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THE VIRGINIA ASSESSMENT PROGRAM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the Virginia Board of Education's *Regulations Establishing Standards for Accrediting Public Schools in Virginia* (8VAC20-131-30, 8VAC20-131-110), the following policy has been established.

The Virginia Board of Education (VBOE) has established educational objectives known as the Standards of Learning (SOLs), which form the core of Virginia's educational program, and other education objectives, which together are designed to ensure the development of the skills that are necessary for success in school and in preparation for life in the years beyond.

The Alexandria City School Board (Board) has developed and implemented a program of instruction that is aligned to the Standards of Learning and that meets VBOE requirements of the Virginia Board of Education. It awards diplomas to all secondary school students, including students who transfer from nonpublic schools or from home instruction, who meet the requirements prescribed by the VBOE.

The Board awards diplomas and certificates in accordance with state laws and regulations. The requirements for a student to earn a diploma and graduate from high school are those in effect when the student enters ninth grade for the first time.

Children of Certain Federal Employees

In order to facilitate the on-time graduation of children of federal employees serving under orders pursuant to Title 22 or 50 of the United States Code enrolled in kindergarten through grade 12, the Superintendent or designee

- waives specific courses required for graduation if similar coursework has been satisfactorily completed in a local education agency in the state from which the child is sent, brought, or caused to be sent or brought or provides reasonable justification for denial of such waiver. If a waiver is not granted to a student who would qualify to graduate in the state from which the student is sent, brought, or caused to be sent or brought, the school division provides an alternative means of acquiring required coursework so that graduation may occur on time; and
- accepts, in lieu of testing requirements for graduation in Virginia, (i) exit or end-of-course exams required for graduation from the state from which the student is sent, brought, or caused to be sent or brought, (ii) national norm-referenced achievement tests, or (iii) alternative testing acceptable in Virginia.

The parent serving under orders pursuant to Title 22 or 50 of the United States Code must present documents indicating that the parent is required to move in order to perform the parent's job responsibilities and such move results in the student's relocation to the school division.

Virginia Assessment Program

The Virginia Board of Education requires the administration of Virginia Assessment Program tests in third through eighth grade. Each student is expected to take the applicable tests following instruction. Students who are accelerated take the test aligned with the highest grade level, following instruction in the content. No student takes more than one test in any content area in

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each year, except in the case of expedited retakes as provided for in 8 VAC 20-131-30. Schools will use the test results in third through eighth grade as part of a set of multiple criteria for determining the promotion or retention of students.

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A standard unit of credit for world languages may be awarded based on a waiver of the 140 clock hour requirement as provided in Policy IKFD.

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Upon demonstration of mastery of course content and objectives, the Superintendent or designee may recommend that qualified students may receive a standard unit(s) of credit and be permitted to sit for the relevant SOL Assessment to earn a verified credit(s) without having to meet the 140 clock hour requirement, in accordance with Policy IGBG.

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Any student identified as an English Learner (EL) shall participate in the Virginia Assessment Program. Additionally, students with disabilities shall be assessed in accordance with state and federal guidelines. Provisions regarding the participation level of EL students, and any necessary accommodations for students with disabilities are outlined in Regulation IKF-R.
