As the 2021-22 school year ends, we are finally back to “normal” post-COVID. Colonel traditions are even more meaningful: Crazies in the stands for a strong basketball march at the Sweet Sixteen; Days of Reflection; full community masses; a very successful spring for athletics, robotics, and Academic teams; and a vigorous all-school competition for the House System’s Colonel Cup.

Congratulations to Class of 2022, who grew immensely during what were maybe the most “unconventional” four years in CCH’s long history. In my fourteen years at CovCath, I have never been prouder of a senior class because of this group’s courage, integrity, and resilience.

Their noteworthy contributions to our continued status as the flagship school of the Diocese include:

- 7 senior students on historically successful Robotics teams, including 2 on the “Housecats” who established a legacy as winners of over 100 matches for the year, State Champions, U.S. Open Champions, and Runners-up at the VEX World Championships.

STRATEGIC PLAN

As Covington Catholic High School approaches its 100th anniversary in 2025, our legacy is established, our results are robust, and our reputation is strong. Alumni from across the decades have vivid memories of CovCath from “their” years, but most take great pride in seeing the positive changes represented in today’s school.

CovCath recently initiated a renewal of our strategic plan as a roadmap for the coming years. With help from consultant EK Education Partners, hundreds of stakeholders have been engaged over the last several months to provide input on our direction and focus areas. 93% of those who provided feedback from these sessions said they felt more engaged in CovCath’s vision because of the session and indicated with a rating of 4.3 on a 5-point scale

that the session was “productive.” The themes from this work will become the focus areas for action plan development over the coming months.

Across students, faculty/staff, current and future Colonel parents, alumni, and donors, “Brotherhood” was seen as our bedrock and foundation upon which we continue to build. It impacts the dreams of future Colonels, the experience of current students, the enduring bonds of alumni, and the emotional connection and commitment of families and other supporters. As such, our action plans will include a recommitment to the House System (which was challenged by COVID restrictions the past two years); an increase in strategic interactions and alignment with our district grade schools; and a further strengthening of alumni connections.

In addition, we will address themes of Connection, Commitment, and

Covenant. We will examine and enhance the communication tools and processes needed to optimally reach the broad range of stakeholders, (re-) commit to existing and new programs which are increasingly valuable to today’s student needs (such as the Academic Support, career awareness and preparedness, and more), and further solidify our long-term sustainability with improvements in organizational efficiency, budget flexibility at different enrollment levels, and overall endowment support.

Thank you to all who have contributed to this process so far. We will be gathering more perspective from stakeholders and benchmarks in the next few months to further inform action plan development by the early fall. Ultimately, once the new plan is enacted, we will update you on our progress as CovCath’s second century approaches.

The NCTE Achievement Awards in Writing is a school-based writing program established in 1957 to encourage high school students to write and to recognize some of the best student writers in the nation. Each student submitted two pieces of writing. Two independent judges scored two submissions per applicant on expression of ideas, language use, and unique perspective and voice. According to the website, Nick is the only recipient from the state of Kentucky in 2022, 2021, 2020, and 2019 (years previous to 2019 are not listed).

Seniors **Conner Gallus** and **Simon Schubert** used their art talents to create portraits of children from Nigeria as part of The Memory Project's Portrait Program: "Advanced art students create portrait gifts for children facing substantial challenges around the world. The portraits help the children feel valued, show them that many people care about their wellbeing, and provide them with a special childhood memory for the future. Since 2004, The Memory Project has coordinated the delivery of 300,000 portraits to children in 55 countries."

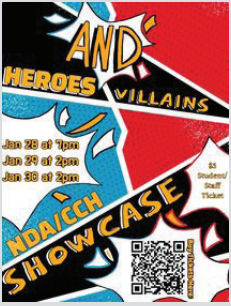

State results included: Quick Recall Team (**Finley, Turnpaugh, Strange, Heck, Worrall**) - 2nd place; **Jacob Finley** - 1st in language arts and 9th in math; and **Tyler Turnpaugh** - 3rd place in social studies.

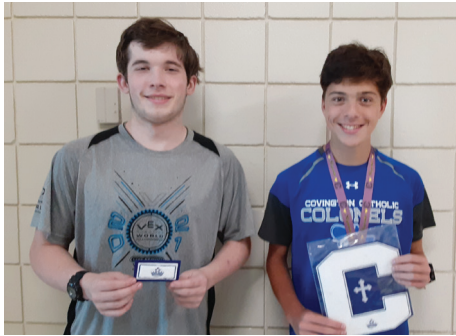
The Drama Program (NDA and CCH) presented the Winter Showcase as well as a very popular spring musical, *The Addams Family*.

The group held its third electronics recycling day over the past year, collectively resulting in over 4,100 pounds of electronic waste which will be remarketed or recycled to avoid hitting a landfill. CCH STEM PROGRAM

CCH STEM Program is PLTW Distinguished School for 5th Consecutive Year

For the fifth consecutive year, Covington Catholic High School has been recognized as a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished High School, one of only 191 PLTW High School programs nationwide and only 2 in Kentucky to receive this recognition for 2021-22. This award is based on performance standards including “exceptional student access, engagement, and achievement in the PLTW Engineering curriculum by developing the in-demand, real-world knowledge and skills necessary to thrive in life beyond the classroom.” CovCath is one of only 27 high schools nationwide to receive the recognition for the past five consecutive years.

CHAMBER CHOIR

Along with their role singing for All-School Liturgies and other faith-based initiatives throughout the Diocese, the Chamber Choir has a long tradition of professional-level studio recordings. 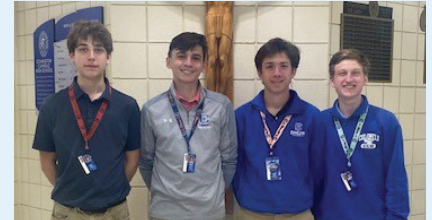

CCH ROBOTICS

Five Robotics teams from Covington Catholic High School qualified for the VEX Robotics World Tournament in Dallas, TX in May, 2022, based on their results at the Kentucky VEX Robotics State Tournament, including a first place finish by CovCath team “The Housecats”.

The Housecats’ win was the first robotics state title in CovCath history. With an alliance partner team from Martha Layne Collins High School, they beat the #16 and #22 teams in the world rankings in a best two-out-of-three match to win the state championship. In 2019, the new STEM building and program was dedicated to St. Joseph the Worker. CCH won its first state championship on the feast day of St. Joseph!

Soon after, the Housecats also won the Create Foundation U.S. Open Robotics Championship, held in Council Bluffs, Iowa and involving teams from 40 states and four countries, and ultimately won the 2nd place finish at the VEX World Championship Tournament (15,000 teams competed in VEX this season).

The landmark season included awards for the program’s leaders. CCH STEM Director **Mr. Bob Lind** was awarded “Teacher of the Year” at the U.S. Open. In addition, coach **Mr. Tom Rowe** was selected as the 2021-22 Kentucky Robotics Coach of the Year. Mr. Rowe has dedicated ten years to coaching in three different types of robotics at St. Mary’s in Alexandria and Covington Catholic.

FROM THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TONY BACIGALUPO

Dear Colonel Community,

Just as it was in the Fall semester, the theme of *RALLY!* Has been evident throughout the Winter and Spring. Continuing the momentum from the amazing State Soccer Runner-Up finish, our teams have achieved a high level of success.

Beginning with our first King of the Bluegrass championship, the Basketball team went on to win the district and regional titles. With the school's 14th trip to the KHSAA Sweet 16, the Colonels made it to the state semifinals, losing to Warren Central in a tough battle. Evan Ipsaro and Brady Hussey led the way, earning all-tournament team honors. Mitchell Rylee earned a roster spot for the KY-IN All-Star Game as well as a full scholarship to Miami (OH).

Our Wrestling team continued to grow under the direction of Joe Hunt and had the most successful season in school history. Willie Rodriguez, Joey Hunt and Kaleb Kiely all qualified for state with Kiely finishing 3rd. As a team, we finished 22nd in the state, our highest finish to date. The Swimming/Diving team had some excellent individual performances, with Jake Larkin finishing 3rd in the state for Diving and Nick Bonta winning the 100 Backstroke at regionals.

Moving on to the spring sports, we witnessed numerous successes. Our Lacrosse program, guided by alum Patrick Ciuccio, had an undefeated regular season, 22-1 record and a CLL State Runner-Up finish.

The Track program, with first year coach Jeremy Mosher, has had a fantastic year winning the Diocesan, NKAC and Regional Championships. While projected to finish 30 to 40 points behind Ryle at regionals, numerous Colonels had their personal bests and the team finished 1st by 10 points! At the state meet, freshman Will Sheets finished 4th in the 3200 while the 4x100 relay team finished 3rd.

The Tennis team won its 20th consecutive team regional championship, which established a new school record. Under the leadership of Coach Herts, Brady Hussey won singles while the team of Jackson Poulos and Alex Yeager won Doubles. Hussey and Poulos & Yeager all made it to the semifinals of the state tournament and were named to the All State team, with the Colonels finishing as State runner-ups overall.

The baseball team had a huge win in the district championship, defeating rival Beechwood 7-5 in extra innings on the last game on the natural infield. Our Bass Fishing team continued a strong showing at the state event with the boat of Sam Scroggins and Brandon Smith finishing 12th in the entire state.

In January, we hired a fantastic Strength and Conditioning Coach in Adam Atallah, who has already had a major impact with all students in a few short months in our Fieldhouse, which is being renovated.

In a year where there were less opportunities for high school seniors to get a roster spot or scholarship at the collegiate level due to the NCAA granting an extra COVID year, we are proud to say that ten seniors will be going on to participate at the next level.

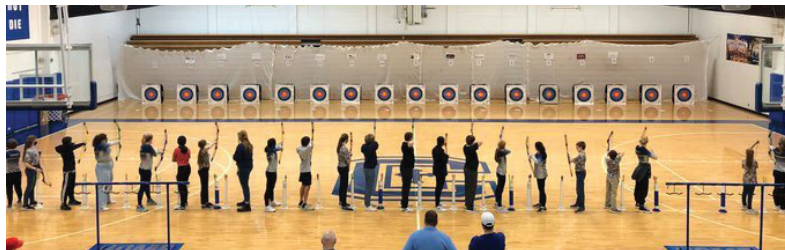

SPORTS RECAPS

Archery

In its 7th year as a varsity sport, 22 archers participated on the team this season. All members of the team showed growth and improvement throughout the season which will lead the way to successful 2022-2023 season. The team was led by overall MVP **Ben Daniels** whose average score was a 276.



The team once again hosted the CCH Christmas Classic on December 29th, 2021. Nearly 400 archers from Kentucky, Ohio and Indiana competed in the gym during the Christmas break tournament. The tournament was a success and will again be hosted again at CCH in December, 2022.

At the completion of the archery season, Coach Schneeman, who started the program 7 years ago, decided to step down as the archery coach.

Basketball

The Covington Catholic varsity basketball team finished the season 30-5 and claimed another 9th region championship defeating Dixie Heights 59-43 in the championship game. The Colonels became the sixth team in program history to advance to the KHSAA state semifinals, defeating Ashland Paul Blazer in the Sweet 16 and Lyon County in the quarterfinals, before falling to Warren Central in the semifinals. Senior **Mitchell Rylee**, Miami of Ohio commit, earned 9th Region Player of the Year honors and will participate in the Indiana-Kentucky All-Star Series. Junior **Evan Ipsaro** earned numerous first-team all-state honors, as well as Northern Kentucky High School Basketball Coaches Association Division 1 Player of the Year.



Since Coach Ruthsatz joined CCH in 2012, he has led the Colonels to six regional championships in the last nine years and four in the past five! He earned his 300th win as CCH Head Coach by beating North Laurel at BB&T Arena for the Dan Tieman Classic on February 11, 2022. He is serving as the head coach of the Kentucky team for this year's Indiana-Kentucky All-Star Series.



The JV basketball team ended the 2021-2022 season with a 19-4 record and as JV Regional Runner-up. The team finished the season strong, winning eight of its last nine games. Along with the varsity, the JV team faced a difficult travel schedule that took them throughout the state of Kentucky. The JV won games at Louisville Male, Ashland Paul Blazer and Oldham County. The team was led by guards **Braylon Miller** (Sophomore) and **Nolan Ruthsatz** (Freshman), forwards **Mason Edwards** (Sophomore) and **Eli Wagner** (Sophomore), and center **Seth Jones** (Sophomore). All five starters averaged between seven and nine points a game to provide balanced scoring. Post-season award winners were: Braylon Miller (MVP), Eli Wagner (Most Improved) and Mason Edwards (Knucks Hustle Award).



The freshman team finished their season 21-2, winning their first 14 games to start the season and the 16-team Holy Cross Christmas Tournament. Post-season award winners included: **Jake Stewart** (MVP), **Alex Yeager** (Most Improved), and **Ben McEvoy** (Knucks Hustle Award).

Bowling

With only three returning bowlers from last season (**Ryan Wagner, John Rolfson, and Freddie Caldwell**), there was a need for some new members to have a full team. Two freshmen joined the team (**Landon Walker and Will Melching**), and then a junior (**Michael Nerswick**) and four seniors took a chance to try/learn something new (**Jack Renaker, Max Stocker, Chris Meyer, and Ming Fai Wong-Burgess**).

This team of mostly new faces showed up with positive attitudes, improved, fought through injuries and sickness all while making a run late in the season. There just wasn't enough of the season left to end with a winning record. The end of season tournament for the 6th region found one Colonel seeded 5th (out of 39) only to finish 8th when he fell short in the head-to-head matches (**Ryan Wagner**). Looking forward to picking up next season where we left off this year.



Swimming & Diving

The Aqua colonels walked away from the 2021-2022 season with team gold at the Flying Turkey Invite and Lakota West Classic and bronze at the NKAC Conference Meet as well as the KHSAA Region 7 Championship. The team was led by regional standouts **Nick Bonta** (100 Back Region Champion) and **Luka Kampinga** (Top Five Region Finisher in 50 Free (3rd) & 100 Free (5th)). The team saw significant improvement in personal bests, with nearly 100% of the team achieving lifetime best in their respective events. The team, coaches, and alumni thank the 8 senior swimmers graduating that gave their time to the program. Congratulations to **Jake Larkin** on his 3rd place finish at the State Diving Meet!



Wrestling

CCH wrestlers had a great year and ended the season with a 22nd out of 80+ team finish at the state tournament. The team had 3 state qualifiers: **Kaleb Kiely, Willie Rodriguez, and Joey Hunt**. Kaleb Kiely capped the season off with a 3rd place finish at state (Heavyweight class), and Willie Rodriguez finished 7th at state (190 class).



Bass Fishing

The Colonels were represented by Freshman **Brandon Smith** and Sophomore **Sam Scroggins** at the KHSAA State tournament with a strong 12th place finish out of 90 total boats.

“With a Spirit that would not die” in boat #81 (captained by assistant coach Bill Smith), they weighed 3 fish for 9 pounds even on Day One which put them in 25th place. Sam caught the fourth largest bass of the entire tournament late that day with a largemouth bass weighing 4.4 pounds. They had a few fish get away but knew they had a chance on the second day to move up the leaderboard. On Day Two, the Colonels brought in a 5 fish limit for 10 pounds 4 ounces and the 12th place finish overall.

These young fishermen fished hard, made adjustments when needed, and did not give up over the 16 hours they fished over the two-day event. Most importantly, they learned what it takes to do well to improve upon this 12th place result in the next 2-3 years.



Baseball

The 2022 varsity baseball team had a much different look than last year with only one starter returning from the 2021 campaign. With a lot of new faces and several injuries, the team faced a lot of diversity early, but the team found its footing once the season progressed. With key wins against Dixie, Ryle, Male, and Henry Clay the Colonels gained some momentum during the latter half of the schedule. Seniors **Luke Lenhof**, **Colin Gastright**, and **Will Burke** have led the pitching ranks with **Jonathan Fitz**, **Max Lawrie**, and **Charlie Dieruf** igniting the



offense while freshmen **Jackson Reardon**, **Marcus Suwinski**, and **Alek Yuskewich** held down the infield defense. The team beat Beechwood in come back fashion 7-5 to claim the district championship.

The JV Colonels finished with a record of 15-9 and the freshmen team finished 11-8.

Lacrosse

The Lacrosse team was under the direction of first year head coach, Patrick Ciuccio (class of 2011). The team went 21-1 on the season. The team played Lexington Catholic in the State Championship on May 21st and fell in a hard-fought battle. The team ended the season as the State runner up and have a lot of momentum and confidence going in to the 2023 season. The offense was led by Seniors **Luke Stetter** and **Oliver Orwig**, and Juniors **Jack Harris** and **Mason Sweeney**. The Defense was led by Senior Goalie **Liam Waincott**, who notched his 400th career save this season, as well as seniors **Alex Muck** and **Max Stocker**. The Lacrosse program took big strides this year finishing with the best record in program history.



Tennis

The tennis team ended the regular season 11-3 with 9 matches rained/snowed out. In the KYHSTCA sectional tournament the Colonels beat Bourbon County, Lexington Catholic, and then Ryle in the finals, the fourth consecutive year as Sectional Tournament winners. In the regional tournament, the Colonels secured a 20th consecutive team title after **Brady Hussey** and **Nathan Warner** advanced in the quarterfinal round in singles while the doubles teams of **Jackson Poulos** and **Alex Yeager**, **Kalei Christensen** and **Daniel Kyntchev** also advanced in the quarterfinals. **Jonah Ikeda** and **Will Kreutzjans** were instrumental all season ensuring that their teammates remain prepared for each match. At the state meet, the team had a great showing to finish as the State runner-up. Assistant coaches **Jared Haught** ('16), **Austin Hussey** ('15), and **Kevin Schutte** ('17) have done a phenomenal job guiding the program this year.



Track and Field

After an outstanding performance at the Princeton Invitational, taking a very close 4th behind Cincinnati-area powerhouses Princeton, St. X and LaSalle, the Colonels captured the Diocese of Covington Championship by a ten-point margin, turning back a strong challenge from a St. Henry team headlined by two of the top athletes in Northern Kentucky. After a spring-break overnight to Louisville for the prestigious Eastern Relays, CovCath won the NKAC big school title with an upset of the regional-title favorites Ryle. The conference championship showcased the well-rounded nature of this CovCath team, as the Colonels took 3rd place or better in 11 of the 14 events.



Within that team, individual excellence has come from senior **Reid Hummel**, running his way into #3 performer in school history in the 100m, as well as senior **Kevin Krebs**, who became the #9 Colonel ever to win the pole vault at the Fern Creek Relays. Newcomers to the team senior **Seth Gruner** and freshman **Will Sheets** played starring roles as well. In just a few months, Gruner has become one of the Top Ten 110-meter hurdlers in AAA -- and school history. The most notable headline came from the Wayne Invitational, where Sheets made history with a school record in the 3200m; his 9:24.04 smashed the previous record by more than 22 seconds.

The Colonels won the Regional title. At the State meet, Will Sheets finished 4th in the 3200 while the 4x100 relay team finished 3rd.

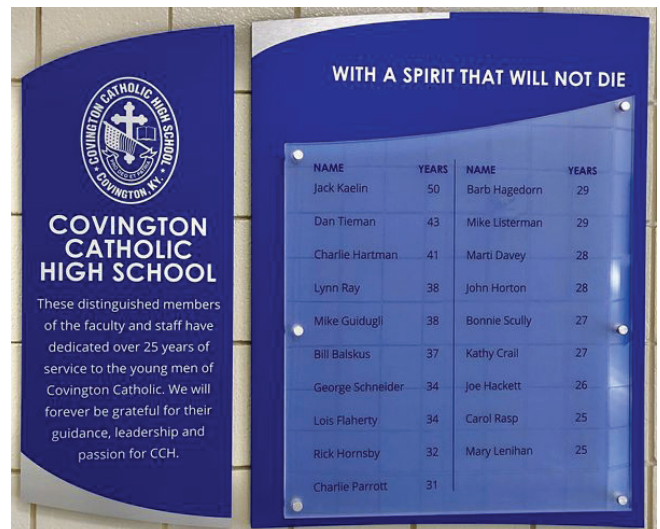

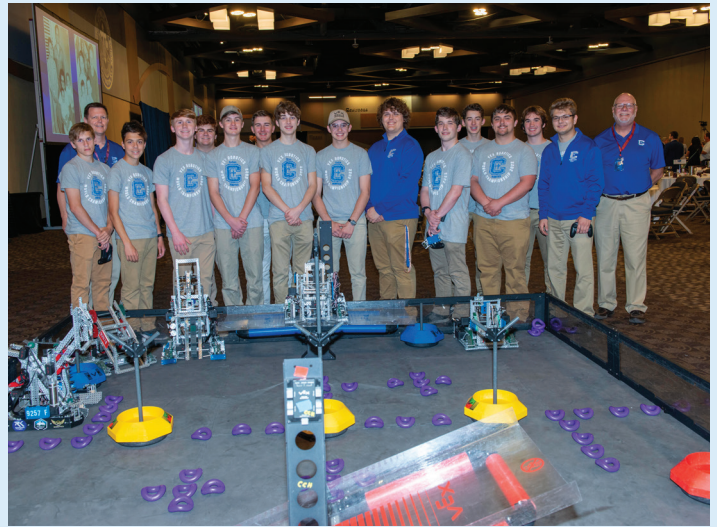
2022 NORTHERN KENTUCKIAN OF THE YEAR

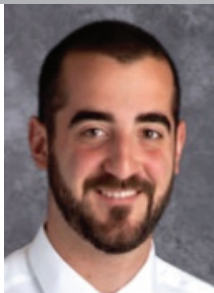

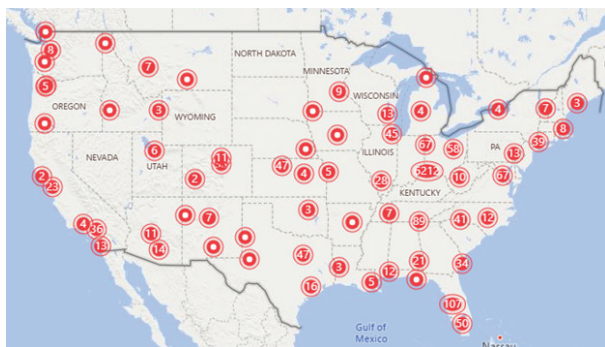
CCH Alumni, Families, and Friends,
