## ENGINE for Economic Growth

**15,808**

adult students improved their job prospects by enrolling in BOCES workforce development courses.

On average,  
**41%**

of CTE graduates entered the workforce directly after graduation.

**1,328**

students worked side-by-side with industry professionals in honors-level career courses through BOCES New Visions programs.

new CTE programs have been developed over the past three years through partnerships with local businesses.
