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Manufacturing Pathway Leads to Career Readiness

Preparing for success after graduation looks different for each student. While some students enroll in Advanced Placement and College in the Schools courses, others are taking classes at local colleges and universities through the state's Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program. Students enrolled in these opportunities get a head start to college by earning college credits before they even graduate from high school.

Preparing students for college is not the only route to meet their career goals. Responding to the need to develop highly-skilled people in the trades coupled with student interest in learning manufacturing skills, Centennial High School is helping students jump start a career through its Manufacturing Pathways program.

The need and demand for workers in the area of career and technical education is high, especially in manufacturing. Many positions in the field are going unfilled locally for welders, press brake operators, CNC machinists, and other related jobs in manufacturing.

Through the Manufacturing
Pathways program, the school
teaches students the skills the
industry is looking for and gives
them opportunities to explore
career paths and options in the
industry. The program includes
courses in: General Metals, Metals
Technology, Advanced Metal
Technology, and Cougar
Manufacturing. Classes complement

other Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) courses currently offered at the high school. Since 2014, Centennial High School has offered courses through Project Lead The Way, a leading, national STEM program that includes course offerings such as Introduction to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Civil Engineering and Architecture, and Computer Integrated Manufacturing, The expansion of manufacturing courses will help students prepare for a successful future.

We cannot do this work alone. The connections with our local manufacturing partners and consultants-Steve Kalina, Minnesota Precision Manufacturing Association; Jon Trost, advisor, St. Francis High School ("Saints Manufacturing" students at St. Francis High School designed and fabricated welding shields for Centennial); Mark Ellers, MC MetalFab Inc., Lino Lakes; and Josh Kissick (Centennial alum), G & K Machining, East Bethelcoupled with donors in our community are paving the way to preparing students for careers in the trades. Support from donors and partnerships with local industries who also serve as mentors to our students is helping launch upgrades in the school's manufacturing facilities, purchase state-of-the-art equipment, and provide real-world experience

and skill development for future employment.

Modifications to the school's current facilities are underway during the summer break. The work includes the removal of walls to open up the space and sightlines, ceiling and floor upgrades, adding an exterior garage door for the delivery of supplies, ventilation upgrades, and a computer area expansion. This phase also includes the

purchase of new welding equipment, a sheet metal shear, and a press brake which was purchased through the support of generous donors at the spring Centennial Area Education Foundation gala. Next year, additional equipment will be added to round out the students' experience: manual and CNC mills, ironworker, pedestal bench grinder, and a vertical bandsaw.

Together we are helping prepare students for a successful future.

RICE LAKE TURNS 30!



IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

Minnesota Statute 121A.15 requires children enrolled in childcare, early childhood education, or school to be immunized against certain diseases, unless the child is medically or non-medically exempt.

If proper documentation is not provided, students will be unable to attend school after November 1st, 2023. What you need to do:

- Contact your health care provider and review your child's immunization status to make sure they are up to date.
- If you missed a required vaccination, make an appointment with a healthcare provider or local clinic as soon as possible.

- Follow up with your student's school if they have reached out to you regarding your student's immunization status.
- Turn in medical (must be signed by a health care provider) and non-medical (must be notarized) exemption forms to your child's school if they are exempt from immunizations.






