


Passport to Careers for Foster Youth


Opportunity Grant

Apply early to maximize aid opportunities




#### How do I know which to apply for?

WASFA (Washington Application for State

Financial Aid) - State Financial Aid for Undocumented Individuals and Select Non-Citizens - Washington State offers financial aid programs to students who aren't eligible for federal financial aid because of immigration status. These students still need to meet other program requirements. To find out if you qualify, complete the free WASFA to apply for state financial aid.

## Apply for a FSA ID - studentaid.gov/fsa-id

An FSA ID is a username and password that gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature.



### SIMPLE STEPS TO TRANSFER TAX INFORMATION INTO YOUR FAFSA° FORM

The IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT) Electronically Transfers Your Federal Tax Return Information Into Your FAFSA\* Form

**EASY** Transfer info with the click of a button.

**FAST** Instantly retrieve your information.

**ACCURATE** Correctly fill in your information.

HOW





Log in to your current FAFSA' form or start a new application at fafsa.gov. Click the "Link to IRS" button and log in with your FSA ID to be transferred to the IRS to retrieve your info.

Check the "Transfer My Tax Information into the FAFSA' form" box, and click the "Transfer Now" button.\*

In the finances section of the online form, you will see a "Link to IRS" button if you are eligible to use the IRS DRT.

Once at the IRS site, enter your information exactly as it appears on your federal income tax return and click the "Submit" button.

You will know that your federal tax return information has been successfully transferred because the words "Transferred from the IRS" will display in place of the IRS information in your FAFSA form. SUBMIT YOUR FAFSA FORM

(Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

\*For your protection, your tax information will not be displayed on either the IRS site or fafsa.gov.

The IRS DRT can be used by both students and parents.

Students:

Apply for college admission.

Apply for financial aid via the FAFSA or WASFA.

Respond to requests from WSAC and campuses.

WSAC or US Department of Education:

Maintains FAFSA (Federal). Maintains the WASFA online (WSAC/State).

Passes applications on to institutions (colleges).


Colleges:

Notify you of eligibility for state or other aid.

Answer your questions about your financial aid.

Continues to provide support throughout college.

### How do I find the right college or career school for me?

### **Types of Schools**

There is a wide array of schools available for higher education. Options include two- and four-year colleges and universities, vocational, trade, and career schools, online schools, and graduate schools. Different schools serve different purposes. Make sure you choose the type of school that helps you achieve your goals.

#### Accreditation

An accredited school meets certain standards set by an independent agency. It helps ensure the training or
education you get meets employer standards in a specific field. If you attend a school that isn't accredited, you might
not be able to get any financial aid.

## **College Bound Scholarship**





Early **commitment** of state financial aid to eligible 7<sup>th</sup> **and** 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who apply by June 30<sup>th</sup> of 8<sup>th</sup> grade.



**Combines** with other state financial aid to cover the average cost of tuition (at comparable public college rates), some fees, and a small book allowance = **commitment**.



Can be used at over **60** two- and four-year public and private colleges and universities.
