Title I, Part A: Improving Basic Programming

The district uses these funds to support the academic growth for all students in the areas of reading, literacy, and math.

Support personnel are funded through this program. Specifically, Reading Remediation, Early Reading Intervention, Math Remediation.

Students are identified to participate in the programs through locally collected data for reading and math assessments as well as teacher recommendations and parent referrals.

McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Also covered under Title I, Part A is assistance offered to students who are experiencing homelessness.

Funding is set aside to support students so that they can access all of RCS' programs, activities and services that is provided to resident students.

Title II, Part A: Supporting Effective Instruction

The program is designed to advance the excellence in teaching and learning to promote educational opportunities and success for all students.

Romulus employs teacher leaders to professionally support teachers in ongoing improvement of their practice so that they can improve the quality and effectiveness of their teaching.

RCS will use a PLC model to engage teachers in increasing student achievement by studying local data, identifying areas for improvement and actively planning for improvement.

RCS also offers mentoring to teachers who are in need of support after their first year of teaching.

Title IV, Part A: Student Support and Academic Achievement

This grant provides supplemental funding to help provide students with a well-rounded education, improve school conditions and improve the use of technology.

RCS focuses its efforts on using this funding to provide character education programming, activities for student safety and wellness, and activities and materials that support a well-rounded education.
