# National Honor Roll for Noetic Learning Math Contest

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize an Irwin Elementary School student who achieved National Honor Roll status in the Noetic Learning Math Contest.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: The Noetic Learning Math Contest is an elementary math problem-solving contest held twice a year. The purpose of participating in the contest is to stimulate students' interest in math and to inspire them to excel in math. More than 20,000 students from 473 schools all over the United States took Noetic tests this fall. Irwin student Adam Moravec scored 80%, putting him in the top 10% of the more than 4,500 fourth-grade students taking the test.

## Future City Competition

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board recognize the students from Blackhawk Middle School and Jefferson Middle School for the awards they won at the regional Future City Competitions in January.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: The Future City Competition is an educational program for middle school students sponsored by the National Engineer's Association. It combines an engineering challenge with a hands-on application to present the team's vision of a future city. The 2016-17 theme, "The Power of Public Spaces" asked students to envision urban public spaces of tomorrow.

The Blackhawk Middle School 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> grade team: Rebati Lavil placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the state (regional) competition and received two awards: "Outstanding City Model" and "Outstanding Presentation." The 8<sup>th</sup> grade team: Guantanamo City placed 6<sup>th</sup> in the state and received the award for "Outstanding Artistic Vision."

This is Blackhawk's 16<sup>th</sup> year competing in the state competition. In the past eleven years, Blackhawk has won three first place awards and six second place awards.

Jefferson Middle School's eighth grade team Pukenui took third place in the state (regional) competition. The team also won a regional award for Outstanding City for Parks and Recreation. This is Jefferson's second year in the competition.

Resolution

Dr. Robinson presented the following resolution for the Board's consideration:

Fort Wayne Community Schools Resolution of the Board of School Trustees February 27, 2017

FWCS Shall Provide a Safe and Welcoming Learning Environment for All Students, Regardless of Immigration Status

WHEREAS, Fort Wayne Community Schools ("FWCS") is committed to providing a safe and welcoming learning environment where all students have the opportunity to succeed, secure in the knowledge that the District will support their well-being regardless of immigration status, national origin, race, or religion; and

WHEREAS, this Board recognizes the tremendous value and diversity that immigrant students and families bring to the District; and

WHEREAS, this Board approved the establishment of the Family and Community Engagement Center (FACE), which opened in July 2016, to provide critical support services through innovative solutions that address the health, wellness, and educational needs of all FWCS children, youth, and families, regardless of immigration status; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds that immigration-enforcement activities at our schools would significantly disrupt the learning environment and interfere with our students' rights to be free from unreasonable search and seizure and to access a free public education under the United States and Indiana Constitutions;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that to the extent permitted by law:

- FWCS shall provide a safe and welcoming learning environment for all students, regardless of their immigration status, that affords a learning environment free from the disruption of immigration enforcement;
- FWCS will refrain from inquiring about a student or parents' immigration status and will
  continue to follow the practice of not requiring social security numbers for any enrolled or
  enrolling student;
- FWCS employees, contractors, volunteers and representatives will not assist immigration enforcement efforts, by collecting or providing information regarding the immigration status of any student or their family.

# Comments, Discussion

Board Member Tom Smith indicated that he was in favor of the resolution but suggested that the Board hold off on approval in order to gather public input.

Board Member Glenna Jehl expressed a concern that FWCS continue to follow the law with regard to information provided to law enforcement.

Board President Julie Hollingsworth and Superintendent Robinson assured Board Members that FWCS would continue lawful practices. This resolution is a statement to reaffirm our policies and practices and the intent is to calm possible fears.
