Approval of Minutes – January 26, 2009 A motion was made by Kevin Brown, seconded by Becky Hill, that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held January 26, 2009, be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Wendy Robinson, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

School Choice Fair Custodial Support **RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize the Northrop High School custodial and administrative staff for their outstanding work in support of this year's School Choice Fair.

RELATED INFORMATION: Each year Fort Wayne Community Schools holds its School Choice Fair, where parents and students get the opportunity to talk with representatives from all FWCS schools and departments in one convenient location at Northrop High School. This was the fifth year the event was held at Northrop. This year the Choice Fair was held for the first time on a Saturday instead of a Sunday, which meant there was less time for set up. In addition, the Choice Fair ended just two hours before a varsity basketball game, so clean up activities for the over 1,500 attendees had to be completed very quickly. The Northrop High School custodial staff worked very hard to ensure everything ran smoothly, working many hours of overtime. Their outstanding work was a key factor in making the Choice Fair successful.

2010 School Choice Fair Dr. Robinson announced that the School Choice Fair next year will be Saturday, January 30, 2010 at Northrop High School.

Vouchers

Dr. Robinson presented the vouchers for the period ending February 9, 2009, with the recommendation the vouchers be approved. A motion was made by Becky Hill, seconded by John Peirce, that the vouchers appearing in the listing dated February 9, 2009, be approved without exception. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Rain Garden Demonstration Sites Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Rain Garden Demonstration Sites:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve an agreement with the City of Fort Wayne to create rain gardens at school sites.

RELATED INFORMATION: The City of Fort Wayne wants to encourage property owners to install rain gardens as a means of reducing the amount of storm-water runoff flowing to storm sewers. Development of "demonstration" rain gardens can show how they can provide community and environmental benefits. FWCS would participate in the program beginning at three sites. Lakeside, Irwin, and Weisser Park Schools have been chosen to begin the program. The rain gardens are expected to be used as a lab for students and teachers to learn about storm-water release and how plantings can improve our environment.

The City provides the design, excavation, and plants. Their portion will be funded from a bond for sewer improvement. School volunteers will be installing and maintaining the provided plants.

Installation is scheduled for spring 2009 prior to school dismissal for the summer.

Lutheran Park Corp. Parking Lot Lease Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Lutheran Park Corp. Parking Lot Lease:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the lease of a parking lot adjacent to Fairfield School.

RELATED INFORMATION: Fairfield's current acreage is approximately half of the state recommended acreage. Lutheran Park Corporation has made the parking lot adjacent to Fairfield School available to lease for a charge of \$1.00 per year. This lot was formerly used by Lutheran Hospital. Use is restricted to a parking lot for teachers, parents, visitors and employees utilitizing the Fairfield School and for no other purpose except by written consent of the landlord. FWCS is responsible for maintaining the lot.

Internet Acceptable Use Policy Revision Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Internet Acceptable Use Policy Revision:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the changes to the Internet Acceptable Use Policy.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Technology and Curriculum departments have made revisions to the district's Internet Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) in preparation for New Tech students. New Tech students will be using email as a part of their instruction. Since this will be the first time students will use email services provided by FWCS, the AUP needed modified to specifically address:

- 1. <u>Section 5163.2; item 4</u> Users should not expect that files, emails, and other electronic communications stored on or sent to school-based computers and network servers will be private. Electronic communications and files stored on school-based computers and network servers may be treated like school lockers. Administrators and faculty may review files and communications to maintain system integrity and insure that users are acting responsibly.
- 2. <u>Section 5163.2; item 5; sub-item c</u> Additionally, the following specific uses of school-provided Internet or other electronic network access are not permitted: c. to engage in personal attacks, bullying, or harassment, including prejudicial or discriminatory attacks.
- 3. <u>Section 5163.2; item 5; sub-item e</u> Additionally, the following specific uses of school-provided Internet or other electronic network access are not permitted: e. to use for financial or commercial gain.

Additionally, since the Internet AUP was created and adopted in 1997, some of the language was outof-date and needed modernized as follows:

5163 Internet Access

Technology greatly increases our student's educational opportunities. Technology, especially the Internet, allows students to transcend the four walls of their classroom enabling them to experience places they may never have been able to visit otherwise. The Internet provides both students and staff access to information and opportunities that were previously difficult to obtain, untimely, or, in many cases, unavailable. Students can research and access information directly from universities and libraries from the convenience of their own classroom. At the same time, Internet access involves issues of security, privileges, and questions concerning the appropriateness of certain kinds of information. Moreover, in order for such access to be utilized appropriately, students and staff must be trained and be aware of the rights, privileges, and responsibilities connected with such access. Additionally, parents must be informed of their shared responsibility for their children's safe use of the Internet. Fort Wayne Community Schools is committed to providing Internet access to students and staff in an equitable, meaningful, and safe manner. The mission of Fort Wayne Community Schools is that we educate all students regardless of gender, race, religion, ethnic background, or economic status. Since access to information is a vital part of learning. Internet access will be made available to all students: however, this access will be a part of educational activities that promote and foster student learning. Unfortunately, public places like the Internet can be a dangerous place. The Internet can put students in contact with inappropriate and potentially harmful material and people. To help protect our students. Fort Wayne Community Schools employs Internet filter and security devices on all student Internet connections. Ultimately, however, staff are responsible for ensuring appropriate access and enforcing policies that are consistent with current state and district standards.

The superintendent is authorized to develop regulations, procedures, and guidelines governing acceptable use of the Internet. Those regulations, procedures, and guidelines should be consistent with applicable law and appropriately balance the needs and concerns of the school corporation, its staff, students, and parents.
