

## First Aid Training

During the school day and during school sponsored events, including those off-site at least one staff person shall be on duty who has a current certification from a nationally recognized course in standard first aid and CPR. A list of such staff members shall be maintained in each school health office.

Athletic coaches, as that term is defined by applicable rules of the Colorado State Board of Education, shall be certified in CPR and the use of automated external defibrillators (AEDs).

*NOTE: State law requires "athletic coaches" employed by school districts to be certified in CPR and the use of AED's. C.R.S. 22-1-125.5(2). Applicable rules of the State Board of Education define "coach" as "head and assistant coaches of all athletic programs recognized by the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA)." 1 CCR 301-96, Rule 2.00(6). Accordingly, this requirement applies only to those head and assistant coaches employed by the district and coaching an "athletic program" recognized by CHSAA.*
