What does the text say? Find a significant quotation from the story that is "on duty" – carrying an unusually heavy load for the author's central idea or interest. Copy the quotation in this column or section of your response. Cite the quotation by including the page number (or chapter if reading electronically without page numbers).	What does it mean? In this column or section, summarize the quotation so that it is clear that you understand what it means in the context of the story. Include a literary term if the quote demonstrates one of them.	Why does it matter? In this column or section, comment on why the quotation is important or significant to the reader's understanding of the central idea(s) of the story. Explain how the excerpt advances the author's complex understanding of the character(s). As you analyze, you should be reading and writing "above the line". If you feel like you are summarizing, stop. The "Matter" section should be the longest of the three sections and should demonstrate your ability to link technique and meaning.
