FROM THE PRINCIPAL

LIVING OUR MISSION

Every day at Covington Catholic, administration, students, faculty and staff live the mission of CCH; to embrace the Gospel message of Jesus Christ and educate young men spiritually, academically, socially and physically. Students graduate Covington Catholic as well-rounded young men having participated in a myriad of service opportunities, clubs, athletics and strong academic programs unavailable anywhere else in Northern Kentucky. Below are just a few of the accomplishments from the last six months that exemplify how we live out our mission.

Educating Spiritually:

- 3,920 service hours have been completed at a variety of agencies across the community since the start of the school year.
- Weekly Mass is offered on Friday's before school and has become a packed house with nearly 100 students, faculty and staff.
- The Marian Sodality Club has grown in participation this year with 80-100 students attending. Freshmen are led by juniors who give witness to their faith followed by group discussions.
- Sports and Adoration events, led by Fr. Hennigen and Ashley Marshall, have grown in attendance and average 70 students from CCH, NDA, St. Henry, Villa, homeschools and more.

Educating Academically:

- Three students have been recognized as National Merit Semi-finalists and an additional 3 as National Merit Commended students.
- The Robotics team, who took first in State and Nationals and came in 2nd in worlds in 2022, was recognized by the Chamber of Commerce for bringing positive attention to the region.
- We hired TorchPrep for a full day of ACT prep for our juniors and brought in Ms. Tewes who taught a week-long "Study Skills Boot Camp" for all freshmen and sophomores as well as exam prep to freshmen.
- Plans are underway to introduce a new Academic Success program in the 23/24 school year to reach all students at all levels providing additional resources and tools to be successful.

Educating Socially:

- The Boosters hosted our first "Freshman Night" for students and families to get to know each other while attending a football/soccer home double header.
- Students from Spain lived with CCH families and attended CCH for four weeks sharing their culture and experiencing ours.
- Students have participated in a variety of events through the House System including the food drive, House Games, praying the Rosary together, mentor sessions, ultimate frisbee, desk ping pong and more.

Educating Physically:

- There were exciting seasons from all of our teams with personal and team achievements across the board. See "Athletics" for team updates.
- Freshman PE classes have been taking advantage of the new Fieldhouse and complete workouts each week facilitated by Strength and Conditioning Coach Atallah.

In closing, we began an extensive self-study in preparation for our accreditation in the spring of 2023. We are proud of our Catholic identity and the academic and campus enhancements we have made over the past few years. We also realize that there are areas in which we can always grow, and this will help us advance in other ways as we continue to enhance the CCH experience. My pride in CovCath comes from working with our wonderful team of teachers, coaches, and staff all of whom are living our mission of building men of faith and character.

CCH FIELDHOUSE

PURPOSE

In August of 2022, Covington Catholic held the dedication of the newly renovated fieldhouse adjacent to the Gardens of Park Hills. This facility houses over 11,000 square feet of strength training equipment, weight room, technology integration and nearly 45 yards of turf. "Every detail was well thought out," says full-time strength and conditioning coach, Adam Atallah. "The vision was to create a space, safe from inclement weather, equipped for all sports and to be used by the entire student body." Freshman PE classes train once a week with Coach Attallah, learning how to use the equipment and the importance of exercise. All athletic teams also train with Coach Attallah who designs specific programs for each sport and coordinates schedules. Additionally, our youth football teams and summer camps have utilized this new space and equipment.


DESIGN

Upon entering the facility, visitors are in awe with their first glimpse at the state-of-the-art equipment and massive indoor turf. And while that first glimpse is impressive, it does not tell the whole story. Nothing was overlooked. When you see the 45-yard turfed field, you might not realize that outdoor turf was used so that regular cleats can be worn, and athletes do not need a second pair of shoes. From the turf to the safety railing to the technology, the Colonel athletes have the resources needed to train at the next level.



THANKFUL TO MANY

Completing this facility would not have been possible without the help of many. CCH alum, Chuck McHale '84, approached Principal Rowe in 2018 about purchasing the facility. Once the facility was in hand, CCH staff and supporters went to work to obtain the funds for the renovation. Our Advancement department led by Mrs. Tara Leen, researched and applied for funding from the Cincinnati Bengals. "We were ecstatic to receive the donation of \$167,000 knowing our goal was now attainable," said Principal Rowe. Additional funding came in from several generous private donors to help complete the project. Athletic Director, Tony Bacigalupo, led the project and our own staff worked to remove large 20ft mirrors, paint walls and level floors. For Day 1 of winter conditioning, our football team moved the weight training equipment from the Schott Center to the fieldhouse. Many CCH alumni contractors supported the renovation efforts. This was truly a team effort to make this dream a reality.


1971


