Dr. Wendy Robinson, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

National Coloring/Art Contest Winner **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize a student at Fairfield Elementary School for winning a national coloring/art contest.

RELATED INFORMATION: The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children sponsored a national coloring/art contest as a celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month in October. More than 300 entries were submitted to the Washington D.C. based organization. In a tiered judging process, three winners were chosen, with Ma June, a Fairfield Elementary student, receiving first place. Ma received several prizes from the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, including having her artwork framed and matted, as well as letters of recognition from the Center and the City of Fort Wayne. Ma's artwork will appear on posters, postcards, bookmarks and other printed and electronic publications for the Center that will be distributed across the United States, Mexico and Puerto Rico in the organization's efforts to promote child safety education and prevention awareness.

RELATED INFORMATION: Cash deficits in funds of the corporation are not allowed at the end of the calendar year. Several funds have deficits due to shortfalls in the collection of property taxes from Allen County. State statute allows temporary transfers between funds if certain requirements are met. The treasurer will make all transfers necessary and report the loans to the Board.

Poseidon Maintenance Agreement

Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Poseidon Maintenance Agreement:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve a maintenance contract with Poseidon Technologies for the Poseidon system at the Helen P. Brown Natatorium at South Side High School in the amount of \$106,772 for a four-year period.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Poseidon system was first installed in December 2001 and serves as the lifeguard's "third eye" to help prevent drowning tragedies. The Helen P. Brown Natatorium installation was the first 50-meter pool in North America for Poseidon and they provided the maintenance service at no cost during our pilot site period. Several system upgrades took place during this period. The Poseidon system will continue to require maintenance support as provided in this agreement to continue a high level of operational safety. This agreement will cover maintenance for a period of four years and includes software updates, preventative maintenance, telephone help line, software maintenance, and on-site hardware maintenance with spare parts included.

RELATED INFORMATION: For the second straight year, Fort Wayne Community Schools is working with United Way of Allen County on the annual Day of Caring. The date of the event and which schools will be included are still being determined. Last year, 17 businesses and community organizations worked on 20 school buildings completing at least \$75,000 worth of work. In addition, they donated books, school supplies and uniforms to the schools, and several developed partnerships that continued the support beyond the initial Day of Caring.

The LCEF grant would be used to pay for paint, painting equipment, landscaping equipment, murals and team recognition/relationship building.

The grant supports District Goal 2: *Engage Parents and the Community* and District Goal 3: *Operate with fiscal responsibility, integrity and effectiveness*. The grant was submitted by Public Information Officer Krista Stockman.
