#### **OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS**

Roll Call

The Board of School Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools met in regular session in the Lester L. Grile Administrative Center on Monday January 13, 2003, at 7:07 p.m. President Stephen Corona called the meeting to order with the following members in attendance:

Oath of Office

Attorney William Sweet administered the Oath of Office to new Board members, Robert A. Armstrong, Geoff Paddock, and Kurt A. Walborn, elected in November 2002.

Election of New Board Member President Stephen Corona asked for a motion to fill the 4<sup>th</sup> District seat vacated by the resignation of Marzine Moore. Carl A. Johnson's was the only application received by the Superintendent for the position in the 4<sup>th</sup> District. A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Kurt A. Walborn, that Carl A. Johnson be appointed to the 4<sup>th</sup> District Seat on the Board of School Trustees. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Oath of Office - New Board Member

Attorney William Sweet administered the Oath of Office to new Board member, Carl A. Johnson, who then joined the Board meeting.

Election of Officers

President Stephen Corona asked for nominations for the office of President of the Board of School Trustees for 2003. Carol J. Coen nominated Stephen Corona. Jon J. Olinger made a motion to close the nominations for President; this was seconded by Carl A. Johnson. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none. Stephen Corona was unanimously elected.

President Stephen Corona asked for nominations for the office of Vice President of the Board of School Trustees for 2003. Geoff Paddock nominated Carol J. Coen. Carl A. Johnson made a motion to close the nominations for Vice President; this was seconded by Jon J. Olinger. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none. Carol J. Coen was unanimously elected.

President Stephen Corona asked for nominations for the office of Secretary of the Board of School Trustees for 2003. Kurt A. Walborn nominated Geoff Paddock. Carol J. Coen made a motion to close the nominations for Secretary; this was seconded by Robert A. Armstrong. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none. Geoff Paddock was unanimously elected.

Dr. Thomas Fowler-Finn, superintendent, presented the following recommendation concerning the appointment of Treasurer and Deputy Treasurers for the calendar year 2003:

Appointment of Treasurer and Deputy Treasurer

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that Sherry L. Nidlinger be appointed as treasurer and Stefan W. Pittenger and Sandra M. Welborn as deputy treasurers for calendar year 2003, and that bonds for these positions be set as follows:

Treasurer \$200,000 Deputy Treasurers \$50,000

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The General Powers Act of 1965 as Amended (IC 20-5-3-1), provides for appointment of a treasurer and deputy treasurers at the same time that the new board organizes.

Having two deputy treasurers better ensures timely deposits, investments, and continuity in money management affairs. Ms. Nidlinger serves as the full-time treasurer for the corporation while Mr. Pittenger and Ms. Welborn serve the district as director of fiscal affairs and assistant supervisor of accounting, respectively.

IC 20-5-3-4 provides that the treasurer and deputy treasurers give a bond for the faithful performance of duty in an amount determined by the governing body. The cost of these bonds for 2003 will be \$1,150.

A motion was made by Carl A. Johnson, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the Appointment of Treasurer and Deputy Treasurers be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Approval of Minutes - December 9, 2002

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held December 9, 2002, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Snider Football Team

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board recognize the football team from Snider High School for finishing the season as state runner-up in Class 5A competition.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Snider's football team ended its outstanding season with 13-1 record, garnering the SAC, sectional, regional and semi-state championships. The team received many state awards at the end of the season, including the Class 5A Mental Attitude Award, which went to Marcus Heminger.

The team captains and coaches represented the team. The following were recognized:

Staff Spotlight -Kim Grant, school assistant, Irwin **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize Kim Grant, school assistant at Irwin Elementary School for her contributions to the children and families of Fort Wayne Community Schools.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: The Staff Spotlight program is the district's method of recognizing employees for outstanding work and commitment to excellence. Tonight we honor Kim Grant, school assistant at Irwin Elementary School, for her many contributions to the school's students, staff and parents. She recently helped Irwin obtain a donation to purchase listening centers for every classroom to support the balanced literacy program. She is a collaborator with all staff and sees her supporting role as vital to helping increase achievement for all students.

A video highlighting her accomplishments was shown.

This program addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy V, Ensuring Staff Effectiveness; and Strategy VIII, Communicating that FWCS is an Excellent School System.

North Side High School Presentation

Students at North Side High School have helped develop a web site for the public to view the progress of the school's renovation. Principal David Schnelker, business teacher Frank Sapper and several North Side students made a presentation about the project.

Vouchers

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the vouchers for the period ending December 11, 2002, December 31, 2002, and January 1, 2003, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the vouchers appearing in the listing numbered 02-23, 02-24 and 03-01 be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Bid Recommendation for Gasoline and Diesel Fuel, P/B #8200:

Bid Recommendation for Gasoline and Diesel Fuel, P/B #8200

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the award for gasoline and diesel fuel be made to:

Petroleum Traders of Fort Wayne. The prices will be based on the average OPIS (Oil Price Information Service) price for the Huntington Pad for a three-year contract.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: This bid is for diesel fuel and gasoline for FWCS buses and maintenance vehicles. The bid was performed under a cooperative purchasing agreement with the City of Fort Wayne. The Invitation to Bid offered each vendor the opportunity to bid (a) a firm price as well as (b) a mark-up or mark-down price based on OPIS with optional contract periods of one, two or three years.

Invitations to Bid were mailed to seven prospective bidders with two responding.

No firm price bids were received. The following bids were received based on OPIS pricing. Each bidder responded with the same adjustment factor for each year of the contract.

Based on the estimated gallonage and the OPIS pricing the day of the bid opening, the projected cost for the year is \$736,457.00. This represents an expected increase of approximately \$710.00 when compared to the last bid in December 2000.

A motion was made by Carl A. Johnson, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Bid Recommendation for Gasoline and Diesel Fuel, P/B #8200 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Money Market Mutual Fund Accounts Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Money Market Mutual Fund Accounts:

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board authorize the use of money market mutual fund accounts opened with eligible depositories.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Indiana Code 5-13-9-2.5 allows school corporations to invest in money market mutual funds through depositories designated by the state board of finance as public funds depositories.

The money market accounts may be used in addition to current investment vehicles, providing greater investment fle xibility and the potential of greater investment earnings.

The Board previously authorized the use of these accounts. According to I.C. 5-13-9-2.4, investment in these funds requires annual Board approval.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the Money Market Mutual Fund Accounts be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Application for Common School Fund Loan Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning Application for Common School Fund Loan:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of an advancement from the Indiana Common School Fund for educational technology equipment for 2003 in the amount of \$1.950.000.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: Advancements from the Common School Fund provide funds for school districts to purchase educational technology. The Fort Wayne Community Schools (FWCS) will use these moneys to help fund the FWCS technology plan previously submitted to the state. Technology funds are currently insufficient to fund all the technology needs of the school corporation.

Funds are provided as a loan and are awarded to school corporations on the basis of assessed value (AV) per pupil, with low AV per pupil school corporations receiving funds before high AV per pupil corporations. FWCS therefore cannot be assured of receiving the requested advancement.

Should the application be successful, funds will be budgeted in the Debt Service Fund to repay this loan beginning in the year 2004. Interest on the loan is expected to be no more than four percent and is likely to be as low as one percent.

Common School Fund advancements differ from School Technology Advancement Account (STAA) loans, which FWCS receives on an annual basis. Unlike CSF advancements, STAA advancements are given to all applying school corporations, regardless of their assessed value per pupil ranking.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Geoff Paddock, that the recommendation concerning the Application for Common School Fund Loan be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Purchase of Properties -North Side High School Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Purchase of Properties - North Side High School:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board authorize the purchase of the following properties located near North Side High School:

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The current school site is significantly below the state minimum acreage recommendation. The purchase prices are the average of two appraisals. Funds are within budget.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the Purchase of Properties - North Side High School be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Ratification of Contract with the Teamsters Local 414 Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Ratification of Contract with the Teamsters Local 414:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the master contract between Teamsters Local 414 and Fort Wayne Community Schools.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** This agreement calls for the Board to implement an hourly rate schedule and is in effect from February 27, 2003, to December 31, 2005. The hourly rates are as stipulated on the attached document.

Additional hourly premiums are earned by drivers who are trained in operating wheel chair lifts, and/or who are certified as driver trainers. Drivers will be paid for a minimum of five hours for driving their regular morning and afternoon routes, a minimum of one hour for driving supplemental routes, and a minimum of two hours for driving summer school routes. A detail of the hourly rates is found in Appendix B in the contract.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Jon J. Olinger, that the recommendation concerning the Ratification of Contract with the Teamsters Local 414 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Alice A. MacPherson Scholarship Gift:

Alice A. MacPherson Scholarship Gift **RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of a \$122,535.20 gift from the estate of Alice A. MacPherson. The gift will create a scholarship fund for the benefit of North Side students.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Mrs. MacPherson passed away on March 2, 2002 at the age of 88. She was a member of the North Side class of 1931. It was Mrs. MacPherson's preference that the gift be used to benefit students at North Side. The Fort Wayne Community Schools scholarship committee chaired by Judge William Lee will administer the scholarship. Students who receive these scholarships must be North Side High School seniors who plan to attend a four-year college or university. Applicants will be screened on the basis of financial need, scholarship, leadership and initiative displayed during their high school years. Applicants should rank in the upper half of their graduating class.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the Alice A. MacPherson Scholarship Gift be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Saint Joseph Hospital Community Health Foundation Grant for Asthma Treatment Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Saint Joseph Hospital Community Health Foundation Grant for Asthma Treatment:

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant of \$2,800.00 from the St. Joseph Community Health Foundation to purchase supplies for the care of students with asthma.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** The Saint Joseph Community Health Foundation is a public charity operated by a local Board of Trustees for the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ. Its mission is to support programs that will improve accessibility to health and wellness care for the poor and underserved populations in Allen County.

Over 2,200 FWCS students have been diagnosed with asthma. This is probably a conservative estimate since, on occasion, school personnel are only alerted to the fact that a student has asthma after an attack has occurred at school. It is the most common chronic disease that affects our students. Under the guidance of our school physician, school nurses will have nebulizers and medications available for use when students are experiencing significant respiratory difficulty.

This competitive grant submitted by Becky Talati, specialist of Health Services, addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy III, Safe and Caring Environment.

A motion was made by Carl A. Johnson, seconded by Carol J. Coen, that the recommendation concerning the Saint Joseph Hospital Community Health Foundation Grant for Asthma Treatment be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Clubhouse Grant:

Clubhouse Grant

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant for Summer Clubhouse from the Foellinger Foundation in the amount of \$5,522,533 over three years.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Foellinger Foundation provides financial support to the Fort Wayne community for the purpose of strengthening families, particularly those children and families with the greatest economic need and the least opportunity. To participate in their grant making process, Fort Wayne Community Schools has developed a four-week summer program for elementary students to build self-sufficiency in children and their families, to enhance existing cognitive and affective skills, and to provide meaningful summer vacation experiences for students of greatest need. Approximately 2400 children from all across the district will be able to attend the program offered at eight elementary schools. Four units are being developed under the theme "Falling in Love with Fort Wayne". During each week's unit, parents will be involved in activities and training, students will explore careers and engage in community service, extracurricular activities such as fine arts and sports will be available, and students will participate in extensive writing activities.

Foellinger has supported FWCS Summer Clubhouse in previous years and community response has been very favorable. Summer Clubhouse addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education and Strategy VI, Meaningful Relationships with Families. The overall program is coordinated by Curriculum Services.

A motion was made by Jon J. Olinger, seconded by Robert A. Armstrong, that the recommendation concerning the Clubhouse Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Property Tax Levy Shortfall Appeal:

Property Tax Levy Shortfall Appeal

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board approve a resolution to petition the Department of Local Government Finance to levy additional property tax levy of \$905,869 to recover a 2002 levy shortfall.

**RELATED INFORMATION:** Indiana Code 6-1.1-19-4.7 provides for an increase in the property tax levy whenever the assessed valuation figures that were provided to and used by the school corporation to determine the property tax rate did not accurately reflect appeals filed by property owners. The short fall was determined when only 98.6 percent of the December property tax settlement was received on December 30, 2002. The county auditor has stated that the shortfall resulted from delinquencies, property tax reduction appeals and corrections on reassessed properties, with the total amount of the shortfall for Fort Wayne Community Schools \$1,352,884 covering the seven tax-rated funds. We are only allowed to appeal the shortfall in the General Fund and Transportation Fund.

The appeal process requires the Board of School Trustees to approve a resolution for a shortfall appeal. The School Property Tax Control Board makes an initial recommendation to the Department of Local Government Finance on the appeal, which has ultimate authority to decide the appeal.

A motion was made by Carol J. Coen, seconded by Carl A. Johnson, that the recommendation concerning the Property Tax Levy Shortfall Appeal be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.
