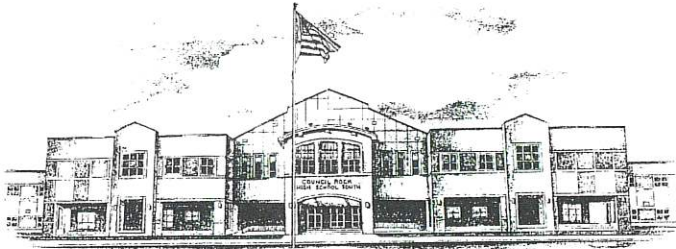

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Dear Parents and Students,

The counseling department recognizes that students and their parents often have questions about course selection. Two questions that seem to be most common are:

1. Which classes are needed to fulfill graduation requirements?
2. Which courses will be most helpful in planning for post-secondary goals?

To address these questions, the counseling department has developed a planning guide in order to assist students in selecting secondary course offerings. The planning guide allows students to consider their options as they schedule electives around courses needed to fulfill graduation requirements. The guide may be used to plan a strategy for achieving academic goals by considering courses and their sequences. It is also useful as a progress chart to record courses that have been successfully completed as students advance through high school. It is recommended that students consistently re-evaluate their academic goals in light of increasing exposure to new ideas and experiences and make adjustments to their plan as often as needed to fulfill their aspirations.

Enclosed is a four-year planning guide that is to be used as a worksheet to develop an overview of courses that will allow the student to achieve his/her academic goals. In completing this chart, please consider necessary prerequisites and recommended course sequences.

Along with the four-year planning guide, the counseling department has included charts that outline core courses and four broad career pathway options: Arts and Humanities; Engineering and Industrial; Business and Information Sciences; and Health and Human Services. The chart outlining core courses breaks down the required graduation credits, indicating total credits needed in each core subject area. The career charts list elective courses currently offered that support specific career pathways. Using the combination of core and elective courses will allow the student to build an academic program which reflects required courses and elective courses in order to fulfill career objectives. In addition, the career charts include the vocational-technical programs offered through the Middle Bucks Institute of Technology which provide training in specific career fields. These programs are available to students in grades 10-12.

Although students may freely choose any electives beyond their graduation requirements, they are encouraged to consider courses that meet their academic and career goals while aligning their training and academic preparedness to specific career pathways. The career charts are provided only as tools to assist the student and their parent(s) as courses are chosen. Final course selection should keep in mind the student's overall interests and abilities, along with his/her desire to explore options in various subject areas.
