June 8, 2023

The Bulloch County Board of Education met in a Regular Session Meeting on Thursday, June 8, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. in the boardroom at the Central Office. Board members present were as follows: Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook, Maurice Hill and Superintendent Charles Wilson.

Chairman Womack led the Moment of Silence and Pledge of Allegiance.

After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Elizabeth Williams and Glennera Martin, the agenda was approved as presented. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

Following Board Member comments, there was no public participation. During the Superintendents Report Superintendent Wilson informed the Board of a correction to the 2023-2024 School Calendar in the weather make up days from April 8 and 9, 2024 to April 1 and 2, 2024. The 8th and 9th are school/work days. Assistant Superintendent of School Improvement Teresa Phillips Director of School Improvement Chad Prosser presented information and requested Board assistance in making adjustments to the Student Code of Conduct. After the suggested revisions are made the Code of Conduct will be brought back to the Board for approval in July.

After review and recommendation by the superintendent, upon motion by Maurice Hill, and second by Donna Clifton, the Board unanimously approved the Consent Agenda that consisted of the following: Board Minutes: May 9, 2023 Called Special Session, May 11, 2023 Regular Session, May 22, 2023 Special Called Session, and the May 23, 2023 Special Called Session; Surplus – Maintenance Equipment and Vehicles Lot #765; Board Member Payroll for May 2023 and the Financial Report for April 2023. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the superintendent, upon motion by Glennera Martin, and second by Jay Cook, the Board unanimously approved the FY24 Budget. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill).

After review and recommendation by the superintendent, upon motion by Stuart Tedders, and second by Jay Cook, the Board unanimously approved the revisions to Policy DIB – Financial Reports. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the superintendent, upon motion by Donna Clifton, and second by Maurice Hill, the Board unanimously approved the revision to the 2024-2025 School Calendar. The previously approved calendar incorrectly had employees working 191 days

instead of 190 days and likewise students attending school for 178 days instead of 177 days. The adjustment will be made to dates in January 2025. Employees will now be returning to work on January 3, 2025 instead of January 2, 2025 and students will return on January 7, 2025 instead of January 6, 2025. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the superintendent, upon motion by Heather Mims, and second by Glennera Martin, the Board unanimously approved Arey Jones as the vendor for Chromebook purchases for a period of 1 year to continue through June 30, 2024 for 1125 HP 14” G7 Chromebooks during the 2023-2024 school year to replace units that have reached their end-of-life support with Google this year and need to be replaced. These units are included in the FY24 requested budget for a cost of \$254.42 per device and an anticipated cost for this project to be \$286,222.50. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review, discussion and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Donna Clifton, and second by Jay Cook, the Board unanimously approved the Southeast Bulloch High School Advanced Chorus trip. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Glennera Martin, and second by Liz Williams, the Board unanimously approved the purchase of Nine (9) air-conditioned International model, Diesel, 77 passenger regular education buses at a cost of \$140,000 per bus for a total cost of \$1,260,000 from Rush Bus Centers utilizing ESPLOST IV funds. Also, approved was the purchase of two (2) air-conditioned Thomas model, Diesel, 54 passenger special needs buses at a cost of \$135,915 per bus for a total of \$271,813 from Peach State Bus Center, utilizing ESPLOST IV funds. After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Glenn Womack, and second by Liz Williams, the Board unanimously approved SAVVAS as the mathematics textbook provider for grades K-5 \$699,869.10, and grades 6-8 \$300,056.40, for the total amount of \$999,925.50. This is a six-year textbook adoption. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Heather Mims, and second by Maurice Hill, the Board unanimously approved the contract with Literacy Matters Consulting to deliver guided reading professional learning in the amount of \$166,500. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Liz Williams, and second by Glenn Womack, the Board unanimously approved to purchase the renewal for iReady reading and math software in the amount of \$361,611.00 for K-8th grade from Curriculum Associates. This is for the diagnostic assessments, instruction, teacher toolbox, and professional

learning. (8:0 Yes – Glenn Womack, Elizabeth Williams, Dr. Stuart Tedders, Donna Clifton, Glennera Martin, Heather Mims, Jay Cook and Maurice Hill)

After review and recommendation by the Superintendent, upon motion by Donna Clifton, and second by Maurice Hill, the Board unanimously approved the renewal of the existing Edgenuity software in the amount of \$147,136.44. This price includes site licenses for all of the district's middle schools, high schools, the Transitions Learning Center, Cedarwood, and the BCS non-traditional high school program (LIFE). The software also provides a solution for credit recovery for students enrolled at the district's high schools, the TLC, the LIFE program and the Graduation Performance Academy (GPA). This quote also included Virtual Tutors, an individualized support designed for high school EOC courses, and Plagiarism Checker for all middle and high schools. The quote also included a pilot at Langston Chapel Middle School for small group tutoring during the school day. Build a new SEBHS for 2,500 students, expandable to 3,000 students for future contingency, including career







RE: May 2023 Financial Reports

Highlights for the General Fund revenues and expenditures are as follows:

- Tax Collections – It appears that we will collect approximately 3% more than projected for tax collections at year end.
- Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) – These revenues continue to be better than expected. We should collect at least \$1.7M more than budgeted.
- State QBE revenues increased due to the \$3.46M FY 23 midterm allotment increase.
- General Fund Expenditures – As of April 30, 2023, we have completed 91.67% of the fiscal year and our year-to-date expenditures reflect 98.6% of total budgeted expenditures. Due to the mid-year raises, actual expenditures will exceed budgeted expenditures.

RE: FY24 Student Code of Conduct

We are requesting approval of the FY24 Student Code of Conduct, which is included with this memo.

The proposed FY24 Student Code of Conduct includes the changes that were presented at the June 8, 2023 board meeting. During that meeting, board members expressed a desire to make two additional changes.

1. It was determined that "Mandatory Report to Law Enforcement" should be added back for any offenses for which a report to law enforcement is required by the state.
2. Board members requested an update to the wording for the consequences for elementary bullying (3rd offense) to remove the reference to being assigned to another alternative education program, if available.

Original wording: The third offense of bullying in a school year, at a minimum, shall result in the student being assigned to an alternative school or another alternative education program, if available.

Updated wording: The third documented offense of bullying in a school year, at a minimum, shall result in the student being assigned to an alternative school or served educationally through alternative means.

We consulted with the board's legal counsel for the proposed change, and were able to confirm there are no issues with the updated wording since the only requirement is that "age-appropriate" discipline is imposed for elementary students.

Both of these requested changes have been included in the proposed FY24 Student Code of Conduct. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Proposed Student Code of Conduct - FY24

General Expectations

The purpose of the Code of Conduct is to communicate established student behavioral expectations. Students are expected to behave in a way that facilitates an effective, safe, and positive learning environment. Expected behavior is behavior that promotes learning and encourages personal responsibility during the school day as well as during all school-related activities. Included in the Code of Conduct are disciplinary policies, description of infractions, and consequences for failure to adhere to school rules. Pursuant to Georgia law, student codes of conduct/discipline policies shall identify consequences to address specific misbehavior as specified by law (O.C.G.A. 20-2-751.5).

The rules in the Code of Conduct are designed to notify students (grades K-12) as to the types of behaviors that are not acceptable. Nevertheless, every specific variation of the prohibited Code of Conduct may not have been included. Consequently, students should expect to be disciplined for misconduct that is obviously inappropriate. A specific violation need not be written for every conceivable variation of behavior that directly affects the orderly mission of the school. Students, their parents, and school personnel need to know and understand our expectations:

- A. Students are expected to participate fully in the learning process.
- B. Students are expected to avoid behavior that impairs their own or other students' educational achievement.
- C. Students are expected to show respect for the knowledge and authority of teachers, administrators, and other school employees.
- D. Students are expected to recognize and respect the rights of other students and adults.
- E. Students are encouraged to seek the help of school officials to resolve conflicts with other students.
- F. Parents/Guardians are expected to inform their children of the consequences, including potential criminal penalties, of underage sexual conduct, bullying, cyberbullying and crimes for which a minor can be tried as an adult.

Parents/Guardians, teachers, and school administrators are expected to work together to improve and enhance student behavior and be actively involved in the behavior support processes designed to promote positive choices and behavior. Parents/Guardians and students should contact the principal of the school if specific questions arise related to the Code of Conduct.

Students who repeatedly disrupt the learning environment will be subject to disciplinary consequences. Parents/Guardians, teachers and administrators are to work cohesively to encourage parent involvement in the learning process. A parent conference may be requested as necessary. Parents/Guardians will be required to engage in the problem solving process for students who fail to adhere to established standards of acceptable behavior (O.C.G.A. 20-2-765).

The Code of Conduct is in effect during the following times and in the following places:

- A. At school or on school property at any time.
- B. Off school grounds at any school activity, function or event and while traveling to and from such events.
- C. On vehicles provided for student transportation by the school system and while waiting for and leaving such vehicles under observation of school personnel.
- D. Students may be disciplined for conduct off campus that is felonious or which may pose a threat to the school's learning environment or the safety of students and employees.
- E. If a student is transitioning between schools or school districts, the consequences will follow the student to the next school location (O.C.G.A. 20-2-751.2).

Required Public School System Reports to Outside Agencies Concerning Student Acts

Any school employee who has reasonable cause to believe that a student has committed a criminal act on school property or at a school function, has a duty to make a report of that act, in order that law enforcement can be notified. Any student who commits any of the following acts on school property or at a school function will be reported to law enforcement, in accordance with federal and state laws:

- A. Certain battery offenses
- B. Certain sexual offenses
- C. Carrying certain weapons at school functions, on school property, or within school safety zones
- D. Possession, use, sale, transfer of marijuana, illegal drugs and controlled substances
- E. Other violations may be reported to law enforcement based on acts that concern the safety and well being of students and staff members, to include terroristic threats.

Bulloch County Schools reserves the right to contact law enforcement concerning any offense that jeopardizes the safety, health, and/or welfare of students and staff. In addition, terroristic threats will be reported.

Threat/Intimidation/Terroristic Threat

Any threat(s) to do harm to one or more persons or property of, in, or in any way related to any school or school system is/are prohibited. A prohibited threat or intimidation may take the form of, without limitation, one or more statements made verbally, in writing, or through any electronic means; one or more gestures; or general demeanor. A prohibited threat or intimidation may be directed toward, without limitation, any administrator(s), teacher(s), paraprofessional(s), staff member(s), school bus driver(s) or drivers' helper(s), student(s), students' parent(s) or guardian(s), or attendee(s) at any school-sponsored event(s). Examples of prohibited threats or intimidation include, without limitation, (1) placing one or more persons in fear of bodily harm; (2) threatening to subject physical, personal, or real property to harm or damage; (3) making a bomb threat or some other threat of attack; (4) pulling or activating, without authorization, one or more fire alarm(s) or security system(s); or (5) threatening, stating, or expressing an interest in using or discharging a firearm in, at, near, around, or toward, or otherwise "shooting" or "shooting up," any person(s), school(s), or school property or premises. It shall not be a defense to a charge of Threat/Intimidation that (1) the individual charged did not intend to carry out or engage in the threatened conduct; (2) any person(s) threatened did not experience or undergo an actual, subjective fear of harm; or (3) the individual charged did not have the present or immediately-accessible means to carry out or engage in the threatened conduct.

Questioning and Apprehension by Law Enforcement on School Premises

- A. Georgia Law authorizes law enforcement personnel to come onto school campuses for the purposes of both interviewing and arresting students.
- B. School system officials cannot impede law enforcement personnel in their investigative efforts.
- C. Under Georgia Law, juveniles that are charged with a crime do not have a right to have their parents present when being questioned by law enforcement personnel.
- D. Law enforcement officials will be asked to sign a *Student Release Into Custody* form prior to removing a student from the school premises.

Student Search and Seizure Policy

The Board authorizes reasonable searches of students directed to that end by authorized school officials. Searches based on reasonable suspicion may proceed without hindrance or delay, but they shall be conducted in a manner which ensures that students are not arbitrarily stripped of personal privacy. The principal of each school, or his/her authorized representative, possesses the authority to conduct inspection of a student's locker, automobile, person, or other possessions based on a reasonable suspicion of the presence of unauthorized items. The term "unauthorized" is intended to mean any item that is dangerous to the health or safety of students or school personnel, or disruptive of any lawful function, mission or process of the school, or any item described as unauthorized in school rules available beforehand to the student. Metal detectors and drug sniffing/ weapon sniffing canines may be used to search students and their personal property to detect possession of unauthorized items before, during, or after the school day on school property, school transportation, and at school related activities. A student's failure to permit searches will be considered grounds for disciplinary action.

Student cars brought on campus, student book bags and other containers, pocketbooks/purses, school lockers, desks and other school property, including school buses, shall be subject to inspection and search by school authorities at all times without further notice to students or parents. Such searches may be conducted using search dogs or hand-held metal detectors.

In the event that a specific student is reported or suspected of having weapons, drugs, or other materials in violation of school rules, school district policy or state law, his/her person may be searched. Full random searches will be conducted by school officials and/or law enforcement.

Seizure of Illegal Materials: If a properly conducted search yields illegal or contraband materials, such findings shall be turned over to proper authorities for ultimate disposition.

Corporal Punishment

All area, county, and independent boards of education shall be authorized to determine and adopt policies and regulations relating to the use of corporal punishment by school principals and teachers employed by such boards (O.C.G.A. 20-2- 730).

In-School Suspension (ISS)

- A. Temporary removal of a student from his or her regular classroom.
- B. In-school suspension is a short-term alternative to out-of-school suspension.
- C. Students will not be counted absent.
- D. Students will be assigned work from their classes.
- E. Students will not receive zeroes unless they fail to make up work missed in their classes.
- F. Students have the responsibility to complete missed make up work, consistent with the provisions outlined earlier in this handbook.
- G. Students may not participate in or attend any school-sponsored or extracurricular activities during the school day when the student is assigned in-school suspension.
- H. Students may participate in activities which occur entirely outside of the official school day when the student is assigned in-school suspension.

Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)

Out-of-school suspension is an exclusion from all school facilities and activities. It is used as a disciplinary action to deter inappropriate student behavior. This includes the violation of school rules, policies, and procedures.

- A. If an offense occurs, the principal/designee will investigate the circumstances surrounding the offense.
- B. Before being suspended, a student has a right to a conference with the principal or his designee where the following takes place: (1) the charges against the student are explained to him/her; (2) if the student denies his guilt, the evidence against the student is outlined for him/her; and (3) the student is given the opportunity to tell his/her side of the story.
- C. Parents/guardians will be notified of the consequence. Every reasonable effort shall be made to notify parents when a student is suspended.
- D. The days of suspension shall be specified by the principal/designee and such days shall begin as soon as reasonably prudent.
- E. Make-up work and/or alternative assignments will be permitted.
- F. A student who has been assigned to out-of-school suspension for any disciplinary reasons shall not be present on any school property for any reason, at any time during the term of the suspension except to attend student disciplinary hearings.
- G. A student who has been assigned to out-of-school suspension shall not participate in or attend any school sponsored, extra-curricular activities (on or off campus), including field trips, beginning with the specific time the OSS is assigned (which may not be the time suspension actually begins) until the beginning of the calendar day following the last day of OSS suspension.
- H. Out-of-School Suspension-Short Term is suspension for 10 days or less (O.C.G.A. 20-2-751).
- I. Out of School Suspension-Long Term is a suspension for more than 10 school days but not beyond the current school quarter or semester (O.C.G.A. 20-2-751). Long term suspension is an alternative that may be imposed by the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel when determining punishment for a disciplinary infraction, which resulted in the student being brought to a disciplinary hearing.

Expulsion

Expulsion is the removal of a student, by the school district, from Bulloch County Schools for a period longer than the remainder of the current semester.

- A. If a recommendation for expulsion is submitted to the Board of Education, written charges for the expulsion recommendation shall be provided to the student and his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) along with the expulsion proceedings information.
- B. The Board of Education may refer any disciplinary action to the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel, which shall conduct a hearing of the matter consistent with the Board policy. The issues to be determined at the hearing shall be whether or not the student is guilty of the alleged violation of student regulations and, if so, what appropriate punishment shall be imposed.
- C. In determining the appropriate punishment to impose upon the student, the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel shall review the specific circumstances of the incident that gave rise to the hearing and the student's disciplinary record.
- D. The maximum punishment that may be imposed is permanent expulsion from the school and from the Bulloch County School System.
- E. Students who are expelled, with or without the opportunity to attend Transitions Learning Center, shall not participate in school activities, on or off campus.

Student Disciplinary Hearing

Pursuant to the provisions of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Section 20-2-753 et. Seq., (Ga. Laws 1984 VI, p. 908), the Bulloch County Board of Education shall appoint a student disciplinary hearing officer or panel to hold disciplinary hearings.

- A. Students who are accused of certain disciplinary infractions may be required to appear at a hearing before a student disciplinary hearing officer/panel.
- B. An alleged violation of the student code of conduct where the recommendation is suspension or expulsion of longer than ten school days will result in a hearing before the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel.
- C. The hearing officer/panel will listen to the evidence, determine if the student is guilty of the violation of the student disciplinary rules, and will determine appropriate punishment to impose taking into consideration the circumstances of the offenses and the student's disciplinary record.
- D. The student disciplinary hearing officer/panel will determine whether or not a student will be allowed to apply to the alternative school program, the Transitions Learning Center (TLC). The student disciplinary hearing officer will base their determination upon the nature of the offense committed and the student's prior discipline record.
- E. Any decision of the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel may be appealed to the Board of Education by filing a written notice of appeal within 20 days from the date the decision is rendered.

Alternative School Program

The Transitions Learning Center (TLC) addresses the general educational needs of students in grades 6-12 who have been referred to an alternative educational setting.

- A. The TLC is a program that is technology driven, individualized, and competency based.
- B. Students and parents/guardians must complete an interview as part of the intake process. All parties must agree to the structured terms of the enrollment agreement.
- C. While a student attends TLC, they may not participate in school activities, on or off campus.
- D. Graduating seniors who attend the Transitions Learning Center will be allowed to participate with their zoned high school's graduation exercises.

Physical Violence Resulting in Substantial Injury to Faculty & Staff

- A. As used in this section of the Code of Conduct, the term "physical violence" means (1) intentionally making physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with the person of another; or (2) intentionally making physical contact which causes physical harm to another unless such physical contacts or physical harms were in defense of himself or herself, as provided in O.C.G.A. § 16-3-21.
- B. This section of the Code of Conduct provides for the penalties to be assessed against a student found by a disciplinary hearing officer pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 20-2-752 to have committed any act of physical violence against a teacher, school bus driver, or other school official or employee. Such disciplinary hearing officer/panel shall hold any disciplinary hearing in accordance with the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 20-2-754.
 - 1. Any student alleged to have committed an act of physical violence shall be suspended pending the hearing by the disciplinary hearing officer/panel.
 - 2. The decision of the disciplinary hearing officer/panel may be appealed to the school board pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 20-2-754.
 - 3. If appropriate under section (c)(1), the decision of the disciplinary hearing officer/panel shall include a recommendation as to whether a student may return to public school and, if return is recommended, a recommended time for the student's return to public school.
 - 4. The school board may impose penalties not recommended by the disciplinary hearing officer/panel.

5. A student found by a disciplinary hearing officer/panel to have committed an act of physical violence, as defined in section (a), against a teacher, school bus driver, school official, or school employee shall be expelled from the public school system. The expulsion shall be for the remainder of the student's eligibility to attend public school pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 20-2-150. The school board at its discretion may permit the student to attend an alternative education program for the period of the student's expulsion.
6. If the student who commits an act of physical violence is in kindergarten through grade eight, then the school board at its discretion and on the recommendation of the disciplinary hearing officer/panel may permit such a student to re-enroll in the regular public school program for grades nine through twelve.
7. The school board at its discretion may permit a student in kindergarten through grade six, who has committed an act of physical violence, as defined in section (a), above, to re enroll in the public school system.
8. Any student found by a disciplinary hearing officer/panel to have committed an act of physical violence against a teacher, school bus driver, school official, or school employee, as defined in section (a), above, shall be referred to juvenile court with a request for a petition alleging delinquent behavior.

Discipline for Special Education Students

The behavior of special education students shall be governed by the guidelines for conduct that are applicable to any other student. Any disciplinary action taken as a result of a special education student's violation of the student conduct regulations, however, must be in accordance with state law, federal law and local practice/procedure and must be determined by the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) or Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP).

Nothing in this section of the Code of Conduct shall be construed to infringe on any right provided to students with Individualized Education Programs pursuant to the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. § 794, or the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq.

Violations of the Student Code of Conduct

Each classroom teacher has the authority to manage disruptions by imposing in-class disciplinary actions. Teachers will make a personal telephone call to the parent/guardian when feasible, and/or by scheduling conferences with the Parent/Guardian and other school staff. When the action taken by the teacher or other staff is ineffective, or the student's behavior substantially disrupts the class, the student will be referred to the principal or his/her designee (O.C.G.A. 20-2- 738).

In accordance with state law and State Board of Education Rule 160-4-8-15, progressive disciplinary measures will be used in assessing and addressing student behavioral needs. Failure to bring supplies, books, and/ or required materials and equipment to class is not cause for disciplinary referrals. Parents and guardians of students who consistently exhibit poor work habits or are not prepared for instruction should be notified by the teacher. Defiance of a teacher in regard to these areas may be cause for a disciplinary referral.

Violations of the Student Code of Conduct are grouped into three levels. Before determining the classification of a violation, the principal or his/her designee will consult with the involved student(s) and school personnel. Once the classification of the violation is determined by the principal or his/her designee in his/her discretion, the disciplinary procedures will be implemented.

ELEMENTARY CONSEQUENCES

A. Level 1 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. **First Offense** - In-school conference and parent contact when warranted; correction and/or replacement of defaced/damaged school property; other appropriate consequences.
 - a. Some offenses may warrant disciplinary action, such as detention, time-out, bus suspension, in-school suspension, or out of school suspension.
2. **Subsequent Offenses** - In-school disciplinary action such as detention, time-out, bus suspension, in-school suspension, or out of school suspension.

B. Level 2 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. **First Offense and Subsequent Offenses** - Extended time-out, detention, bus suspension, in-school suspension, or out of school suspension.

C. Level 3 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. The disciplinary actions for these offenses will be in-school suspension and/or out of school suspension and/or recommendation for long-term suspension or expulsion and/or suspension from bus transportation for up to the remainder of the semester or year for bus related offenses.
2. The third documented offense of bullying in a school year, at a minimum, shall result in the student being assigned to an alternative school or served educationally through alternative means.
3. The principal shall suspend the student whose expulsion is recommended during the interim between the time the recommendation is made and the date of the disciplinary hearing, but such interim suspension shall not be for a period exceeding ten (10) days.
 - a. At the hearing, the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel will determine whether or not a violation of the policy has occurred and whether or not the student should be expelled or some other appropriate punishment be imposed.
 - b. If, after the hearing, the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel determines not to expel the student or impose some other punishment, which includes the interim suspension, the interim suspension shall be considered void. The student shall be shown as present and the days absent will not show on the record. The student will be allowed to make up all work missed.

- c. If the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel finds a student guilty of a drug or alcohol offense, the student and his/her parent or legal guardian must satisfactorily complete a substance abuse program approved by the Bulloch County Board of Education and must submit written documentation of the completion or of continuing satisfactory involvement in said program to the principal of his/her school.

MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL CONSEQUENCES

A. Level 1 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. **First Offense** - In-school conference and parent/guardian contacted when warranted, correction and/or replacement of defaced/damaged property; other appropriate consequences.
 - a. Some offenses may warrant disciplinary action such as detention, time-out, bus suspension, in-school suspension, out of school suspension, or long term suspension/expulsion for possession of alcohol or multiple acts of physical aggression.
2. **Subsequent Offenses** - In-school disciplinary action such as detention, time-out, bus suspension, in-school suspension, or out of school suspension, or long term suspension/expulsion for possession of alcohol or multiple acts of physical aggression.

B. Level 2 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. **First Offense and Subsequent Offenses** - In-school suspension, bus suspension, and/or out of school suspension. Some offenses may warrant long term suspension/expulsion.

C. Level 3 Offenses: Disciplinary Actions

1. The disciplinary actions for certain offenses will be out of school suspension and/or recommendation for expulsion as authorized in the procedures previously stated and/or suspension from bus transportation for up to the remainder of the semester or year for bus related offenses.
2. The third documented offense of bullying in a school year, at a minimum, shall result in the student being assigned to an alternative school or other alternative education program.
3. The principal shall suspend the student whose expulsion is recommended during the interim between the time the recommendation is made and the date of the disciplinary hearing, but such interim suspension shall not be for a period exceeding ten (10) days unless a continuation is granted.
 - a. At the hearing, the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel will determine whether or not a violation of the policy has occurred and whether or not the student should be expelled or some other appropriate punishment be imposed.
 - b. If, after the hearing, the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel determines not to expel the student or impose some other punishment, which includes the interim suspension, the interim suspension shall be considered void. The student shall be shown as present and the days absent will not show on the record. The student will be allowed to make up all work missed.
- c. If the student disciplinary hearing officer/panel finds a student guilty of a drug or alcohol offense, the student and his/her parent or legal guardian must satisfactorily complete a substance abuse program approved by the Bulloch County Board of Education and must submit written documentation of the completion or of continuing satisfactory involvement in said program to the principal of his/her school.

WEAPONS, DANGEROUS INSTRUMENTS, FIREWORKS OR EXPLOSIVE COMPOUNDS

Federal and state laws require one calendar year of expulsion for the possession of a firearm, dangerous weapon or hazardous object on a school campus, at a school function, or within any school safety zone.

- A. No person shall possess, handle, carry, or have under his control any weapon or explosive compounds to include fireworks of any kind.
 1. The term “weapon” means and includes the following: any pistol, revolver, or any weapon designed or intended to propel a missile of any kind; or any Dirk, Bowie knife, switchblade knife, ballistic knife, or any other knife having a blade of two or more inches; razor blades, straight edge razors, spring sticks, metal knucks, blackjack; or any flailing instrument consisting of two or more rigid parts connected in a way to allow them to swing freely, which may be known as a nunchucks, nunchaku, shuriken or fighting chain, throwing star or oriental dart; explosive compound; bat, club, or other bludgeon-type weapon or articles (baseball bats, hockey sticks, or other sports equipment if possessed by competitors for legitimate athletic purposes are not included if they are in possession of a student at a time and place which is appropriate or related to the use of these items for athletic purposes by a student) or any weapon of like kind.
 2. The law requires that a violation of this code of conduct be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency and notification of the district attorney.
- B. Possession shall be strictly defined as having a substance or object on one’s person including, but not limited to, holding a substance or object in one’s hand for any length of time, including even a few seconds. Possession shall also mean having a substance or object under one’s control, for example, in one’s pocket, book bag, purse, auto, locker, etc.

DISCIPLINARY OFFENSES

After the Incident Type, Definition, and Examples for each offense is found Level of the offense (1, 2, or 3) and the Description. The level of classification is governed by the severity of each act.

DIRECTORY OF INCIDENT TYPES & DEFINITIONS

The rules in the Code of Conduct are designed to notify students (grades K-12) as to the types of behaviors that are not acceptable. Nevertheless, every specific variation of the prohibited code of conduct may not have been included. Consequently, students should expect to be disciplined for misconduct that is obviously inappropriate. A specific violation need not be written for every conceivable variation of behavior that directly affects the orderly mission of the school. Note: These are not in alphabetical order, but in order of their incident code number.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN
THE BULLOCH COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT, BULLOCH
COUNTY, AND THE BULLOCH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE**

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2023, by and between **BULLOCH COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, acting by and through its duly elected Board of Commissioners** (hereinafter "the County") and **NOEL BROWN in his official capacity as Sheriff of Bulloch County, Georgia**, (hereinafter "the Sheriff") as party or parties of the first part, and **BULLOCH COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT, acting by and through its duly elected Board of Education** (hereinafter the "School District") as party or parties of the second part.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section III, Paragraph I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia provides, in pertinent part, that a county, school district, or other political subdivision of the State of Georgia, may contract with one another for the provision of services, and for the use of facilities which the county, school district, or other political subdivision is authorized by law to provide; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff, through the Sheriff's Office and in coordination with the School District, has instituted and established a School Resource Officer Program ("the SRO Program") that provides for the placement of Sheriff's Office certified law enforcement officers ("SROs") within the School District; and

WHEREAS, the School District agrees to implement the SRO Program in certain School District schools; and

WHEREAS, the County, the Sheriff, and the School District desire to establish the guidelines of the SRO Program and have a mutual understanding of the particular roles of each entity in relation to the SRO Program.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of good and valuable consideration described herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1- PURPOSE

The School District, the Sheriff, and the County agree that the purpose of the SRO Program is to provide resources and support for School District students, teachers, and staff in law enforcement related matters. These resources and support include: providing classroom

instruction on law enforcement related matters, D.A.R.E., and G.R.E.A.T.; allowing students to build positive relationships with law enforcement officers, in the form of SROs, in a non-confrontational setting; protecting persons and property on School District grounds; attending extracurricular activities after the regular school day both at the school and at out of town events; gathering information concerning criminal activity involving School District students on or off of School District grounds; investigating crimes that occur on School District grounds; and generally enforcing the laws of the State of Georgia on and around School District grounds. For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "Regular Academic Session" shall mean each period beginning on the first day class is in regular session at any school at the beginning of the school calendar, excluding pre-planning, and ending on the last day that class is in regular session at the end of the school calendar, each such period being comprised of 180 School District business days.

ARTICLE 2- POLICY

It is the policy of the Sheriff's Office to maintain a minimum of seven (7) SROs for the School District.

ARTICLE 3- CHAIN OF COMMAND

The SRO Program is part of the Sheriff's Office, and all SROs shall follow the chain of command of the Sheriff's Office. The commander of the Sheriff's Office Community Relations Division shall serve as the SRO Program Coordinator for the Sheriff's Office and will act as the day to day immediate supervisor of the SRO Program for the Sheriff's Office.

Each SRO shall coordinate activities with the School's administration. All School related activity must be coordinated by each SRO with the principal's office. When an SRO perceives that law enforcement action is required at a School, he/she shall take such action and then notify the principal of the actions taken as soon as reasonably possible thereafter.

The SROs are first and foremost law enforcement officers and employees of the Sheriff's Office and, while performing duties as SROs, will remain employees of the Sheriff's Office with all rights, benefits, and privileges attaching thereto. At any time during which the School District is not in Regular Academic Session, each SRO will report to the Sheriff's Office and perform duties as assigned by and through the Patrol Division chain of command and receive law enforcement and SRO training. The commander of the Sheriff's Office Community Relation Division will coordinate these activities with the commander of the Sheriff's Office Patrol Division. Upon request by the School District, scheduling and time permitting, the SRO shall be available for additional School District related duties at extracurricular activities as designated by school officials during the period when the School District is not in Regular Academic Session, including sporting events and school registration. Compensation for such extra services will be paid by the School District to the County as outlined below.

ARTICLE 4- SELECTION OF PERSONNEL AND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

The Sheriff, based upon criteria to be mutually established by the Sheriff's Office and the School District, shall appoint SROs. Appropriate School District personnel may participate in any interviews of prospective SRO candidates.

SROs will be sworn and certified law enforcement officers and will possess, at a minimum, these qualifications:

- Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Certification
- Must be able to obtain certification as a D.A.R.E. and G.R.E.A.T. instructor within one calendar year of assignment
- Demonstrated ability to work well with young people and educators
- Demonstrated maturity and no history of conduct unbecoming a deputy
- Skills in interpersonal relationships
- Skills in de-escalation of conflict and in conflict resolution
- Must adhere to the Sheriff's Office principle that a balanced approach be taken between law enforcement activity and maintaining healthy community relations with citizens

ARTICLE 5- DISMISSAL OF SROs

In the event that a principal of a school to which an SRO is assigned believes that the assigned SRO is not effectively performing his/her duties and responsibilities, the superintendent of schools shall notify the SRO Program Coordinator. Within a reasonable amount of time after receiving such notification from the superintendent, the SRO Program Coordinator shall advise the Sheriff of the superintendent's concerns. If the Sheriff so desires, the superintendent and the Sheriff, or their designees, may meet with the SRO to mediate or resolve any problems they may determine exist. Additionally, the SRO assigned to the School may immediately be re-assigned to another post by the Sheriff.

ARTICLE 6- SRO DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Each SRO shall have the following duties and responsibilities, in addition to those described elsewhere in this Agreement:

- Provide School District students, faculty, staff, and visitors with the opportunity to meet and interact with a law enforcement officer in a non-confrontational setting
- Act as a deterrent to crime in School buildings, on School grounds, and in communities surrounding Schools, not only through their uniformed presence, but also by developing positive relationships with School District students, faculty, and staff, and the communities surrounding the Schools

- Provide classroom instruction and act as a resource for information for School District students, faculty, and staff concerning law enforcement topics
- Provide for the safety and security of School District students, faculty, staff, and visitors, including sporting events and extracurricular activities
- Make himself/herself available, as time permits, for conferencing with students, parents, and faculty members in order to assist them with issues of a law enforcement and crime prevention nature
- Respond to emergency situations that arise on School District grounds and take whatever appropriate law enforcement action is reasonable to resolve such situations
- Assist the Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigations Division and the Statesboro-Bulloch Crime Suppression Team in the investigation of any crimes which occur on School District grounds; the SRO will contact additional law enforcement personnel to assist him/her as determined to be needed by the SRO
- Enforce the law of the State of Georgia
- Communicate with School administrators about law enforcement concerns on School District grounds
- Be present on School grounds during the hours of 7:30am to 3:30pm during the Regular Academic Session when classes are in session
- As needed, conduct formal interviews of School District students in accordance with Sheriff's Office and School District policies
- Assist all local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies conducting interviews, arrests, or other actions related to the School District in accordance with Sheriff's Office policies
- Maintain a "zero tolerance" policy on all criminal gang activities, illegal drug activities, and weapons on School District grounds; criminal charges will be filed by the SRO regarding such activities as appropriate and case files sent to the courts of proper jurisdiction
- It is acknowledged that a SRO may be called on as a witness or to participate in the School District's disciplinary or truancy processes; however, the disciplining of students for violations of School District policies is solely the responsibility of the School District; a School principal may contact the SRO if he/she believes that an incident involves a violation of Georgia law, after which the SRO shall determine whether a law enforcement response is appropriate; SROs are not to be utilized by the School District for enforcing School District policies or monitoring the duties of School District employees; violations of School District policies observed by the SRO shall be brought to the attention of the appropriate School District administrator
- Attend pre-planning meetings with administration and instruction staff of the SRO's assigned Schools for a complete orientation of the SRO Program as needed or when requested

ARTICLE 7- SCHOOL DISTRICT DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The School District shall provide to each SRO the following materials, training, and facilities, which are deemed essential to the performance of the SRO's duties:

- A reasonable work space at the School
- A copy of relevant School District policies and procedures
- School operations training

ARTICLE 8- SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND COUNTY'S DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide the SRO with the usual and customary office supplies and forms required for the performance of the SRO's duties
- Provide uniforms and equipment required of law enforcement personnel
- Provide a vehicle, fuel, and maintenance
- Provide law enforcement and SRO training
- Provide Liability and Workers' Compensation Insurance coverage for the SROs

ARTICLE 9- REVIEW OF SRO PROGRAM

SRO evaluations will occur in June of each year. A SRO Program Committee will perform all evaluations. The SRO Program Committee will consist of the School District Superintendent or his designee, the SRO Program Coordinator, and the principal of Schools with assigned SROs. Each SRO will be provided with a written evaluation no later than June 30 of each year.

ARTICLE 10- ASSIGNMENT OF PERSONNEL

SROs will be assigned to schools in unincorporated Bulloch County by the Sheriff. The Sheriff will provide advice to the School Superintendent in the form of crime statistics and call volumes pertaining to the schools under consideration. Conflicts over the assignment of SROs will be resolved by the Sheriff with advice provided by the School Superintendent. The addition of SROs to schools located in incorporated municipalities may only be made after further agreements regarding joint funding and supervision of these SROs by the municipality, Sheriff, the County, and the School District.

The School District agrees to allow SROs to leave their assigned schools during the Regular Academic Session to instruct D.A.R.E. at designated elementary schools and/or G.R.E.A.T. at designated middle schools nearby their assigned school.

ARTICLE 11- COMPENSATION

For purposes of this Agreement, the term "Regular Duty Period" means the eight-hour period from 7:30 am until 3:30 pm each day that school is in session during the Regular Academic Session, and the term "Extracurricular Period" means time that an SRO performs work outside of a Regular Duty Period at the request of a school administrator. SROs shall be employed by the Sheriff and paid through the County's payroll system at all times they are performing work during a Regular Duty Period or an Extracurricular Period and will be covered by the County's liability and workers' compensation insurance. –

For work performed by SROs during Regular Duty Periods, the School District will pay the County during the initial term for each SRO assigned to this Agreement in the amount of fifty-two thousand, four-hundred fifty dollars and ninety-five cents (\$52,450.33). After the initial term, this amount shall be increased by three percent (3%) on July 1st each year that this Agreement remains in effect. The County Finance Department will send monthly invoices to the School District for work performed by SROs during Regular Duty Periods.

For work performed by SROs during an Extracurricular Period, the School District will pay the County at the hourly rate of \$36.00 for each hour worked. The Sheriff's SRO Coordinator will send monthly invoices to the School District for work performed by SROs during Extracurricular Periods.

The School District will make payment for all invoices to the County within thirty (30) days of receipt. In the event that payments to the County by the School District become more than thirty (30) days past due, the County and/or the Sheriff may thereafter immediately terminate this Agreement by providing written notice of such termination, and the reason therefor, to the School District.

The School District shall have no obligation to pay the County for SROs utilized by the Sheriff's Office for work outside of Regular Duty Periods or Extracurricular Periods.

ARTICLE 12- TERM

This initial term of this Agreement commences on July 1, 2023 and shall end on June 30, 2024. Thereafter, this Agreement will automatically renew for successive one-year terms commencing on July 1 and ending on June 30 each year, unless any party provides a notice of non-renewal to the other parties at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the then-current term.

ARTICLE 13- INDEMNIFICATION

Each party does hereby agree, to the extent, if any, allowed by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the other parties, their officers, agents, servants, and employees from any and all injuries, claims, actions, lawsuits, damages, judgments, or liabilities of any kind whatsoever arising out of the performance of this Agreement, except as would relate to any injury, claim,

action, lawsuit, damage, judgment, or liability caused by or contributed to by the negligence or reckless or intentional act of the complaining party, its officers, agents, servants, or employees to the extent of such negligence or reckless or intentional act.

ARTICLE 14- ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER

The rights, privileges, and obligations under this Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred by any party; provided, however, that this Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors of the parties hereto.

ARTICLE 15- NOTICES

Any notices required or permitted pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and may be effected by U.S. mail or by facsimile. Mailed notices shall be deemed to have been received on the date of acknowledgment on any return receipt or three days after deposit in the U.S. mail with proper postage affixed, whichever date is earlier. Notices by facsimile shall be deemed to have been received on the date on the sending party's facsimile confirmation sheet.

ARTICLE 16- GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT

The brief capitalized and underlined headings or titles preceding each paragraph are for purposes of identification, convenience, and ease of reference, and shall be disregarded in the construction of this Agreement.

No failure of any party hereto to exercise any right or power granted under this Agreement, or to insist upon strict compliance by another party with this Agreement, and no custom or practice of any party at variance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, shall constitute a waiver of any such party's right to demand exact and strict compliance by the other parties hereto with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

This Agreement shall be governed by, construed under, performed and enforced in accordance with the laws of Georgia.

Should any provision of this Agreement require judicial interpretation, it is agreed and stipulated by and among the parties that the court interpreting or construing the same shall not apply a presumption that the terms, conditions, and provisions hereof shall be more strictly construed against one party by reason of the rule of construction that an instrument is to be construed more strictly against the party who prepared the same.

This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which is deemed an original of equal dignity with the others and which is deemed one and the same instrument as the others.

ARTICLE 17- ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall constitute the entire Agreement between the parties and no modification thereof shall be binding unless evidenced by a subsequent signed written agreement. This Agreement supercedes any prior agreements between the parties, either written or oral.

ARTICLE 18- SEVERABILITY OF TERMS

In the event that any part or provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

ARTICLE 19 – IMMUNITY

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any immunity to which the parties, their officials, or employees are legally entitled.

The Department of Information Systems recommends approval to continue our existing 3-year contract with CDW-G for Microsoft licensing under the State of Georgia Software Contract 99999-SPD-SPD0000060-0004. This contract expires June 30, 2025.

Pricing is based on the number of "Knowledge Worker" employees. Due to the number of additional employees, we now find our pricing has increased above the \$100,000 board approval threshold.

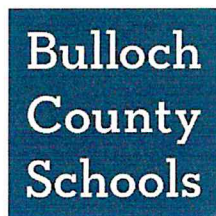
