## LOCALLY-AWARDED VERIFIED CREDITS (LAVC)

## I. Generally

The Alexandria City School Board awards verified credits in English, mathematics, science, and history and social science in accordance with state law and Virginia Board of Education regulations and guidance.

Students who entered ninth grade for the first time before the 2018-2019 school year may be awarded up to three locally-awarded verified credits. Such students may only apply locally-awarded verified credits toward a standard diploma.

Students who entered ninth grade for the first time during or after the 2018-2019 school year may be awarded one locally-awarded verified credit. Such students may apply the locally-awarded verified credit toward either a standard or advanced studies diploma.

## Except for LAVC determinations made during the 2019-2020 school year under the COVID-19 public health emergency guidelines (Regulation IKFA-R), to be eligible to earn locally-awarded verified credits a student must:

- Pass the high school course but not pass the related Standards of Learning (SOL) test;
- Score within a 375-399 scale score range on any administration of the Standards of Learning (SOL) test after taking the test at least twice; and
- Demonstrate achievement in the academic content through the review process outlined below.

## 28 II. Review Process

As outlined in Regulation IKFA-R, the School Board appoints LAVC review panels through the Superintendent to consider evidence of a student's achievement of adequate knowledge of SOL content. Although different panels may be appointed for individual schools or groups of schools, each panel includes at least three educators. When an LAVC is being considered as a credit accommodation, the Executive Director of Specialized Instruction is included on the panel.

LAVC review panels have discretion in determining which information will be
considered. That information may include, but is not limited to, results of classroom
assignments, divisionwide exams, course grades and additional academic assignments
(e.g., papers, projects, essays or written questions) as deemed appropriate.

- Based on the evidence reviewed, review panels may:
- 4344 Award the verified credit;
  - Deny the verified credit;
  - Suggest participation in a remedial program and retesting; or

Make additional academic assignments prior to determining whether to award the verified credit. 48 49 The decision of the review panel is final. 50 51 Locally-Awarded Verified Credits (LAVC) as Credit Accommodations 52 III. 53 Students with disabilities who are eligible for credit accommodations shall not be subject 54 to the limit on the number of locally-awarded verified credits. 55 56 57 Students with disabilities who entered ninth grade for the first time before the 2018-2019 school year that require more than three LAVCs in any subject must have the eligibility 58 criteria for credit accommodations properly documented in the IEP or 504 Plan. 59 60 Students with disabilities who entered ninth grade for the first time during or after the 61 2018-2019 school year that require more than one LAVC must have the eligibility criteria 62 for credit accommodations properly documented in the IEP or 504 Plan. 63 64 To be eligible for such credit accommodations, students with disabilities must meet all 65 criteria established by state law and eligibility for such credit accommodations must be 66 established in the student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 plan. 67 68 The student must meet the following criteria to be eligible to receive credit 69 accommodations for the Standard Diploma: 70 71 The student must have a current IEP or 504 plan with standards-based goals; 72 • The student must have a disability that precludes him or her from achieving and 73 • progressing commensurate with grade-level expectations, but is learning on 74 grade-level content; 75 • The student needs significant instructional supports to access grade-level 76 77 Standards of Learning (SOL) content and to show progress; and 78 • Based on multiple objective measures of past performance, the student might not be expected to achieve the required standard and verified units of credit within the 79 standard time frame. 80 81 82 A. Special Permission Locally-Awarded Verified Credit Accommodation (SPLAVC-A) 83 Students with disabilities who have earned a scaled score below 375 on a Standards 84 of Learning (SOL) test and have met certain other eligibility requirements may also 85 earn a verified credit through the Virginia Department of Education's (VDOE's) 86 Special Permission Locally Awarded Verified Credit Accommodation (SPLAVC-A). 87 88 The Special Permission Locally Awarded Verified Credit Accommodation 89 (SPLAVC-A) allows ACPS to grant locally-awarded verified credits in reading, 90 91 writing, mathematics, science and history to certain students with disabilities. Eligible students must: 92
