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RELATED INFORMATION: This bid is for a supply of copy paper to be placed in the warehouse. The largest portion of the bid is for 8800 cases of 8.5" x 11" white paper. All schools and central administrative units are served by this supply.

Utilizing our Internet bidding system, 108 prospective bidders were notified of the bid for Xerographic Paper. A list is on file in the purchasing department. Invitations to Bid were retrieved by fifteen bidders from the Internet. Six vendors responded with a bid.

The prices of the recommended bidder reflect a one percent decrease when compared to the last bid opened in May 2002.

Charter
School
Resolution

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Charter School Resolution:

RECOMMENDATION: The Board is offered the resolution for consideration.

RELATED INFORMATION: Mr. Paddock drafted a resolution that has now been reviewed by the superintendent and legal counsel. Board members have had an opportunity for input prior to the meeting, and the resulting resolution is now offered for consideration.

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF STATE LEGISLATION TO ADJUST FUNDING FOR CHARTER SCHOOLS IN INDIANA;

WHEREAS, it is estimated, the children of Fort Wayne Community Schools will lose the support of approximately \$500,000 in 2003 to one charter school operating in Allen County, according to the Indiana Department of Education, and

WHEREAS, under Indiana law, the dollars for students attending charter schools come from the budgets of public school corporations in which charter school students reside, and

WHEREAS, a portion of the charter school students previously attended private schools or were home schooled, and

WHEREAS, Fort Wayne Community Schools is also expecting a budget shortfall of about \$4 million in 2003 and an estimated \$13 million in 2004 mostly because of non instructional costs and reduced state aid, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools Corporation, and other school corporations across the state, have fixed operational costs that are adversely affected by dollars lost to charter schools, and cannot reduce personnel when only a few students at any grade level/location are affected, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools Board of Trustees, the superintendent and entire staff are working to limit the adverse affect of this budget crisis on the 32,000 students served within the school corporation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Fort Wayne Community Schools hereby appeals to the General Assembly of the State of Indiana to enact legislation this year to correct the inequities in the funding for public schools especially at a time of the impending state budget crisis, and

FURTHERMORE, we the undersigned Board of Trustees state that we do not oppose the funding of charter schools in the State of Indiana nor do we fear competition in the education arena as long as a mechanism is devised so that state dollars are not withheld from the education of children attending established public schools.

Club Grant

Dr. Fowler-Finn presented the following recommendation concerning the Technology Club Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of a grant from the AOL Time Warner Foundation in the amount of \$52,811 for Kekionga Middle School.

RELATED INFORMATION: The objective of this competitive grant is to provide additional language arts instruction to students whose learning modality can best be tapped through a creative environment. The after-school Technology Club will allow students to develop communication skills using technology over a longer period of time than they are currently capable of doing during the school day, fostering a pride in their efforts and realizing the results of "learning in action."

A vital component of this project is initial and ongoing assessment. Fort Wayne Community School's Strategic Plan stresses research, evaluation, communication, and technology toward a goal of higher student achievement. The Technology Club will help each student develop a personal plan through goal setting and enable the student to use technological tools to reach or surpass those goals.

The grant addresses Strategies I (Personally Appropriate Education) and IX (Technology) of the FWCS Strategic Plan (1996).
