Supporting LEAs in meeting the requirements of AB1767

WHAT IS AB1767?

AB1767 requires the governing board or body of a LEA that serves pupils in grades kindergarten through sixth to adopt and update as prescribed a policy on pupil suicide prevention that specifically addresses the needs of high-priority groups before the beginning of the 2020-21 school year.

The policy must:

- be age appropriate, delivered, and discussed in manner that is sensitive to the needs of young pupils
- be developed in consultation with school and community stakeholders, school-employed mental health professionals and suicide prevention experts
- be written to ensure proper coordination and consultation with the county mental health plan for a referral for mental health or related services made on behalf of a pupil who is a Medi-Cal beneficiary
- specifically address the needs of high priority youth groups
- address any training on suicide awareness and prevention to be provided to teachers of pupils in all of the grades served by the LEA
- be updated every five years

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

In response to AB1767, the San Diego County Office of Education's Student Wellness & School Culture Department created this easy-to-use guide to support elementary LEAs in meeting the legislative requirements of this law. This guide contains a list of vetted, age-appropriate trainings and curriculum that address suicide awareness and prevention at the elementary school level. The resources included below should not be seen as an exhaustive list of considerations as suicide awareness and prevention work in elementary schools is continuously emerging.
