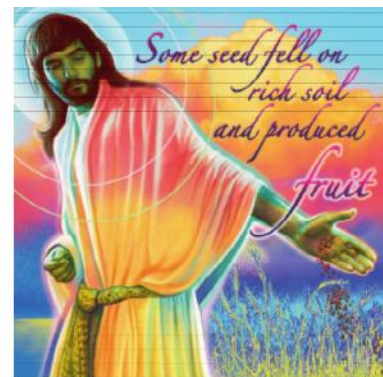

The Sacraments: God’s Presence at Key Moments of Life

I have always thought that a helpful lens through which to appreciate the sacraments of the Church is to view them in light of God’s strong desire to be present to his people throughout life and in a special manner at significant moments of life.

When we begin our life’s journey as Christians, for instance, God wishes to be present to us in the saving and sanctifying waters of baptism.

When we desire to renew our friendship with God after falling into sin, he is present to us as in the compassionate and healing forgiveness of the sacrament of Reconciliation.

When we are prepared to stand up in defense of our faith, God is present to us as our bulwark and strength at the sacrament of Confirmation.

Throughout life’s journey, God nourishes us frequently on the “food of angels” and is intimately present to our hearts and lives through the sacrament of the Eucharist.

When we bind ourselves in a loving and faithful union with our “other self,” God blesses that union of hearts and lives in the sacrament of Marriage.

When we discern a vocation to the priesthood, God configures us in a special manner to the priesthood of his Son in the sacrament of Holy Orders.

The Sacraments *from page 1*

And when we are old or frail, ill or facing surgery, God desires very much to comfort and strengthen us in the Sacrament of the Sick. And when our frailty or illness prepares us for life's final passage, God desires to accompany us in the most tender and loving manner in this same sacrament.

I would like to say a bit more on the Sacrament of the Sick because I believe that there is much confusion surrounding this sacrament and when to receive it.

I am old enough to remember when this sacrament was called Extreme Unction. The common belief at that time was that this sacrament was only for those who were at death's door. In its revision of the Sacraments following the Second Vatican Council, the Church wanted to make it very clear that this sacrament is also for the elderly, the seriously ill, and for those facing surgery. Its name makes its purpose very clear: it is now called the Sacrament of the Sick or the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

In administering this sacrament, we read these words from the Letter of James "Is there anyone who is sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church. They will pray over the sick person and anoint that person with oil in the name of the Lord." James continues, "If that person has committed any sins, those sins will be forgiven" (James 5: 14-16).

So, who should receive this sacrament? The seriously ill, the elderly, the frail and those facing surgery—as well as those who are near death.

When should this sacrament be received? This sacrament is meant to be celebrated as often as warranted. Therefore, receive this sacrament whenever you become seriously ill, are significantly diminished by age or frailty, are preparing for surgery or dying. Please do not wait to receive this sacrament of bodily and spiritual healing only when death is imminent. God wants to be present to his beloved people at every key moment of their lives and that means not only when death is near but also whenever conditions mentioned earlier are present.

Let God draw near and be present to you. He desires that, so much does he love you. Welcome him throughout life, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, when young, middle aged and old—always!

CAREGIVER INFORMATION

As a caregiver, you can help loved ones with home repairs by accessing the Home Repair for the Elderly Program. This program is designed to provide minor home repairs and/or accessibility modifications to eligible low- and moderate-income older adult homeowners and individuals with disabilities for homes in which they are currently residing. Fairfax County will provide a crew to do up to one week's worth of labor and provide

up to \$1,000 in materials to complete necessary repairs and maintenance. All materials and labor for the work done under this program are provided completely free of charge to eligible homeowners. To learn more, go to bit.ly/FFXhomerepair.

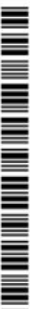

Adult Protective Services receives and investigates reports of abuse, neglect, and exploitation of adults 60 years of age or older and incapacitated adults aged 19 or older. If protective services are needed and accepted by the individual, local APS workers may arrange for a wide variety of services to stop the mistreatment or prevent further mistreatment. If you suspect foul play, follow that old adage: "If you see something, say something."
