- Student voice, staff voice- a few things that students and staff want to see moving forward-extended FAT double block maybe a little too long can we make a 60 minute block that would be an ideal time period homework less HW is helpful for students to have a life outside of school trying to extend the block so that students have an opportunity to begin HW UA blocks and seminar we still want to provide some student choice (seminar) but we need to figure out how many options and how often we need to have this. Popular with students and good results with our intervention. We are working with a scheduling committee.
- Staffing-posted reading interventionist and for a world studies teacher-agreed upon by students, staff, and admin that this should be a part of the core.
- Looking at vertical alignment for UAs-connecting to the HS-specifically with world languages. POR - There are no more students that go to Spanish/Latin than Mandarin/French. We need to have purpose with what we are doing with world language.
- Q: Looking at longer blocks, would that mean you need to get rid of some programming? A: if we go too long a block-yes. You can reduce seminar but you can mesh some things together that would extend time in your core academics.
- Consider the students who are tied into Reading support and other academic support
- Idea: A play reading. Baking and cooking with math.
- Q: are unified arts that are not offered this year will be back in place. A: Yes-example art and stem. Looking at having band and chorus during or outside of the school day.
- Every year we look at if there is a better way to do that. We have been very successful with tier 2, but need to increase tier 1. Trying to bookend the days, so that students don't feel like they are solely doing academics at school. Robust club offerings.
- Sports/Clubs/Truro-hoping after break we are not in the red zone. Proceeding cautiously and prudently while we can. Sports 4/26. This is a new level of intermingling. This is something that students are doing. We can make sure students are doing this in safe ways. Q: Can 5th graders participate? A: Yes.

- Clubs-asked staff to get back to Adam if they are interested in clubs. Has a few clubs (3-4). Hope to get more staff interested. Encourage the students to reach out if they have an idea. Looking at before and after school as well as remote and in person offerings.
- Truro-5th grade students get the opportunity to go to Truro each year. Usually a week long trip. This year=field trip design. Each class will go for a day. Looking at having kids who didn't go last year.
- End of the year celebrations-Evening of excellence don't see people coming into the building this year. Please check it out to see what awards we do have. Is this a 7th grade graduation? No-but it is 7th grade heavy. Growth component is huge. Q: Is there a distance learning component. A: This will be included.
- Field Day: Every year we have an outdoor celebration. Any ideas-need to socially distance and adhere to protocols, but we also need to to cut loose and have fun.
- Teacher appreciation week-Admin will do one but we were talking about what kids may be able to do to celebrate. Jenna-Ice cream truck? Candy?
- Joy-we don't have a formal PTA
- Students council is working on planting on flowers and will be giving them to staff members. This is for everyone in our building.

Budget:

- We have had a hand me down van our shells program uses this on a daily basis when they are up and running-work on life skills and being out in the community-also used for club offerings in the past. Hoping to get a new one so we can continue to foster connections with community at larget.
- We are an older middle school so we have been looking at some upgrades-camera system-need to make sure we have recordings available
- Purchase of a world studies curriculum. Looking at the world studies program as a
 whole and need to look and see if we need to buy a curriculum. Looking at 6/7 or 5-7
 aligned.
- Had conversations with the HS in aligning what is going on curricular wise and make sure there is a common connection between grade levels
- Looking at the possibility of pre algebra at the middle school. This was at the school 2 years ago when we looked at it, we noticed that there was inequity
- SC-also working on communication with the HS-Meets with Mr. Gill every two weeks
- There is not a ton of change curricular or infrastructure wise.
- In a good place with all the COVID upgrades

Status of staffing-

- THe model that is in place is predicated on the small class size-for example, next semester we have 10 homerooms. Carpenter wants to have 7. Up until now we have had 8. Not a major shift Adam doesn't see this as a huge shift because teachers teach more than one subject.
- Minus that one position we will be level funded
- Faced with a unique situation where there are currently 4 one year positions-we are missing some things that we pride ourselves on. Health, band, music, art
- Losing one position the new hires were hired under knowing this is a one year position
- These people can potentially be hired back in a different capacity
- 3 people would be on a team
- If everything is great in April can you pivot and add more art?
- The design is our design but we could add club offerings at the beginning and end of the day - we will continue to intramurals
- Will SS become a core? All indications are that. Adam shared a questionnaire about the schedule with staff.

School Improvement Plan

• Carpenter has asked that this is a one year plan so he can align this to the district plan

- Vertical alignment of curriculum and course offerings this has been a challenge in UA world. Example-Spanish fragmented from elementary to middle school to high school
- Regardless of what they take here, they start over at the high school. Then there is a
 fall out. Our current design is not a feeder program for that. We have resources and
 opportunities there.

COVID Update:

- Currently 2 cases Bourget/Cortese Kids out until 2/4. Some outliers related to hockey-some kids at a skills camp - creates a tricky situation. Teachers have done a great job connecting and helping students.
- Staff is getting a little excited about being on the verge of vaccine. Nurses have been doing a great job of keeping everyone informed.



2. Overview of School Council responsibilities

- What can we do and how can we work together?
- Hoping to get more parent involvement
- Need to figure out how often we want to have these meetings and the time of day that works for us
- Adam shares doc
- Up to us to define how to want to improve the school
- Unique situation this year
- Federal funding that has helped us serve the community in the way that we need it to be safe and ready for learning
- Challenge-how can we take what we typically have (we have great support from the community) and make sure we are using our funds to make sure they align with the educational and strategic plan
- MS-has a lot of opportunities in the past with many offerings and choice-this is hampered this year-this group can lead us through ideas
- Restrictions to this group so we know where our responsibilities are and where they are not.

3. District Strategic Plan

- A group came together in 2017 to build strategic plan and four objectives came out of this
- Ex. Social and emotional well-being we identified the need for our advisory class and this is something that we have spearheaded and put into place

- Ex. Surveys that we have students take and use the data to foster relationships with our students
- Actionable, fluid document not useful unless it is reflected upon often

4. School Improvement Plan

- Outside agency came in to analyze our school and find areas that you need to focus your attention
- The plan is aligned with this
- Identifies disparities of academic achievement gaps between our at risk and affluent students
- Three year plan will use this in 2021 to create new three year plan
- Joy-at the district level, they have already started working on getting groups together and starting on building the district level plan
- 5. Discussion: What change needs to take place in order to change (Living with COVID)
 - We are in the middle of a pandemic
 - We are taking a lot of precautions at the middle school level with design that values safety first
 - If things improve then we may move the design
 - Students have done a great job with little push back (accept)
 - Interesting to see that there is education happening and enjoyment
 - Sports piece is challenging-so many students' identities are tied to this. Same
 with robotics club-This program has been very successful-the question is what
 needs to change in order for us to change-think about the world around us.
 - Abby-need to make sure that the current model is working
 - Cheri-remain stable this idea that we are all in this together this is an
 experience that we will never see again in our lifetime and memorialize this
 experience together. We have lost a community builder of school being open all
 day
 - Sarah-we need to stay in the state right now-in ELA we are taking the accept, adapt, achieve and putting it into the community
 - Jenna-parent new to Monomoy was worried that it would be hard to build connections-kids are coming home excited
 - Doreen-very happy about the safety first and happy that in the two weeks of middle school. Daughter is still doing labs, and hands on stuff, but wants everything possible for her this year within the boundaries of safety. Wants to give encouragement to push a little bit. Hates the idea of her (daughter) having everything that she can possibly have.
 - Adam-this is where this group can be innovative-what adaptations can we put in place, so that we have something that is fun and engaging-maybe things that they typically wouldn't be doing.
 - How can we do this with our current model?

- Cheri-envisioned a boot camp fro transition for grade 4 to grade 5. Wants to build some sort of obstacle course. Tree climbing. Was listening to wilderness school-there is a staff member who runs a camp
- Jenna-In HP there are the four houses-could we do something where there are different competitions throughout the year-

- Joy-wondering if we have a feel for how the more at risk populations are doing through all of this
- Adam-doesn't have data but has last year's spring data-shows concern with students of color, lower SES, and students with special education needs
- Joy-proportions equal with in person and distance learners
- More students are in person
- Sarah-wondering about families switching back and forth
- Adam-not a lot you can do for students opting out of in person. 3 students who
 were in person who are going remote. 5 remote and wanting to come in person.
