or virtual program offered by the school division. However, tuition 20 may be charged for summer school programs at the same rate as in-person course offerings.

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22 Teachers who deliver instruction to students through online learning courses or virtual learning programs must be licensed by the Virginia Board of Education and are subject to the requirements 23

24 of Policy GCDA: Effect of Criminal Conviction or Founded Complaint of Child Abuse or Neglect.

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The administrator of a virtual learning program must hold an advanced degree from a regionally-26 accredited institution of higher education with educational and work experience in administering 27

- 28 educational programs.
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Definitions 30

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32 For the purposes of this policy, the following definitions apply.

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"Multidivision online provider" means (i) a private or nonprofit organization that enters into a 34 35 contract with a local school board to provide online courses or programs through that school board to students who reside in Virginia both within and outside the geographical boundaries of that 36 school division; (ii) a private or nonprofit organization that enters into contracts with multiple local 37 school boards to provide online courses or programs to students in kindergarten through grade 12 38 through those school boards; or (iii) a local school board that provides online courses or programs 39 to students who reside in Virginia but outside the geographical boundaries of that school division. 40 However, "multidivision online provider" shall not include (a) a local school board's online 41 learning program in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside outside the 42 geographical boundaries of that school division; (b) multiple local school boards that establish 43 joint online courses or programs in which fewer than 10 percent of the students enrolled reside 44 outside the geographical boundaries of those school divisions; (c) local school boards that provide 45 online learning courses or programs for their students through an arrangement with a public or 46 private institution of higher education; or (d) local school boards providing online courses or 47

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48 programs through a private or nonprofit organization that has been approved as a multidivision49 online provider.

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51 Online Learning/Online course means a course or grade-level subject instruction that (i) is 52 delivered by ACPS staff or a multidivision online provider primarily electronically using the 53 Internet or other computer-based methods and (ii) is taught by a teacher primarily from a remote 54 location, with student access to the teacher given synchronously, asynchronously, or both.

Virtual Learning/virtual school program means a series of online courses with instructional content that (i) is delivered by ACPS staff or a multidivision online provider primarily electronically using the Internet or other computer-based methods; (ii) is taught by a teacher primarily from a remote location, with student access to the teacher given synchronously, asynchronously, or both; (iii) is delivered as full-time program; and (iv) has an online component with online lessons and tools for
