**RELATED INFORMATION**: H&R Block clients in our area have donated to the H&R Block Education Fund administered by the Greater Kansas City Community Foundation. The foundation informs us this is a one-time unrestricted donation.

The employees at Grile Administrative Center, Maintenance and Operations, North and South Transportation, and Warehouse and Delivery donate \$1 each week throughout the year to participate in Casual Friday with the proceeds applied to the Book Bag Project. In September, the Casual Friday committee purchases school supplies, personal hygiene items, and books to fill 200 book bags for needy children. This donation will allow the committee to increase the number of children served.

Occupational Medical Services Contract Dr. Robinson presented the following recommendation concerning the Occupational Medical Services Contract:

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board approve Business Health Services as the occupational medical services provider for a three-year period effective April 1, 2004 through March 31, 2007. This contract may be extended by mutual agreement.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: Business Health Services (BHS), provided by RediMed, the BHS Clinic, and the Lutheran Health Network, has been the provider for Fort Wayne Community Schools' occupational medical services since 1997. These services include drug testing for new and current employees, Department of Transportation (DOT) physicals and continuing employee physicals.

Quotes were solicited from four (4) vendors, Business Health Services, Parkview Occupational Health Centers, U.S. HealthWorks and Outcome, LLC. Responses were received from all four with Outcome providing a quote for drug testing services only. Presentations were made by Business Health Services and Parkview Occupational Health Centers who provided the most competitive offers.

Based upon the 2003 utilization rate, the fees quoted by Business Health are 13% lower than those provided by the nearest competitor. In addition, the number and locations of facilities available throughout Fort Wayne will provide employees with the best accessibility. Besides these factors, Business Health has maintained a consistent level of quality service during the course of our professional relationship.

**RECOMMENDATION**: It is recommended that the Board approve the application for and acceptance of the About Us: Teacher Vision Grant from American Electric Power (AEP) for Northrop High School.

**RELATED INFORMATION**: The About Us: Teacher Vision grant from AEP provides funds to schools involved with astronomy and meteorology. Students will build a radio telescope to demonstrate that electromagnetic spectrum is utilized in wavelengths other than visible light. This program will track the "transit of Venus" on June 8, 2004, with this newly constructed 16 ft. dish, and view the sun, moon, and other bodies in space. It will be a collaborative project with former students, parents, members of the community, ITT, IIT, and members of the Fort Wayne Astronomical Society. By viewing the transit of Venus on June 8, and putting data on the Great Lakes Planetarium website, we will interface with other groups to help validate findings. Locally, through Fort Wayne Community Schools, this information will be disseminated to the entire education community of Allen County. Northrop has been invited to apply for this competitive grant which could total \$500.00.

Northrop science teacher, Betty Jo Harper, is responsible for this grant which addresses advancement intended and outlined in Strategy I, Personally Appropriate Education, and Strategy IX, Using Science to Transform Learning.
